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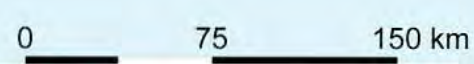
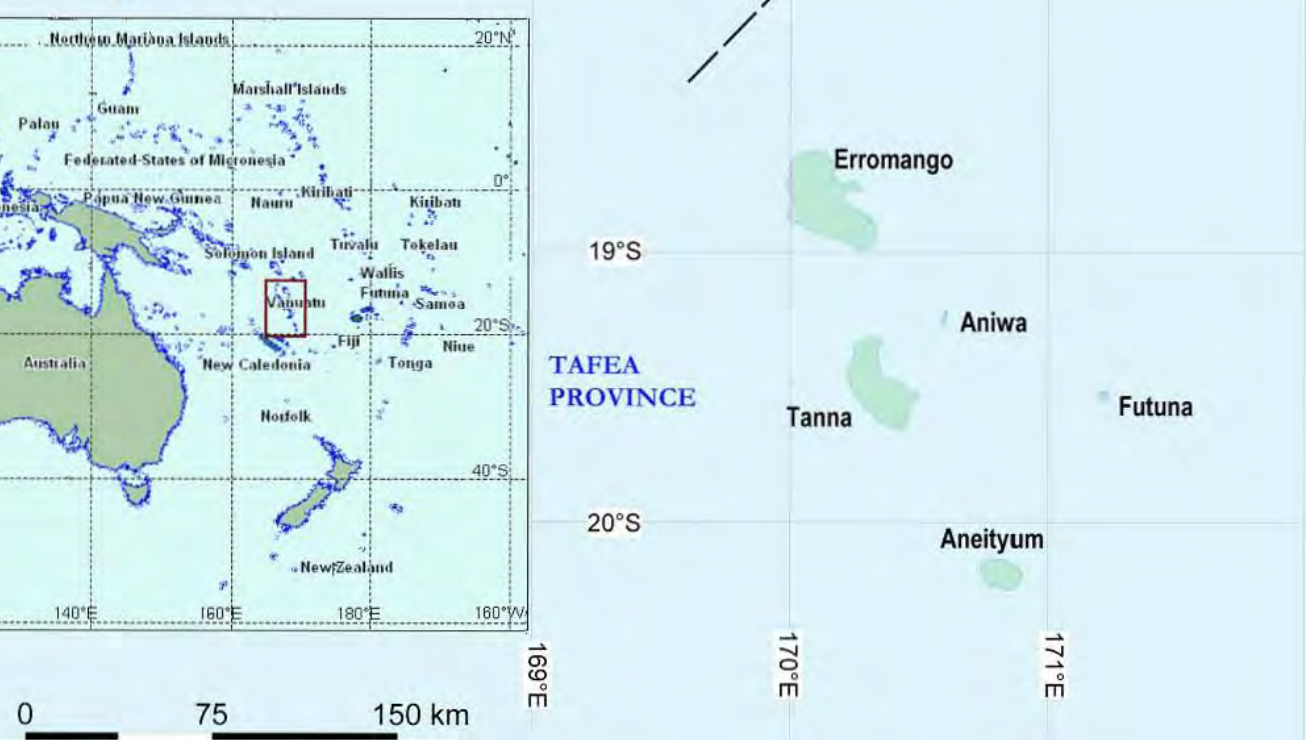
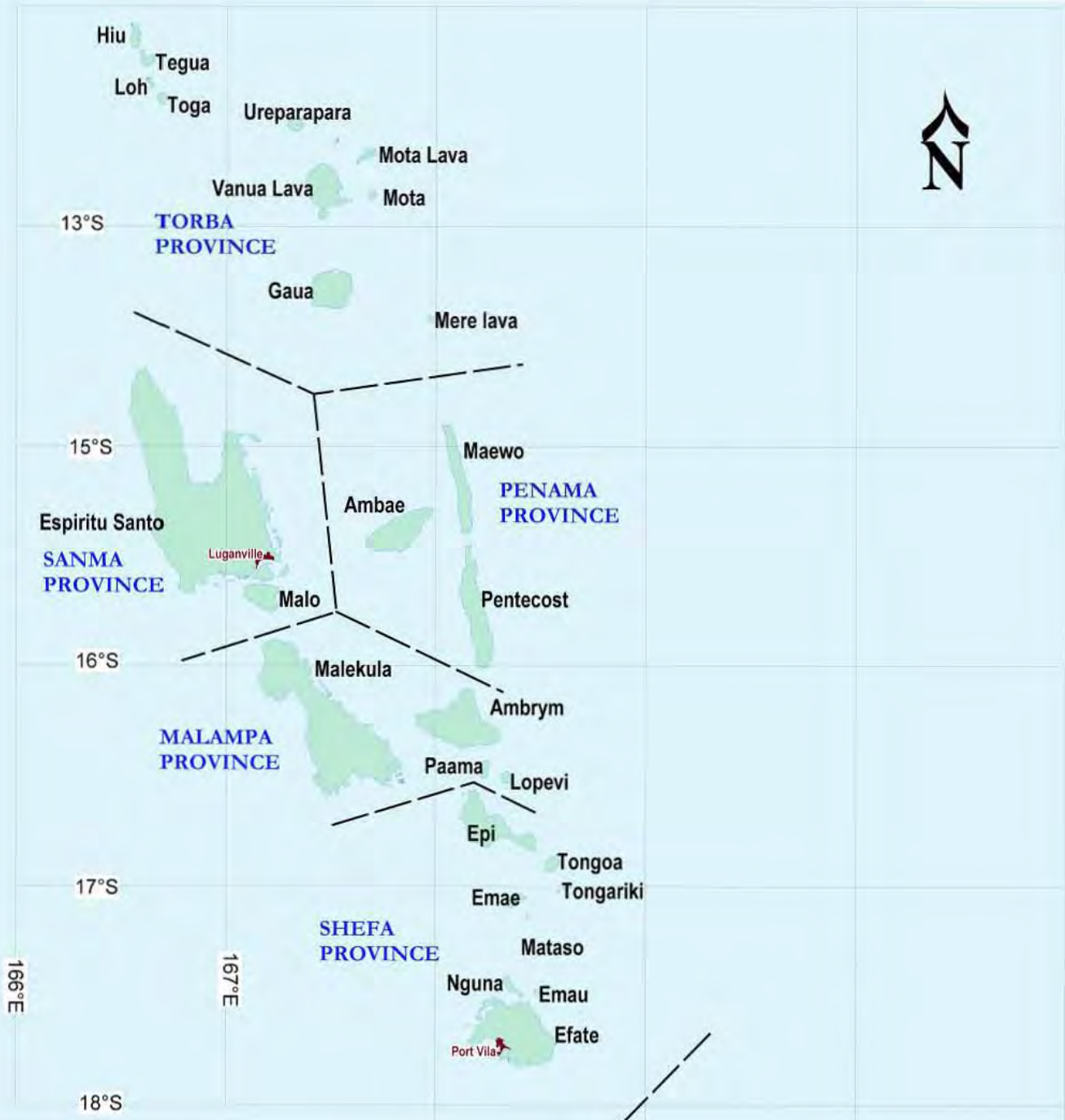

Preface

This report provides administrative information and basic statistical tabulations of the 2009 Census of Population and Housing of Vanuatu. The census date was midnight the 16th of November 2009. The statistical information included in this report is to assist informed decision making Vanuatu through providing the demographic, social and economic characteristics of the population and households in Vanuatu.

This report is in three parts. Part 1 includes background information about the 2009; Part 2 contains Census the statistical tabulations; and Part 3 contains information about the Census including the forms and classifications used.

The 2009 Census of Population and Housing was the first time the Vanuatu National Statistics Office (VNSO) extensively used geographic information system (GIS) technology for a household survey with the exact location of every household in Vanuatu captured through Global Positioning System (GPS) handsets. It was also the first time the VNSO used scanning technology to capture the information from the questionnaires into the computer database.

The 2009 Census was carried out with the support and efforts of many people. These include the Ministry of Finance and Economic Management executive, the Census Steering Committee, the Ministry of Lands in providing the spatial data, the Ministry of Education Youth Development and Training for providing the Zone Curriculum Advisors as Field Managers and Trainers for the Census, the Provincial Authorities for providing support for Census training activities, the Malvatumauri National Council of Chiefs for their support for the 2009 Census operations, The Vanuatu Broad casting and Television Cooperation (VBTC), Air Vanuatu domestic operation for the arrangement of filed workers and their materials, and Digicel for providing cell phone access.

My appreciation is extended to the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC) for the technical assistance provided. I also acknowledge the financial support from a number of donors for the Census including the governments of Australia and New Zealand as well as UNFPA.

I would also like to thank the 2009 Census Project team for their hard work and technical expertise from the initial planning stages which began in early 2008 to the preparation of final reports which is ongoing in 2010.

Lastly and most importantly, to the Vanuatu Government and the people of Vanuatu, I extend my sincerest thanks and gratitude for their invaluable support of and participation in the 2009 Census.

Part 1 Concepts and definitions

Total population is the total population residing in all households, including private households and institutions (such as boarding schools, hospitals, hotels etc) on Census night.

Population in private households includes all persons living in private households on Census night.

Usually resident population is the population in private households who have lived, or intend to live, in Vanuatu for a period of three months or more.

Place of residence is the Census night address.

Place of usual residence is the island where the population in private households usually live, this can be different than the Census night address if the person stayed at another place on Census night.

Working population includes those with a job (for pay or profit) and those who were temporarily absent during the week before the Census.

Unemployed people are defined as those who did not work during the week before the Census and were actively looking for work.

Private household is persons who usually eat together and share the work of preparing the food and/or the cost of work of providing it who do not live in an institution.

Institution household is an organisation providing specified services or performing some general public function for a group of residents or inmates who will normally be unrelated to each other. Examples are hospitals, schools, prisons, hotels, bible college, guest houses, passenger boats etc.

NS is not stated and includes respondents who should have answered a Census question but did not.

Employment status is the type of work or economic activity the person did during the week before the Census.

Occupation has been coded according to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) 2008 version at the one and two digit level with codes used for occupations of interest in Vanuatu at the three digit level.

Industry is the main economic activity of a person's employer or business. It has been coded according to the International Standard Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities, Rev 4 released in 2008 at the one and two digit level with codes used for economic activities of interest in Vanuatu at the three digit level.

Figure 1.1: Total population by five year age groups, Vanuatu: 1999 and 2009

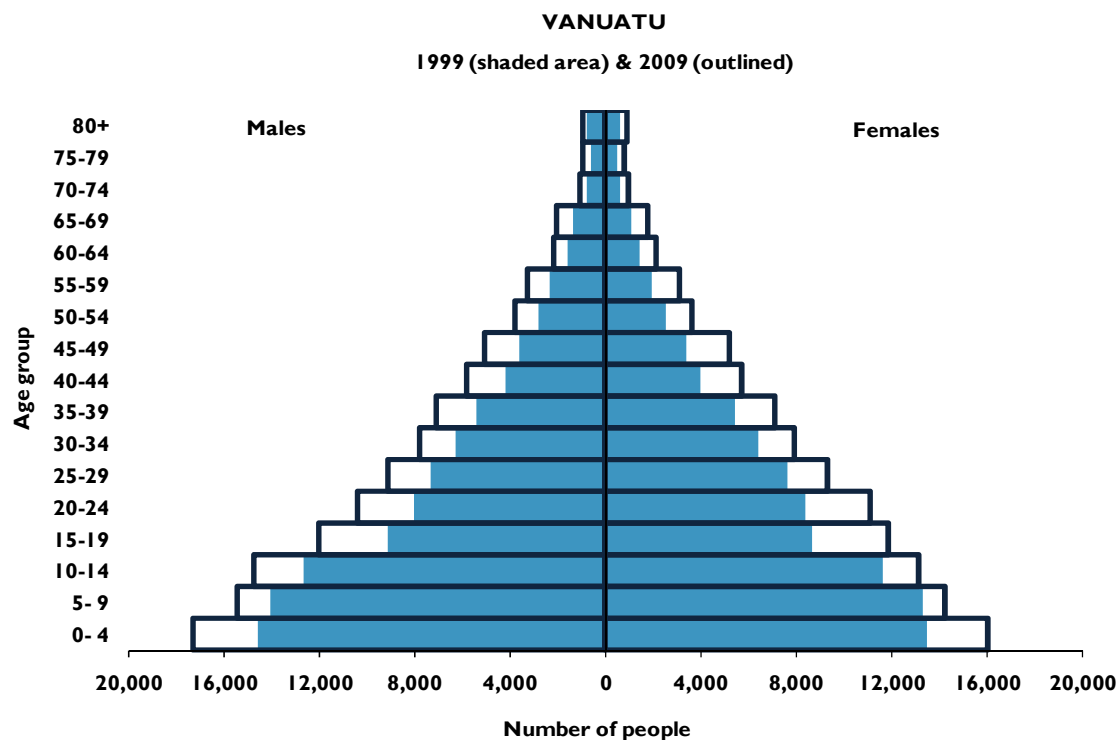

Figure 1.2: Average household size (private households) and province

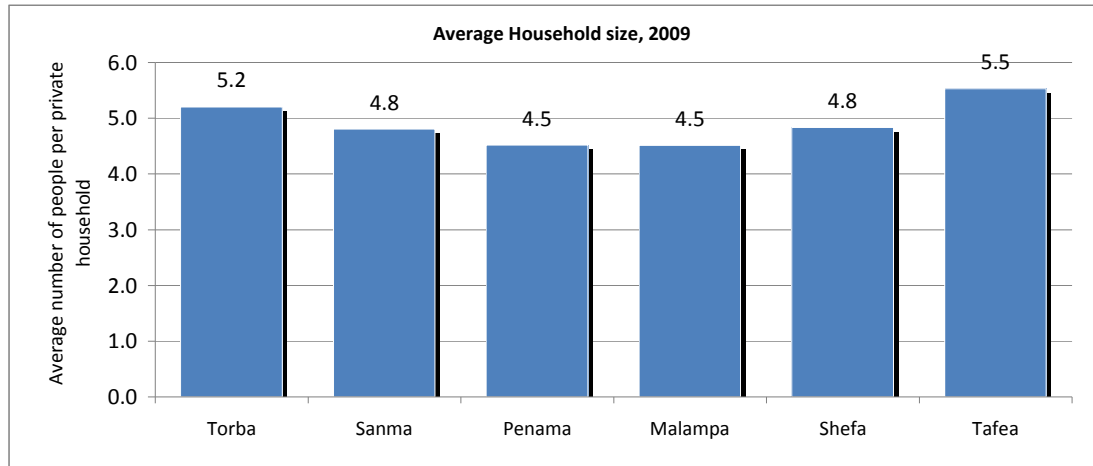


Figure 1.3: Vanuatu population 1967-2009

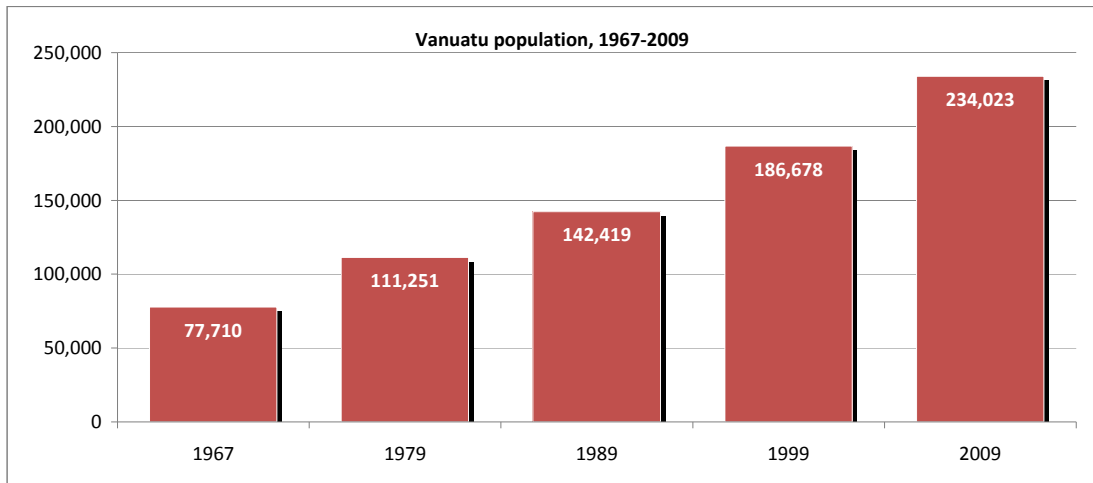

Figure 2.1: Usually resident population, age-sex pyramid

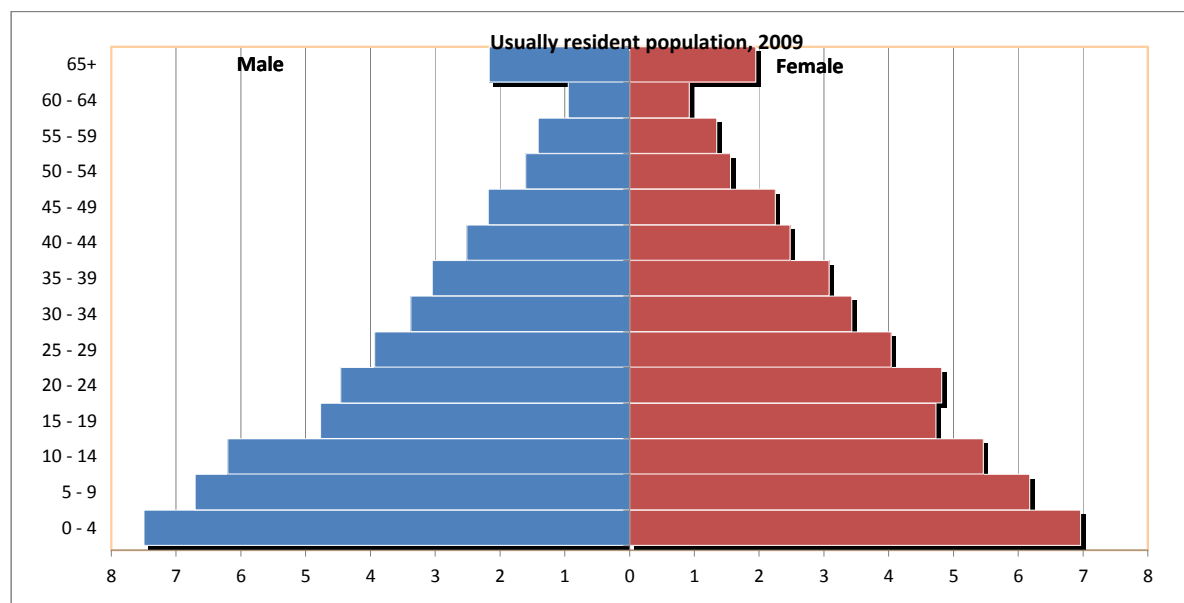

Figure 3.1: Population living in private households by citizenship and province

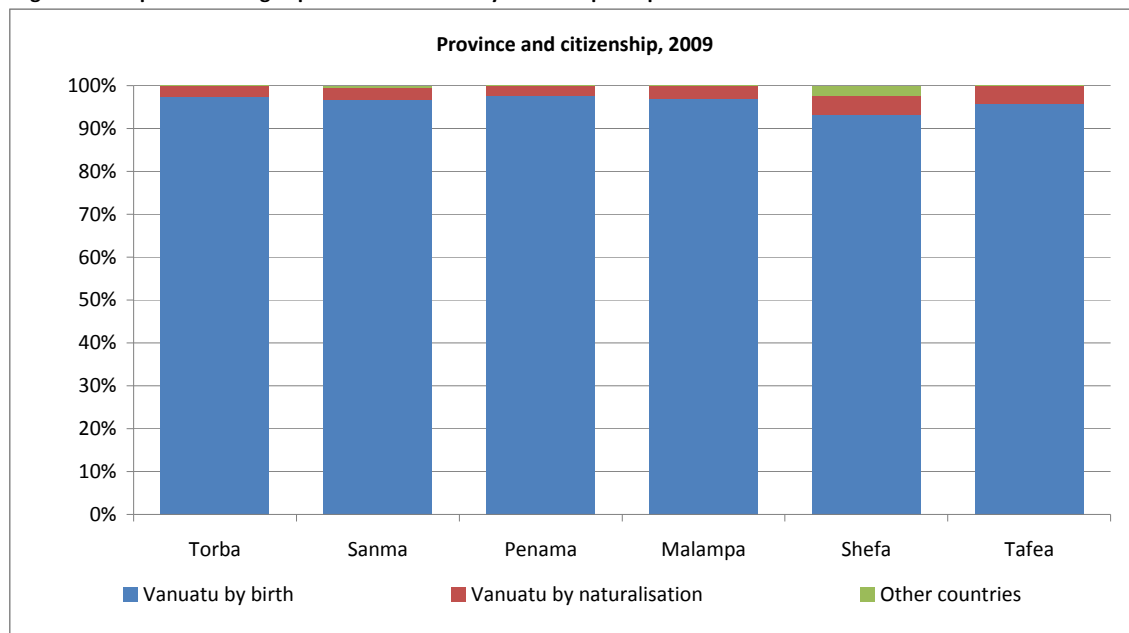

Figure 3.2: Population living in private households by 5-year age groups, sex and citizenship

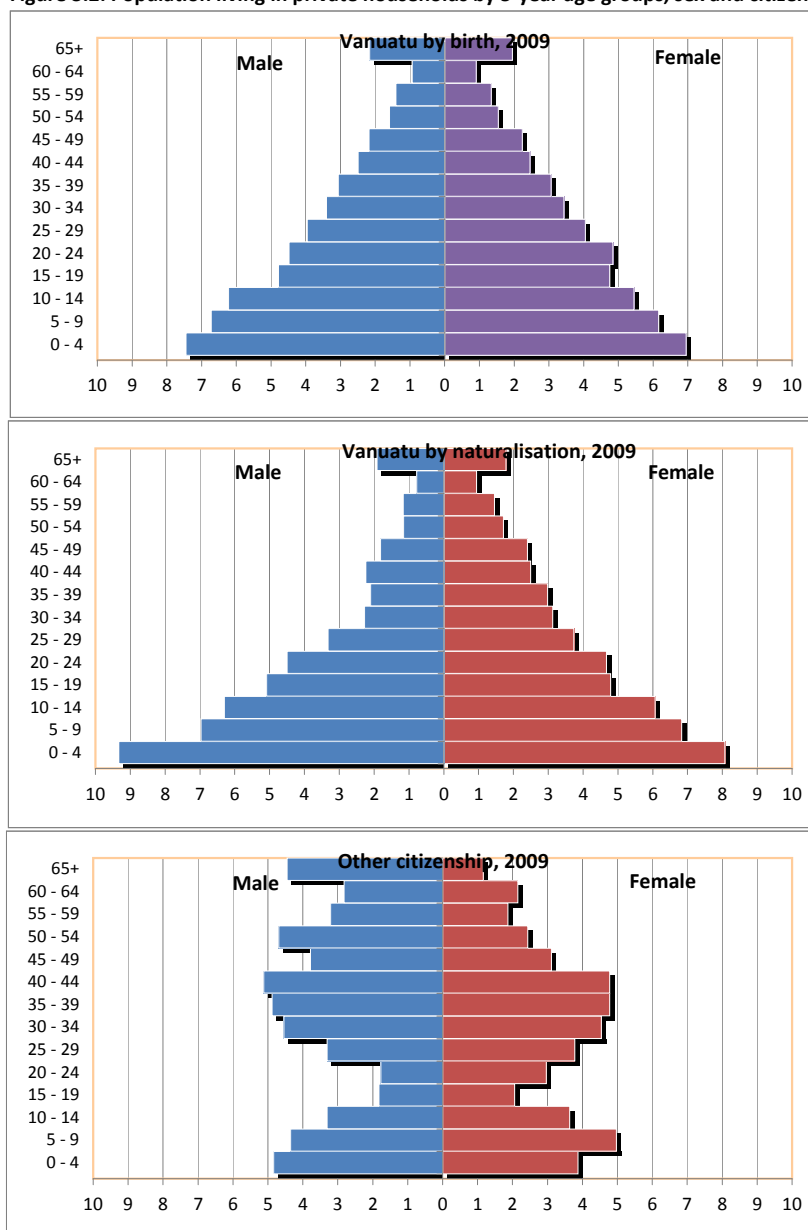

Figure 3.3: Non-Vanuatu citizens living in private households by country of citizenship

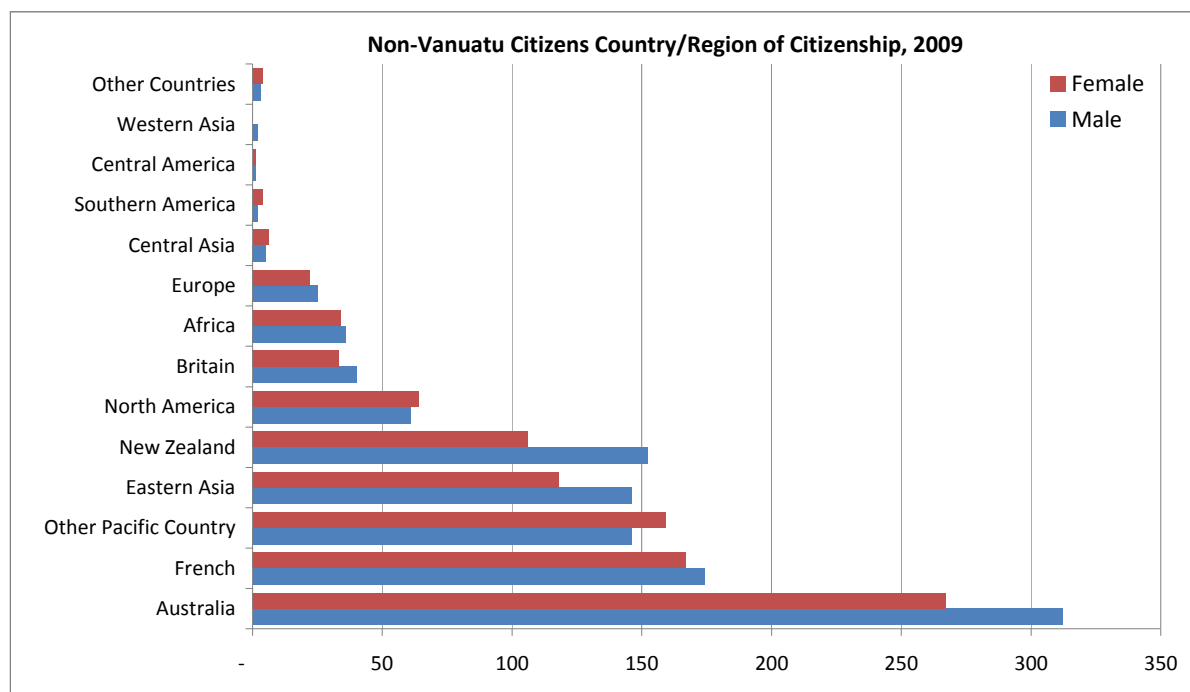

Figure 4.1: Population living in private households by place of birth, sex and province

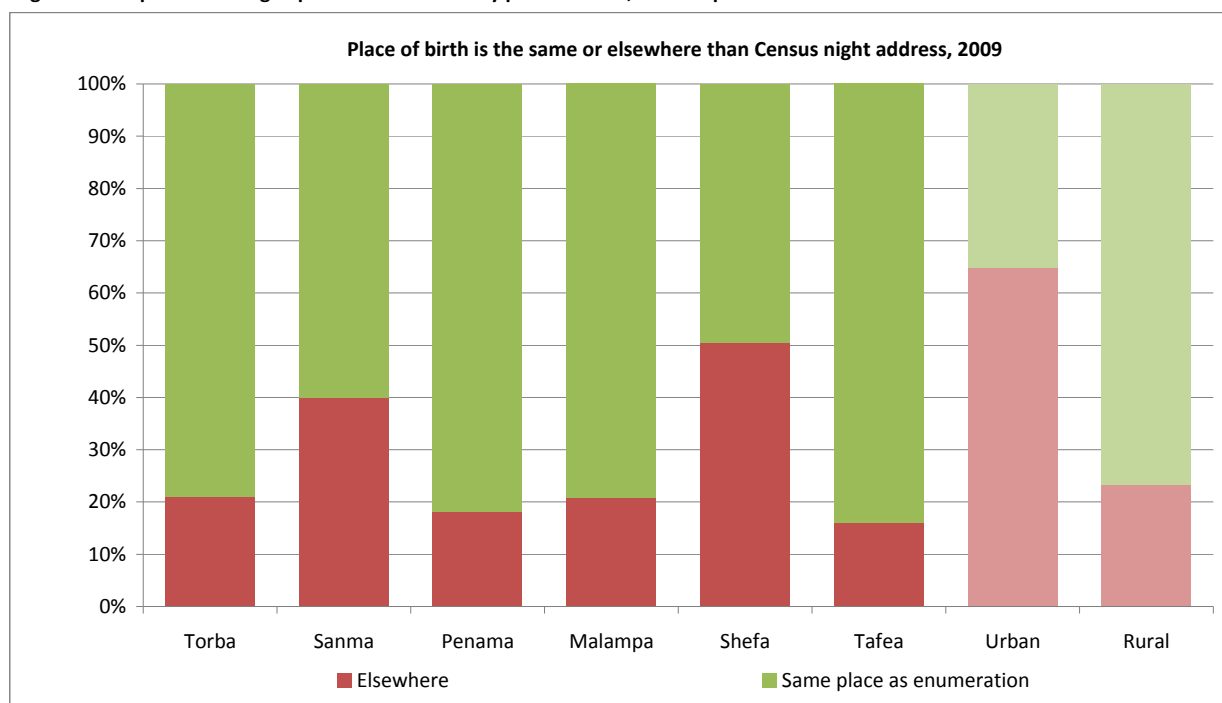

Figure 4.2: Overseas born population by country of birth

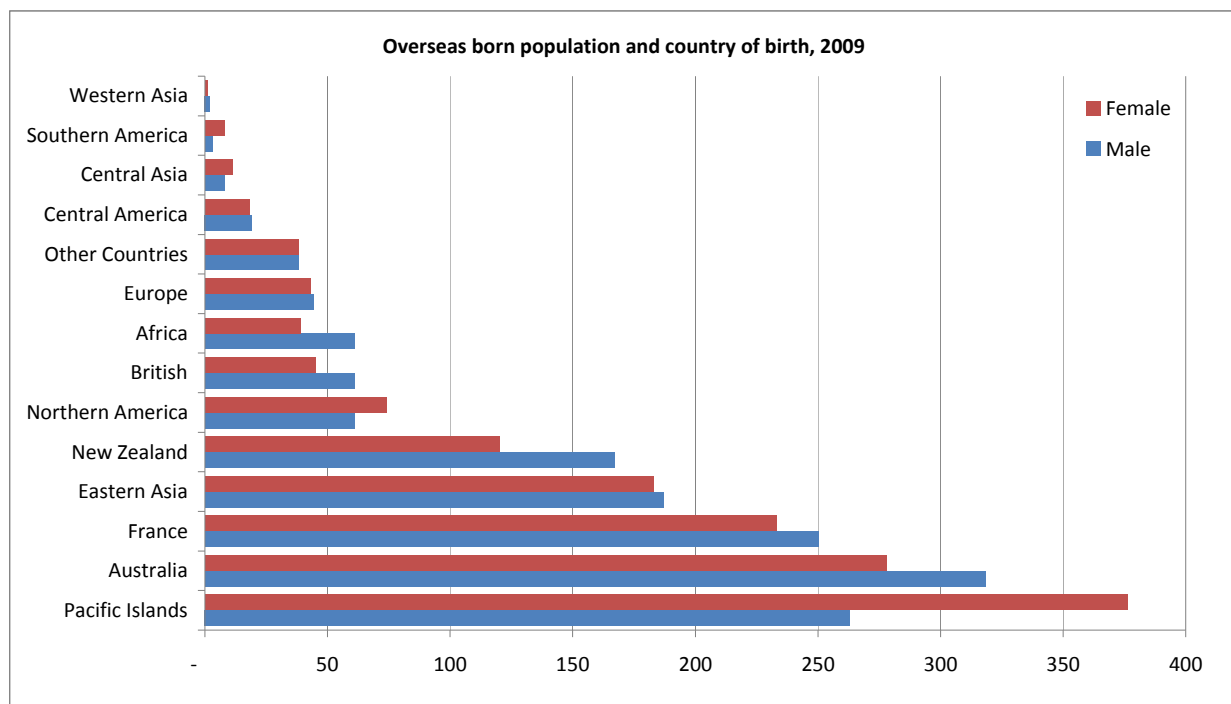

Figure 4.3: Total population and whether place of usual residence same as place of enumeration by sex and province

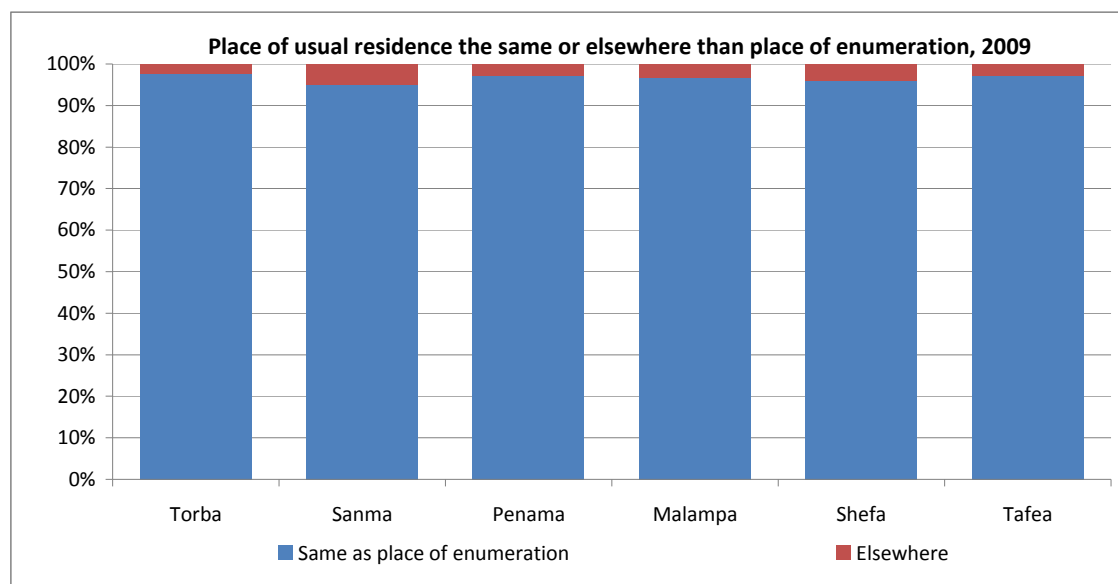

Figure 4.4: Population usually residing overseas by country of residence

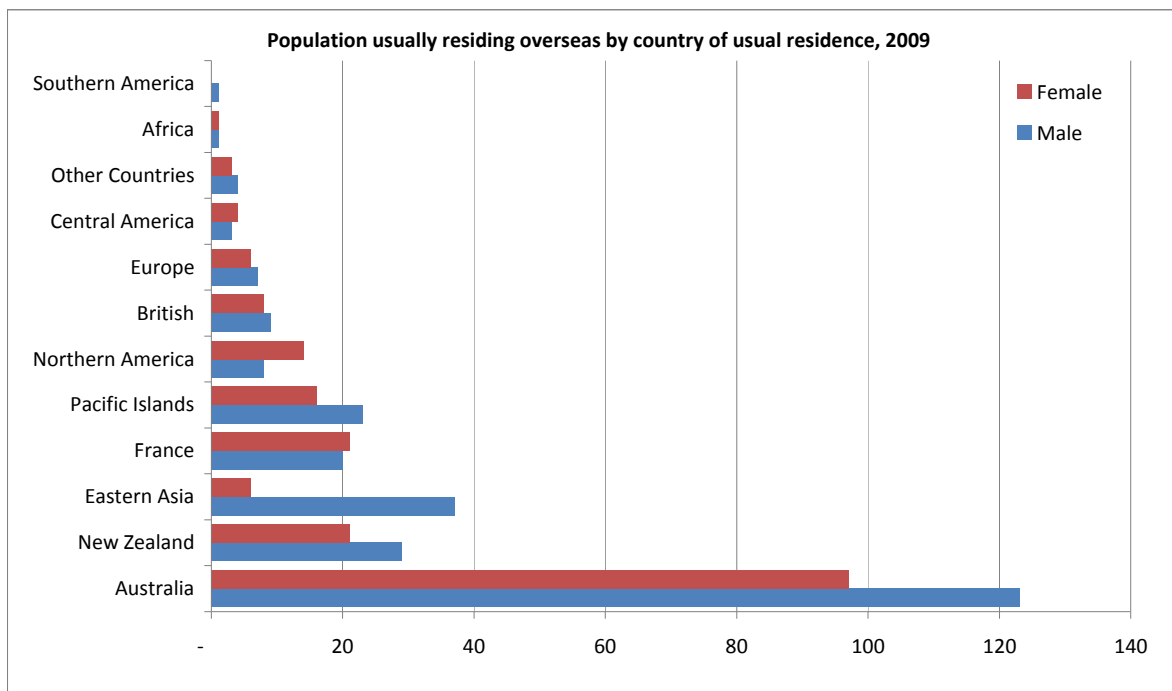

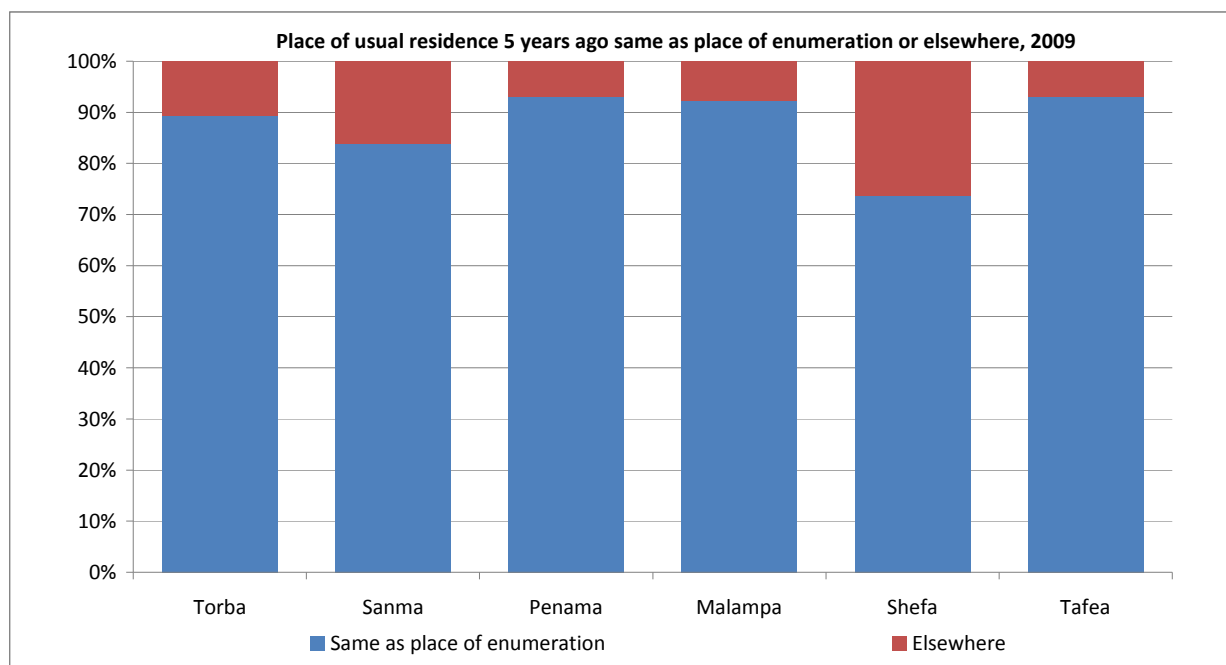

Figure 4.6: Population who lived overseas 5 years ago by country of residence

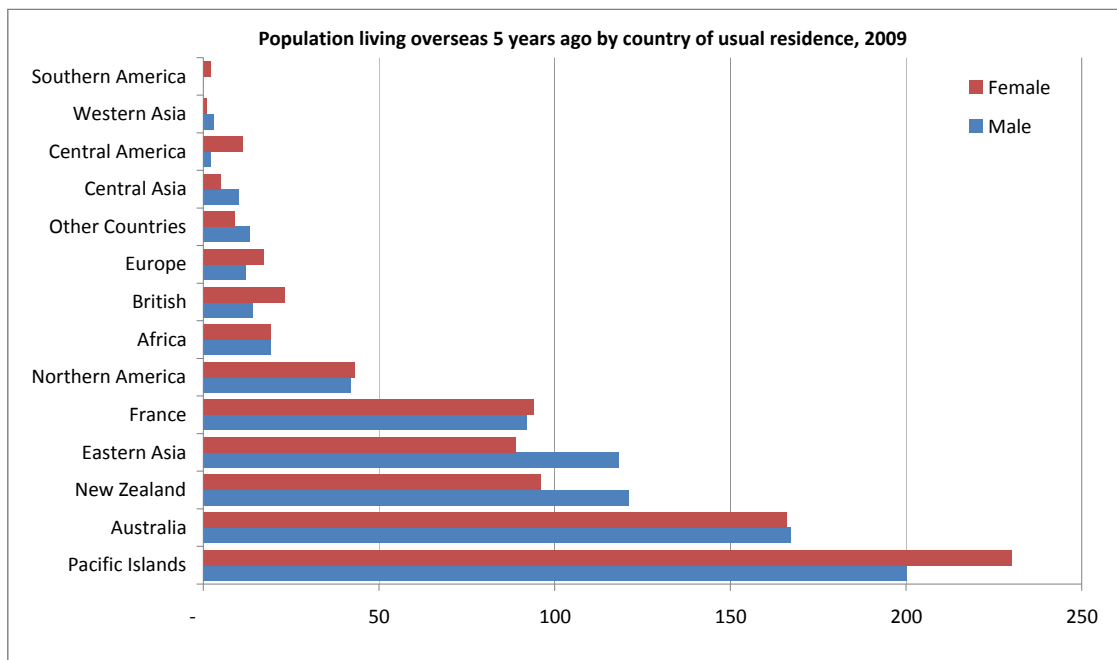

Figure 5.1: Population living in private households reporting difficulties in seeing

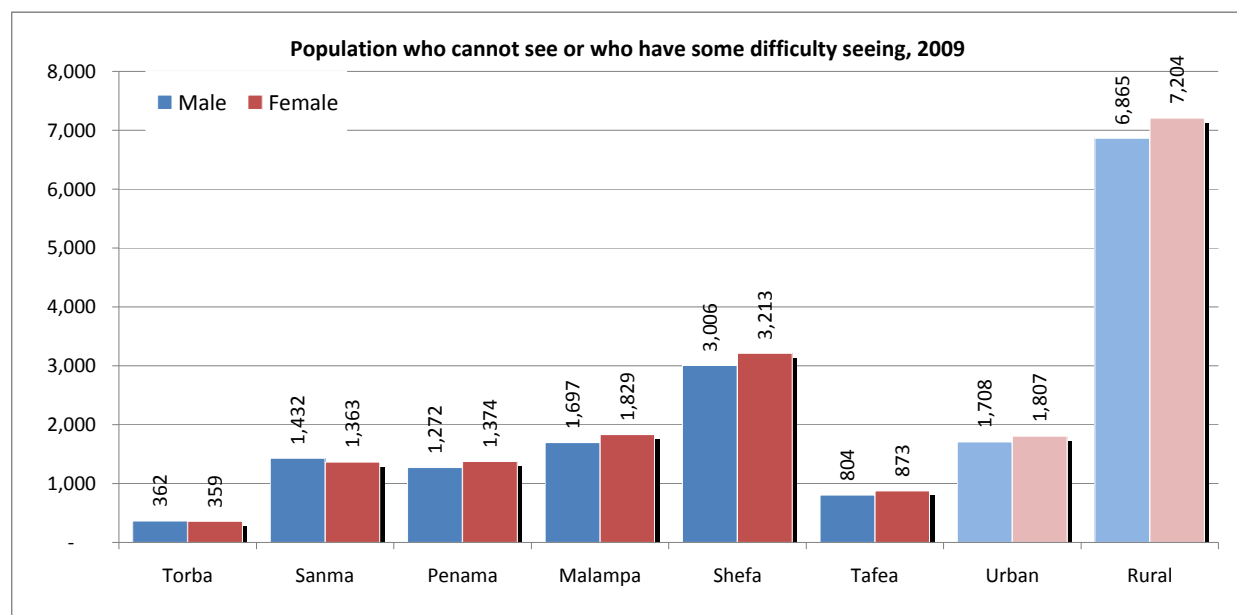

Figure 5.2: Population living in private households by 5-year age group and sex, reporting difficulties in seeing

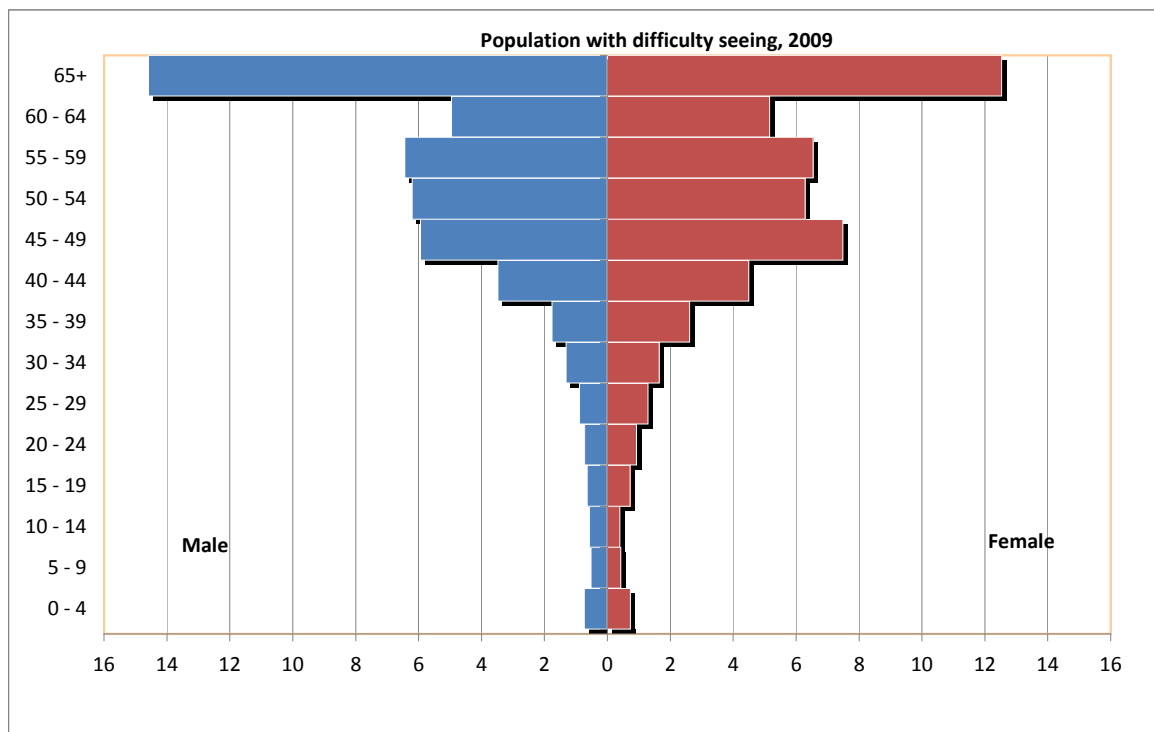

Figure 5.3: Population living in private households reporting difficulties in hearing

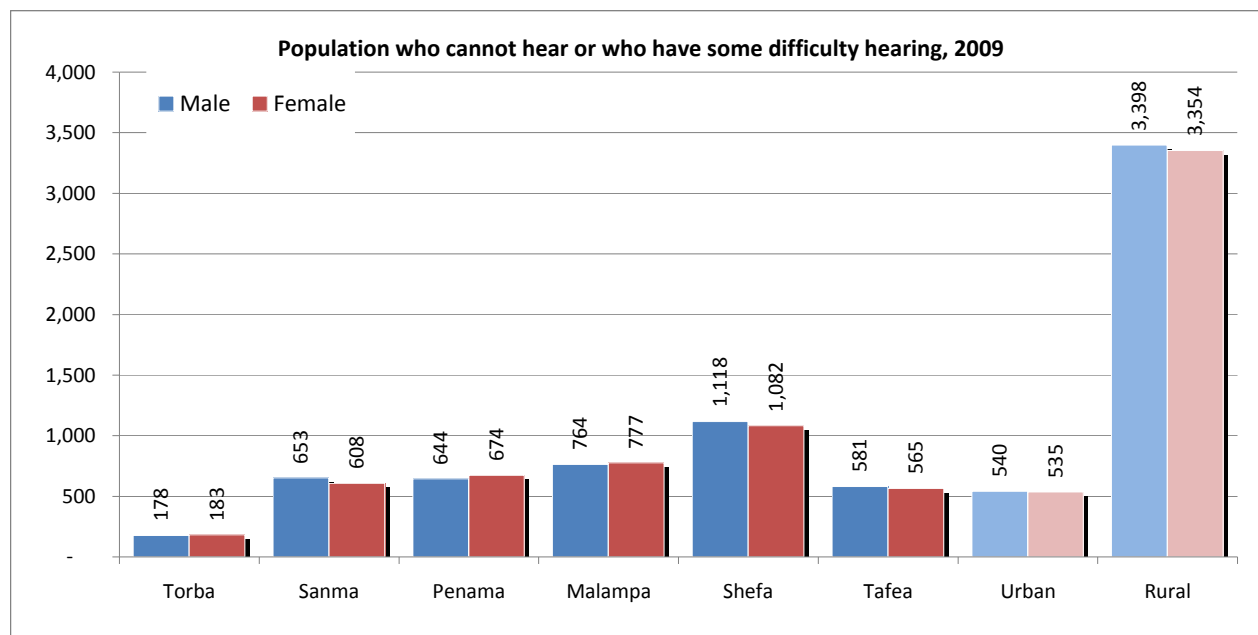

Figure 5.4: Population living in private households by 5-year age group and sex, reporting difficulties in hearing

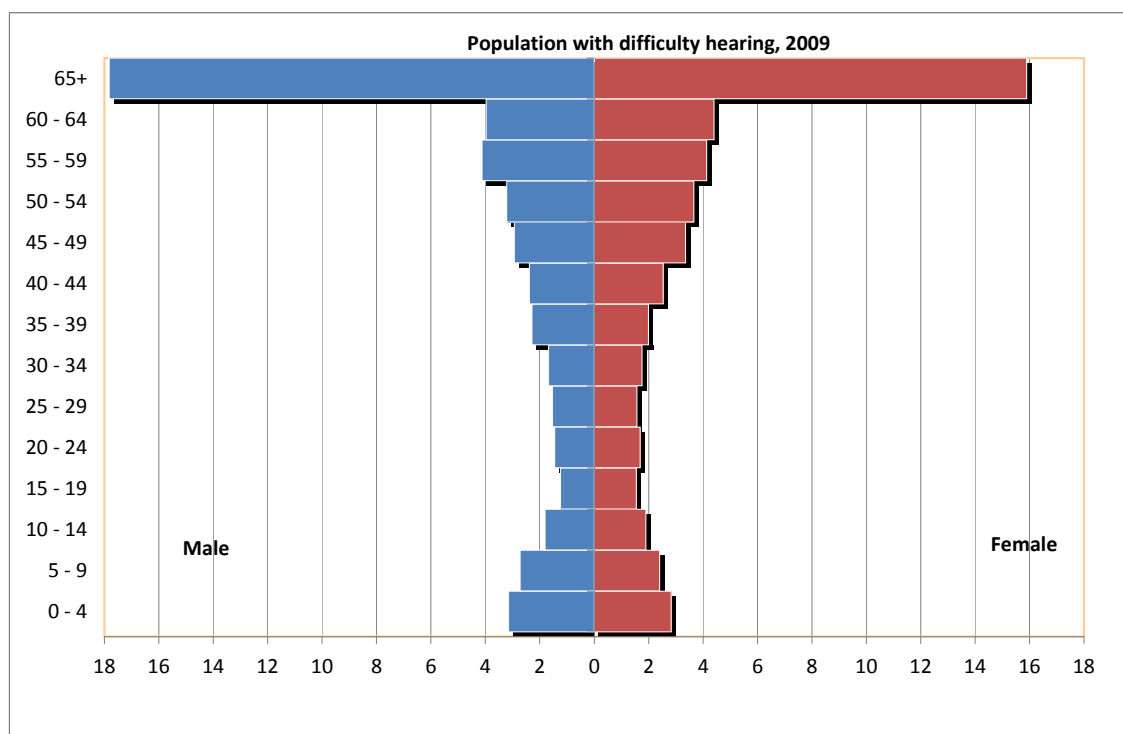

Figure 5.5: Total population reporting difficulties in walking

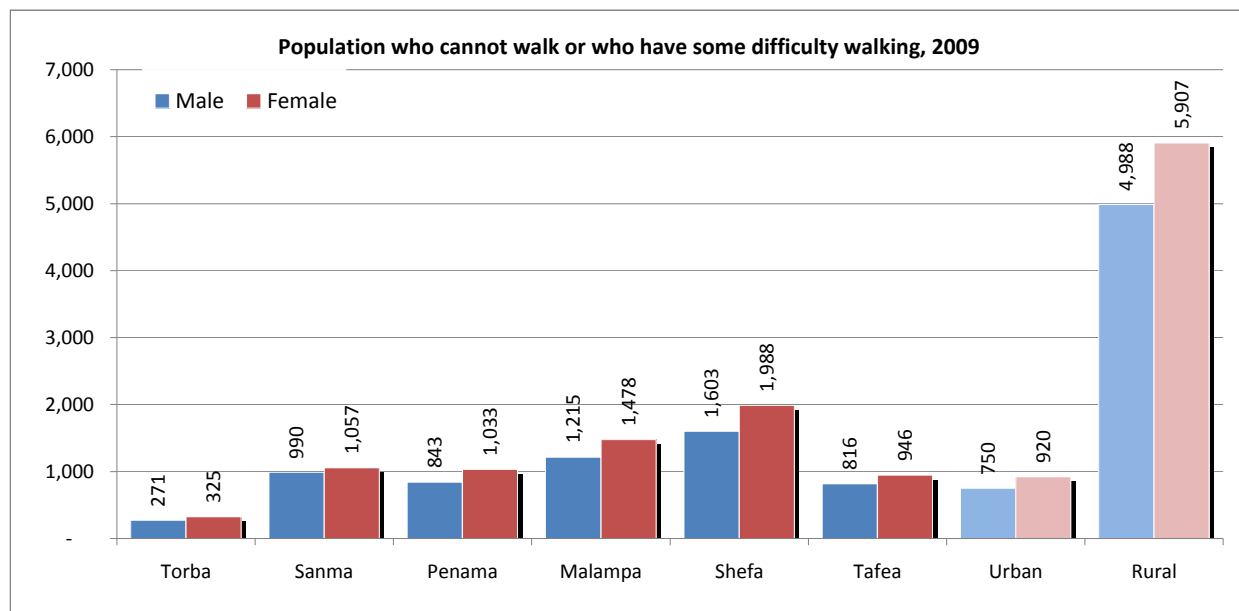

Figure 5.6: Population living in private households by 5-year age group and sex, reporting difficulties in walking

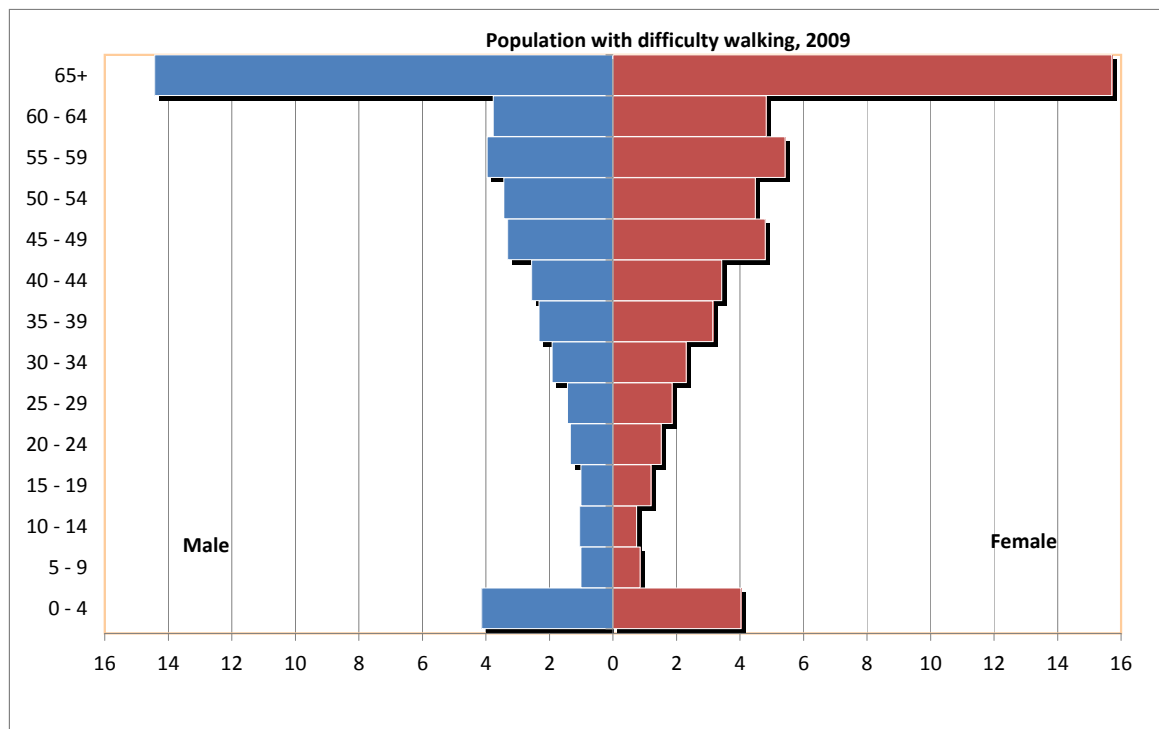

Figure 5.7: Population living in private households reporting difficulties in remembering

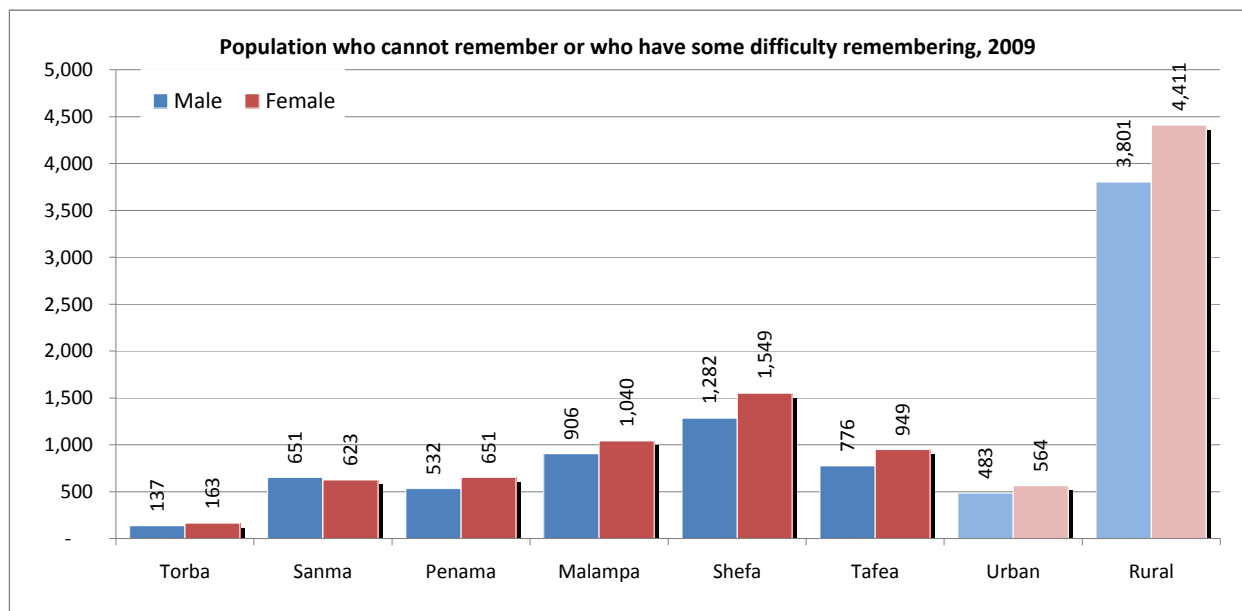

Figure 5.8: Population living in private households by 5-year age group and sex, reporting difficulties in remembering

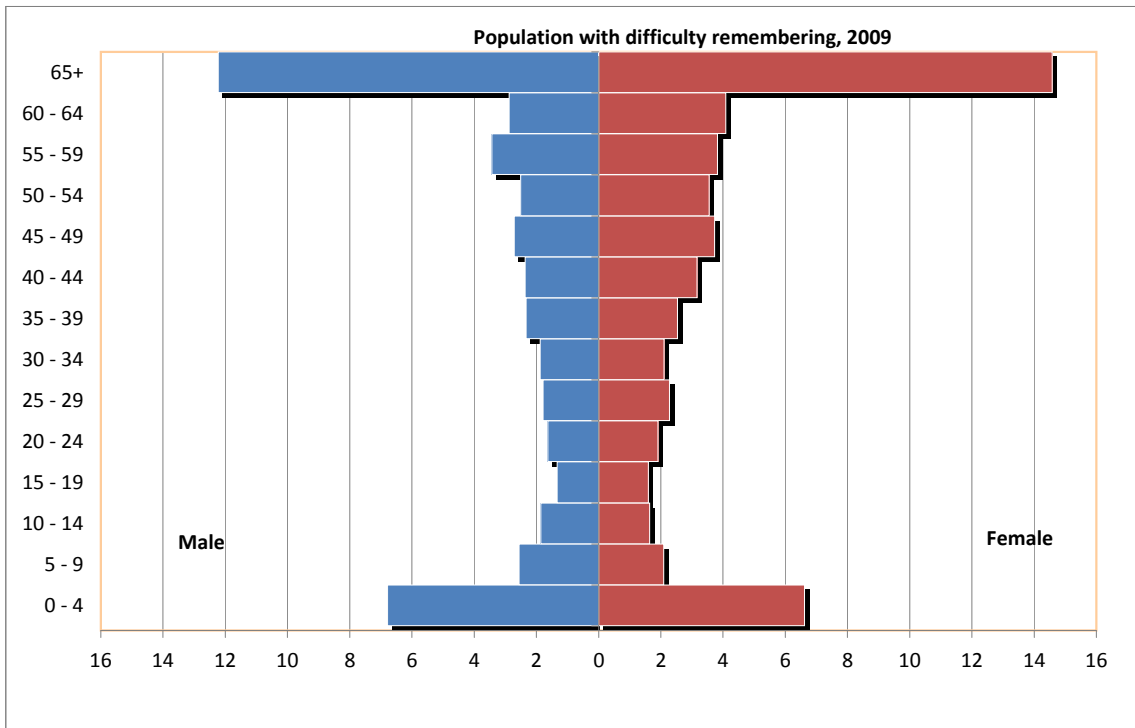

Figure 6.1: Population living in private households 5 years and older who attend a formal educational institution by age and sex and level of education attended

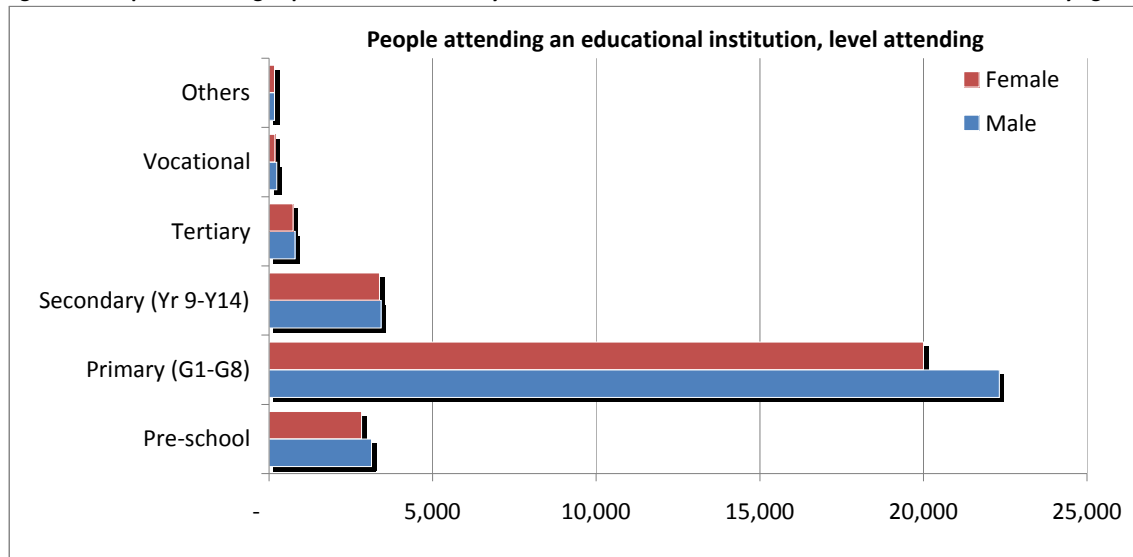

Figure 6.2: Population 15 years and older by sex and highest level of education completed

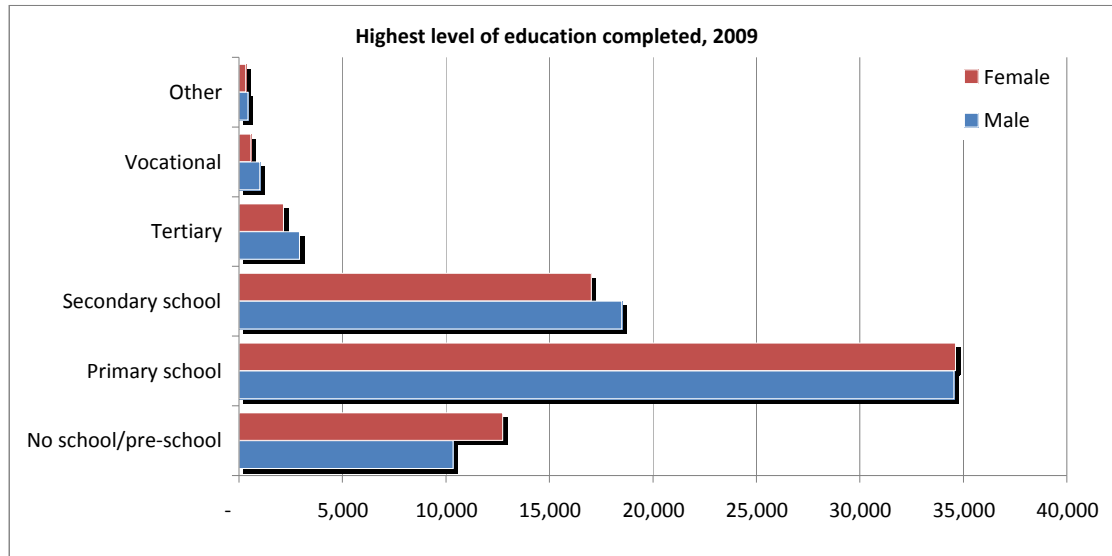

Figure 6.3: Population living in private households 5 years and older able to write and read a simple sentence in English

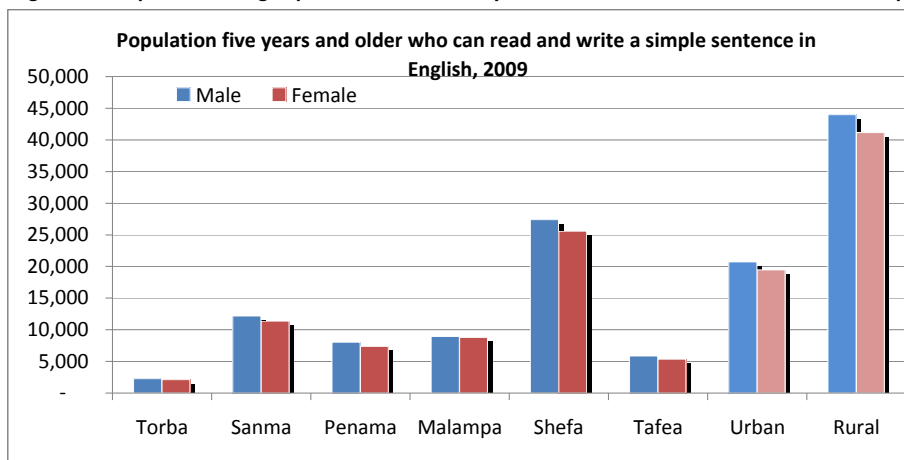


Figure 6.4: Population living in private households 5 years and older not able to write and read a simple sentence in English

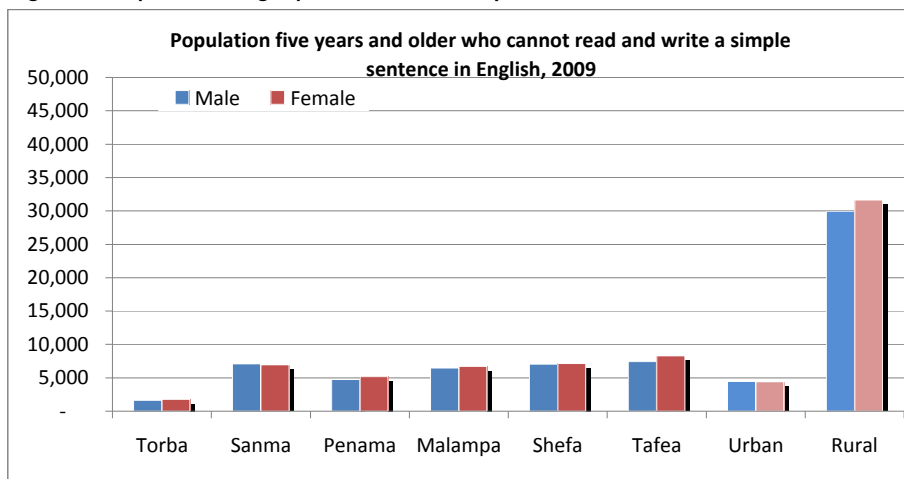

Figure 6.5: Population living in private households 5 years and older able to write and read a simple sentence in French

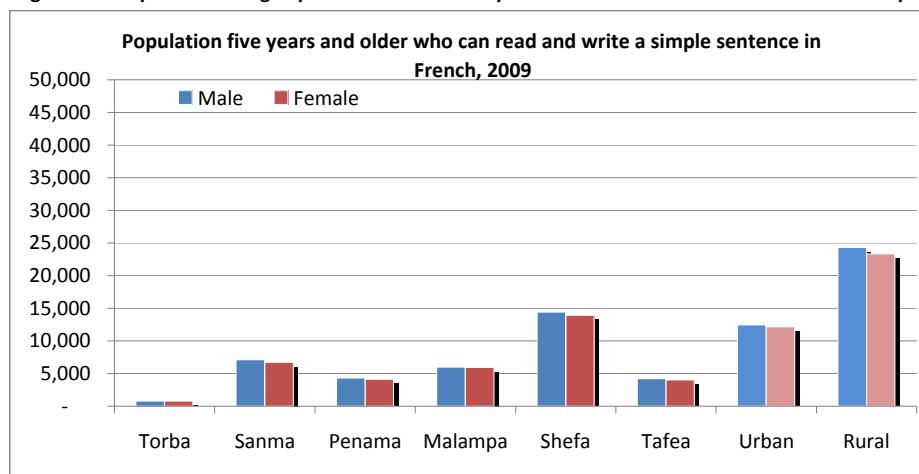


Figure 6.6: Population living in private households 5 years and older not able to write and read a simple sentence in French

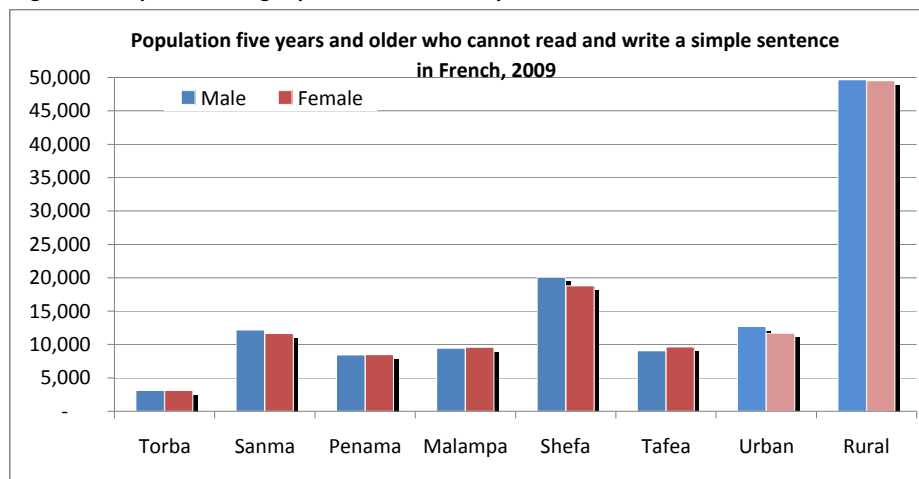

Figure 6.7: Population living in private households 5 years and older able to write and read a simple sentence in Bislama

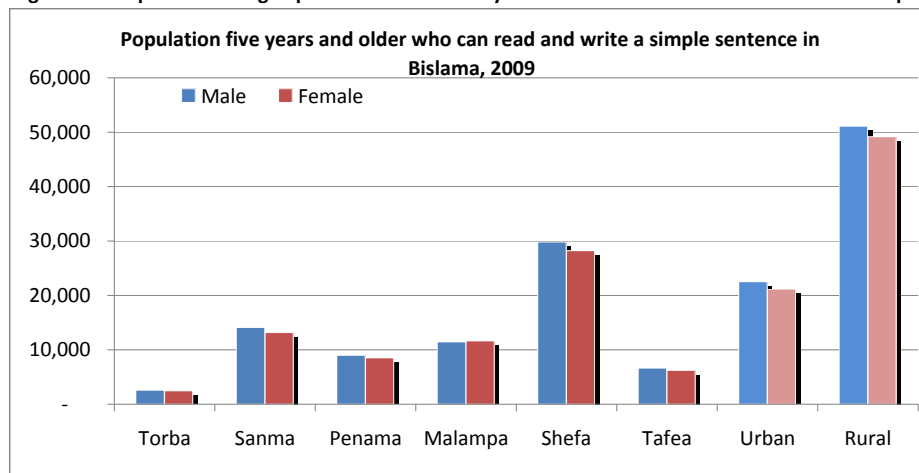


Figure 6.8: Population living in private households 5 years and older not able to write and read a simple sentence in Bislama

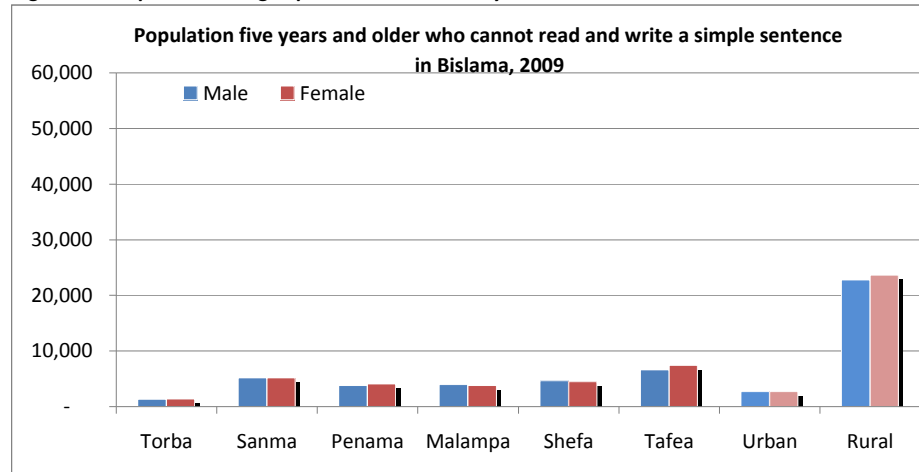

Figure 6.9: Population living in private households 5 years and older able to write and read a simple sentence in other language

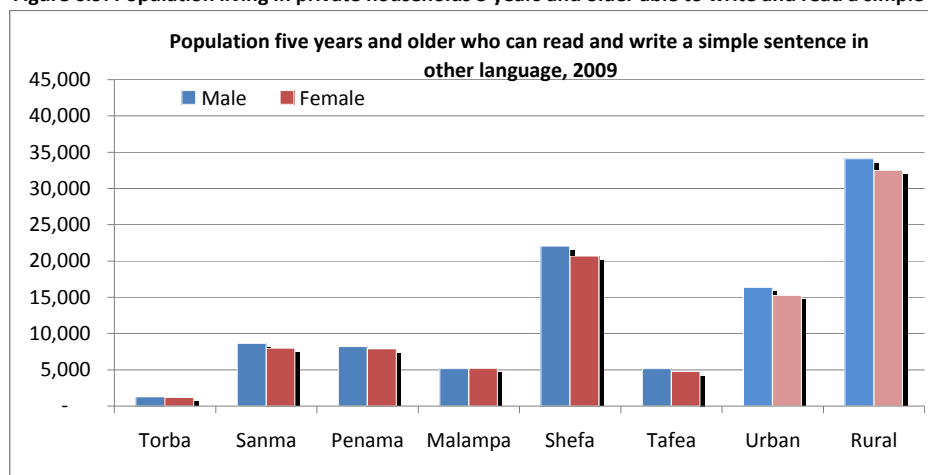


Figure 6.10: Population living in private households 5 years and older not able to write and read a simple sentence in other language

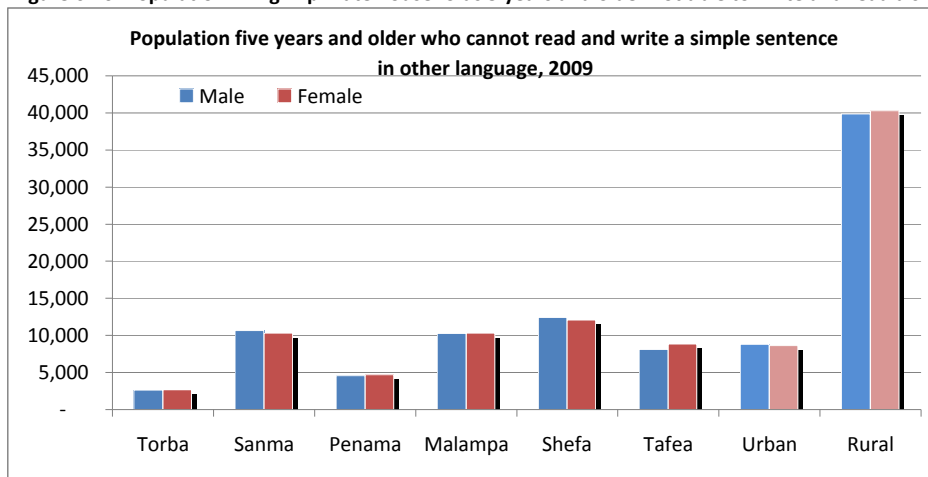

Figure 6.11: Population living in private households aged 15 years and over who used the internet by sex

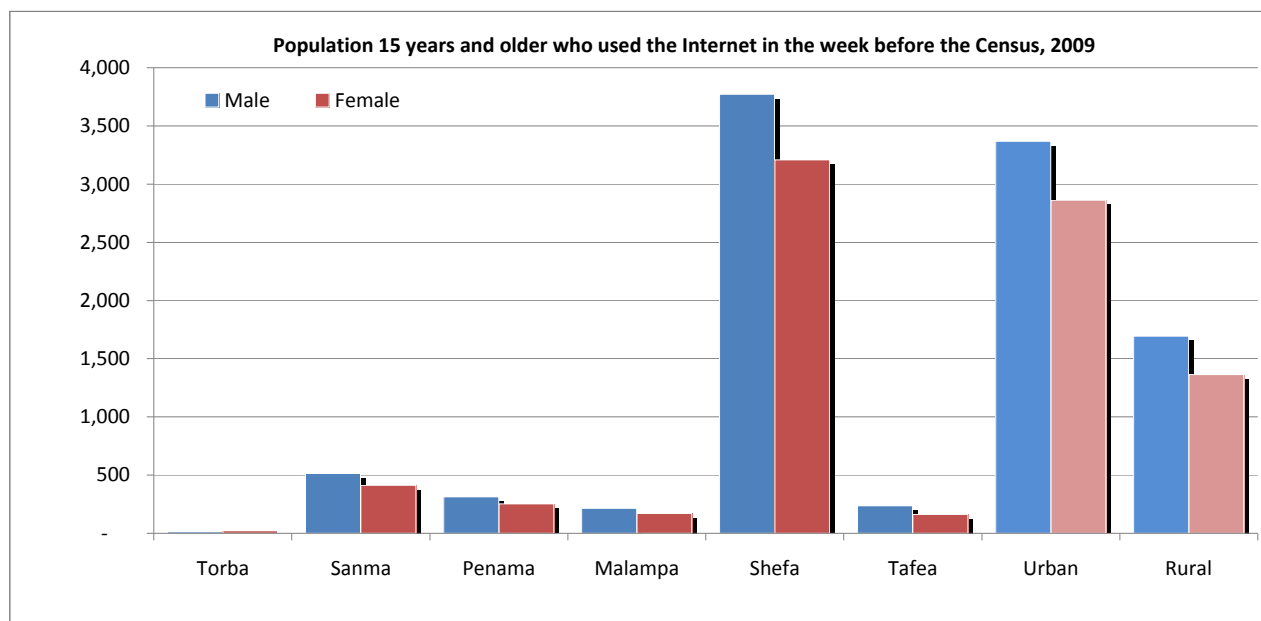

Figure 7.1 Population 15 years and older in private households and labour force status

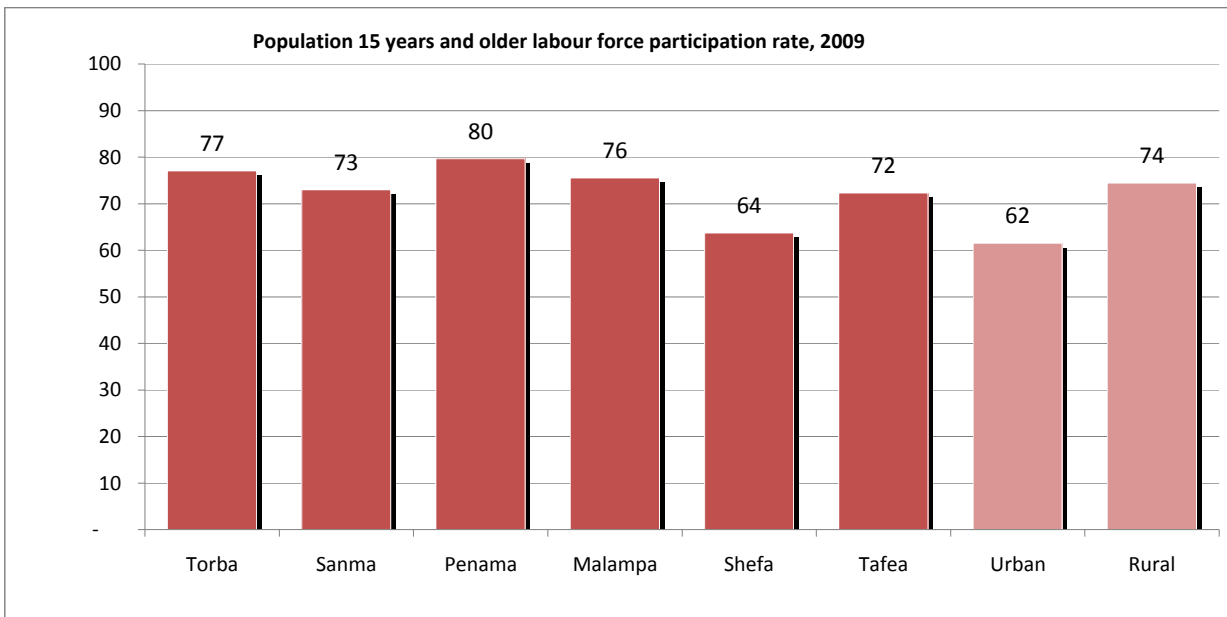

Figure 7.2 Male population 15 years and older in private households and labour force status

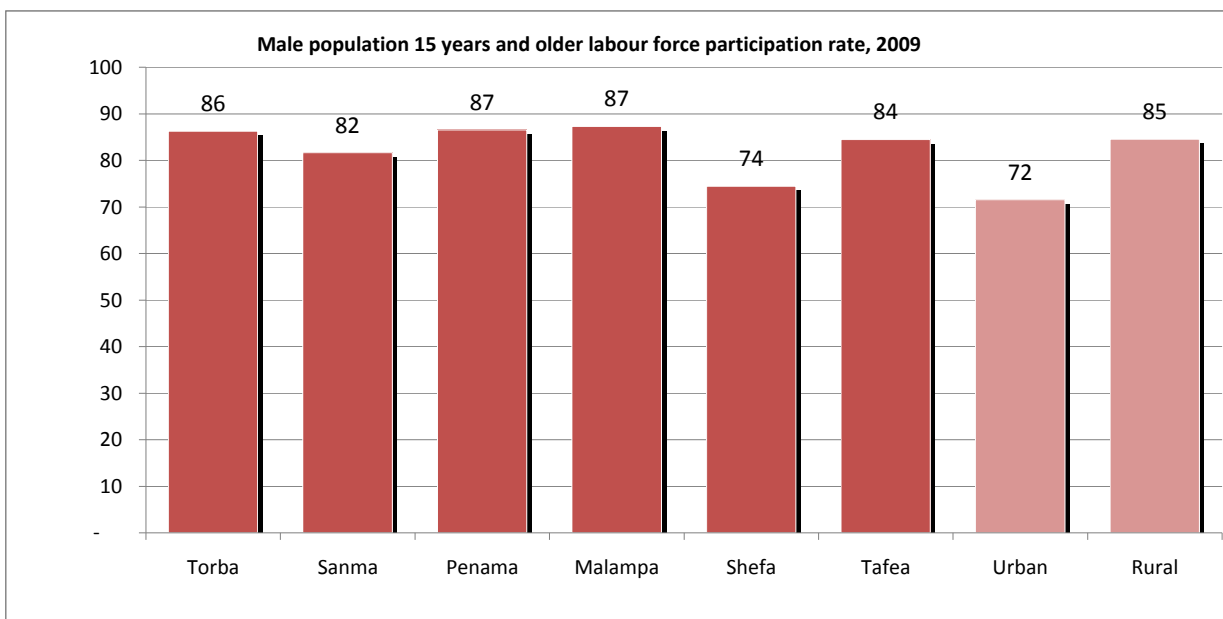

Figure 7.3 Female population 15 years and older in private households and labour force status

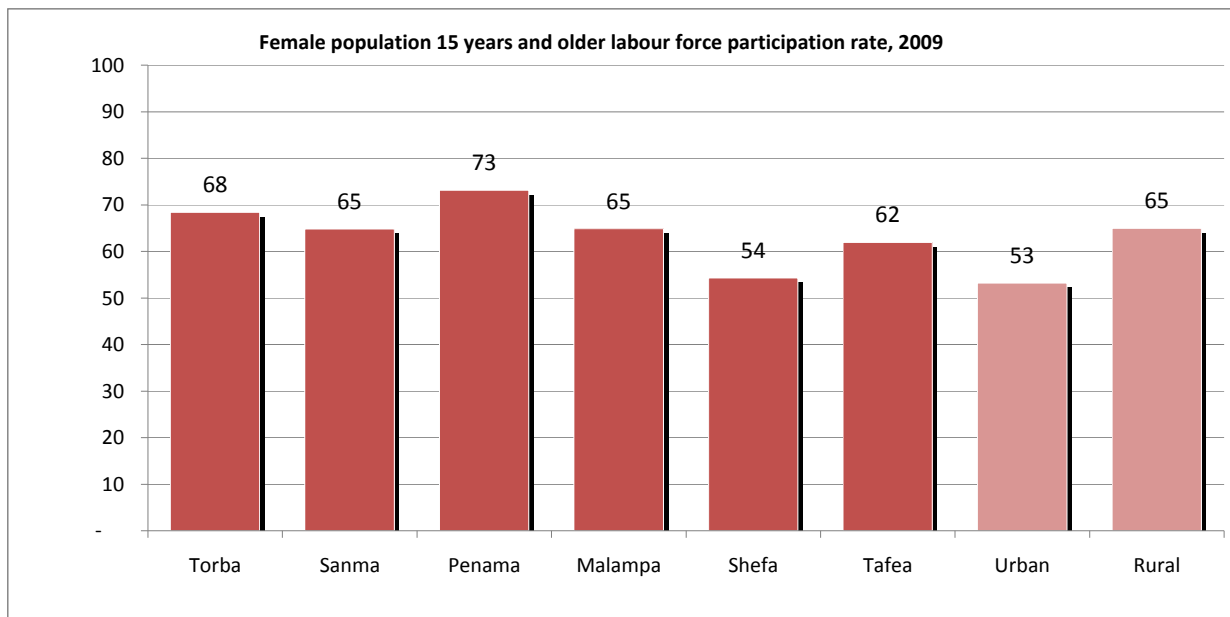

Figure 7.4: Population 15 years and older in private households by sex, whether doing any work during the week before the Census

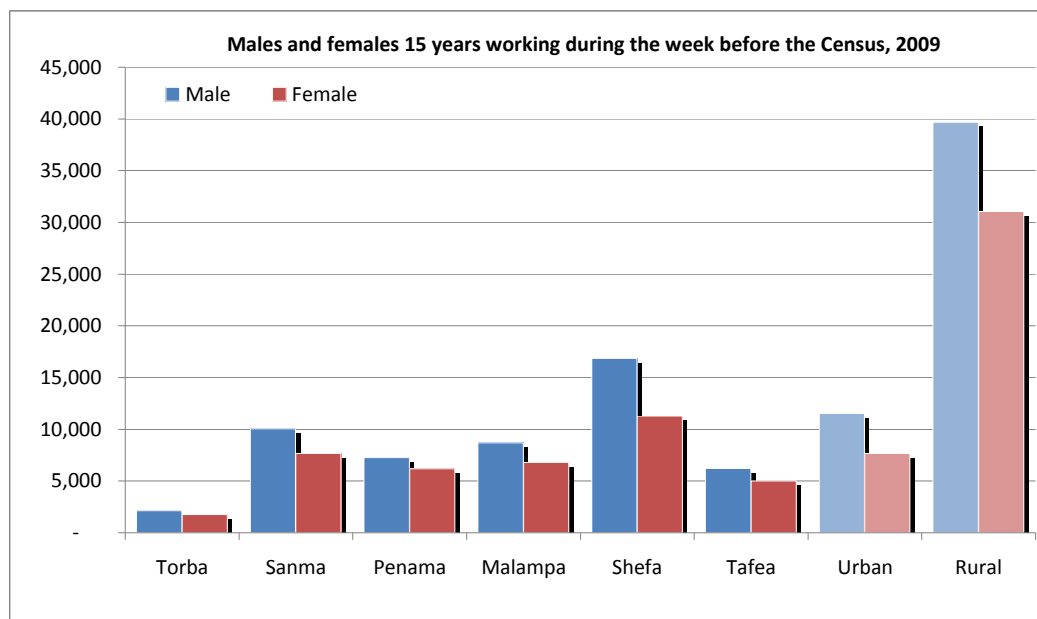

Figure 7.5: Population 15 years and older in private households who had a job but did not work the week before the Census by sex

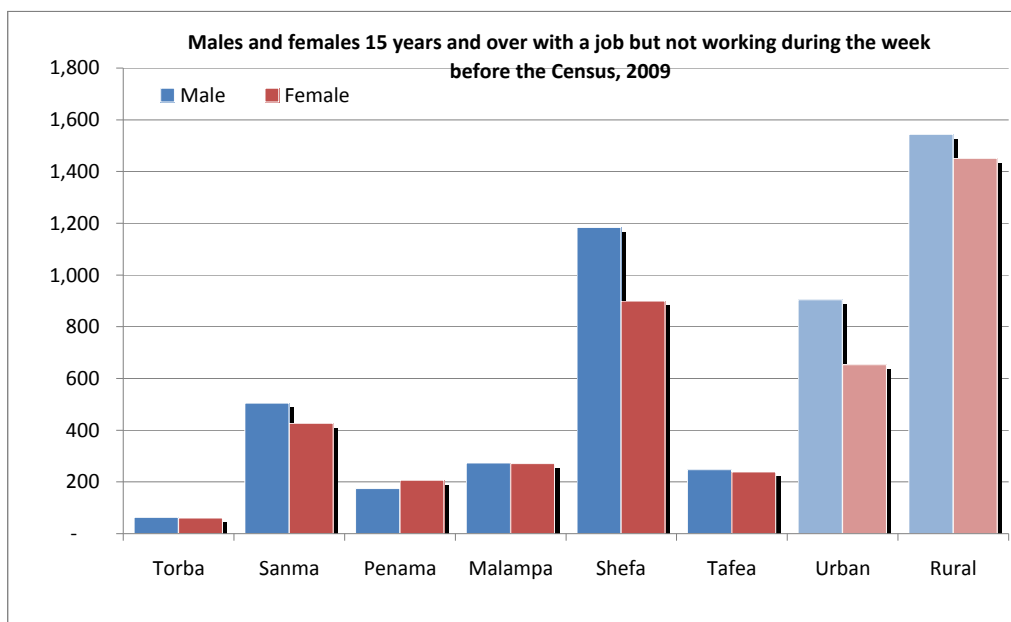

Figure 7.6: Working population 15 years and older in private households by sex and employment status

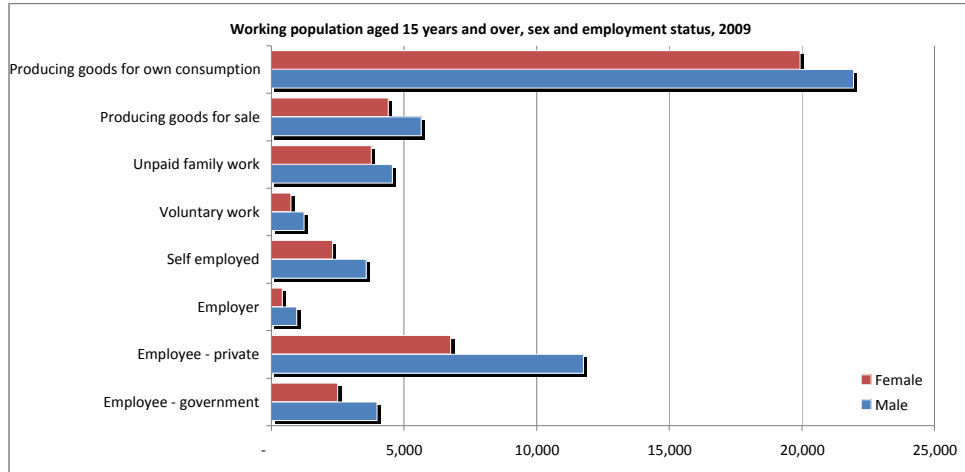

Figure 7.7: Population 15 years and older in private households by sex who did not work during the week before the Census and did not have a job, and whether actively looking for work

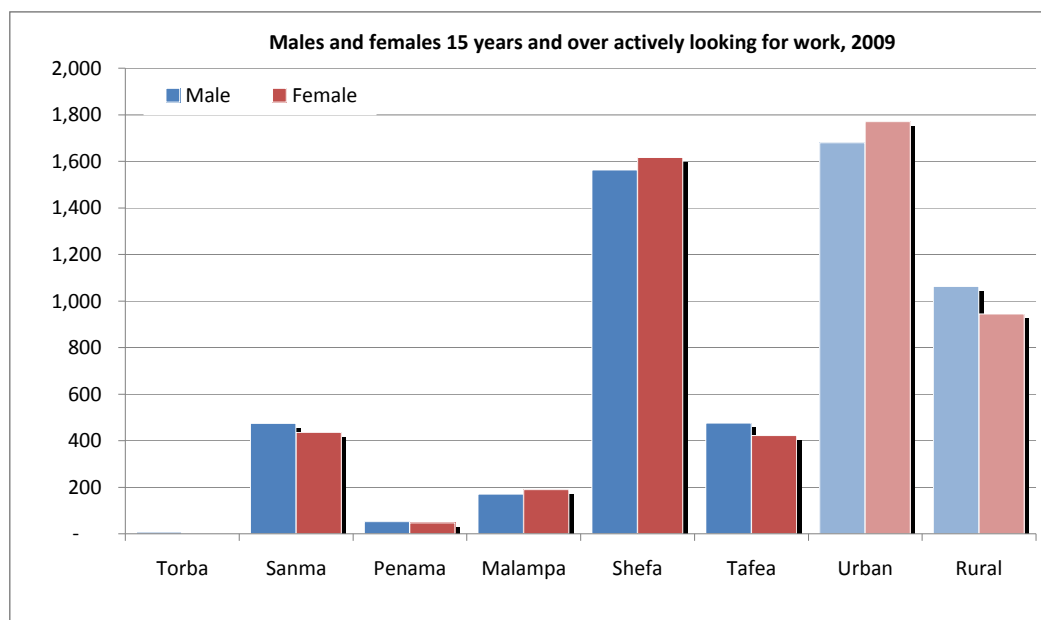

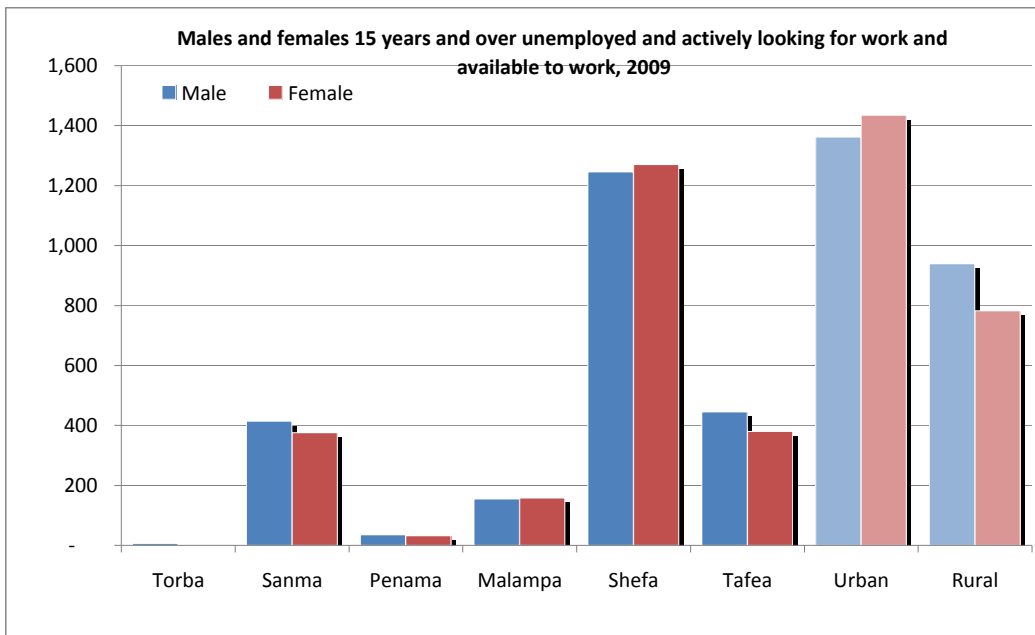
Figure 7.8: Unemployed population 15 years and older in private households and whether available to work by sex

Figure 8.2.1: Female population 15 years and older, total and average number of children ever born alive, province

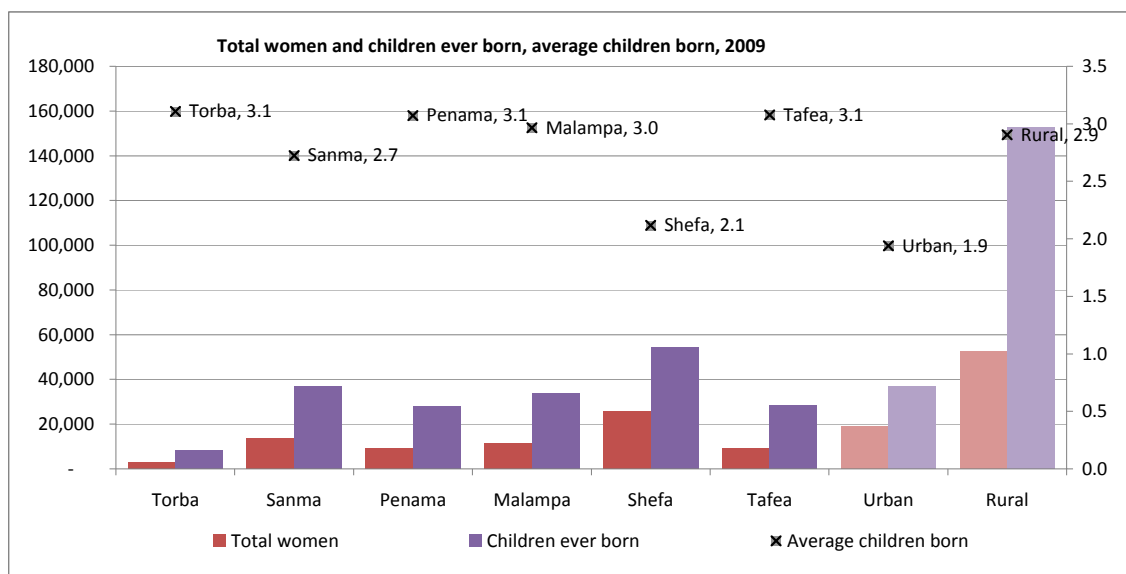

Figure 8.2.2: Female population 15 years and older and total number of children dead, province

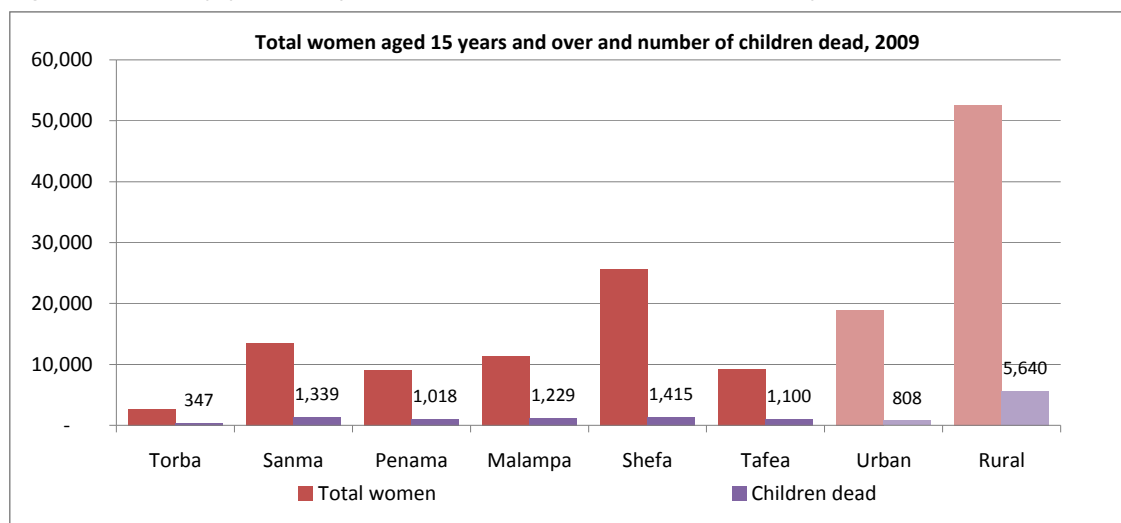

Figure 9.1: Number of private households in 1999 and 2009 by province

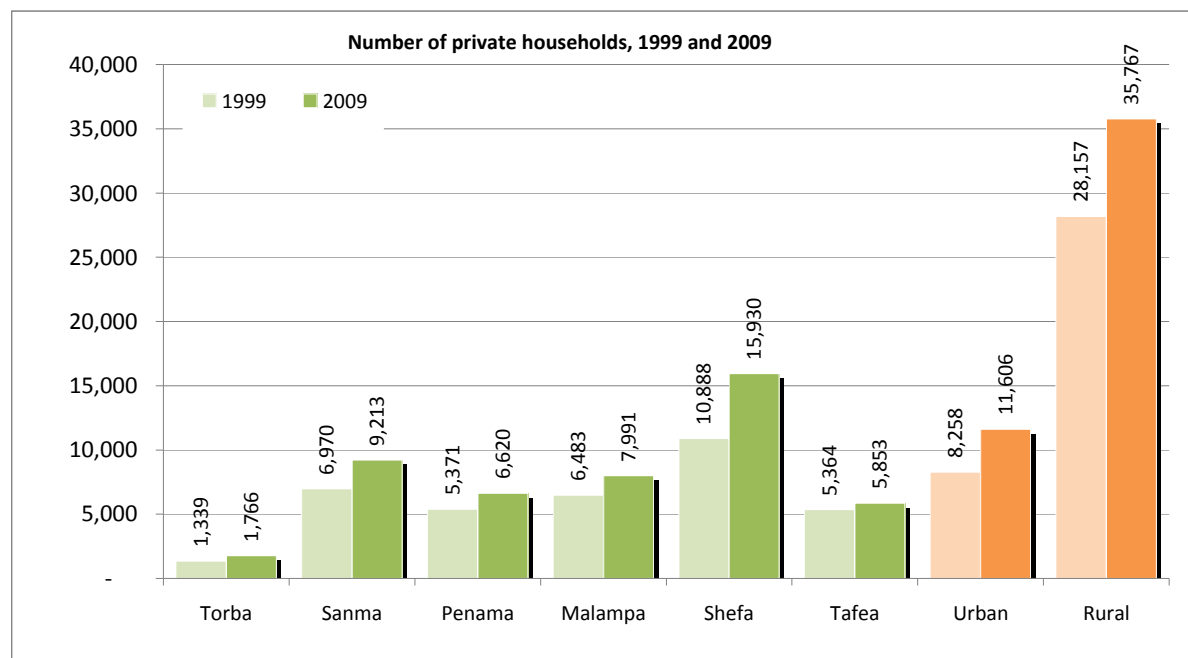

Figure 9.2: Number of private households and household size

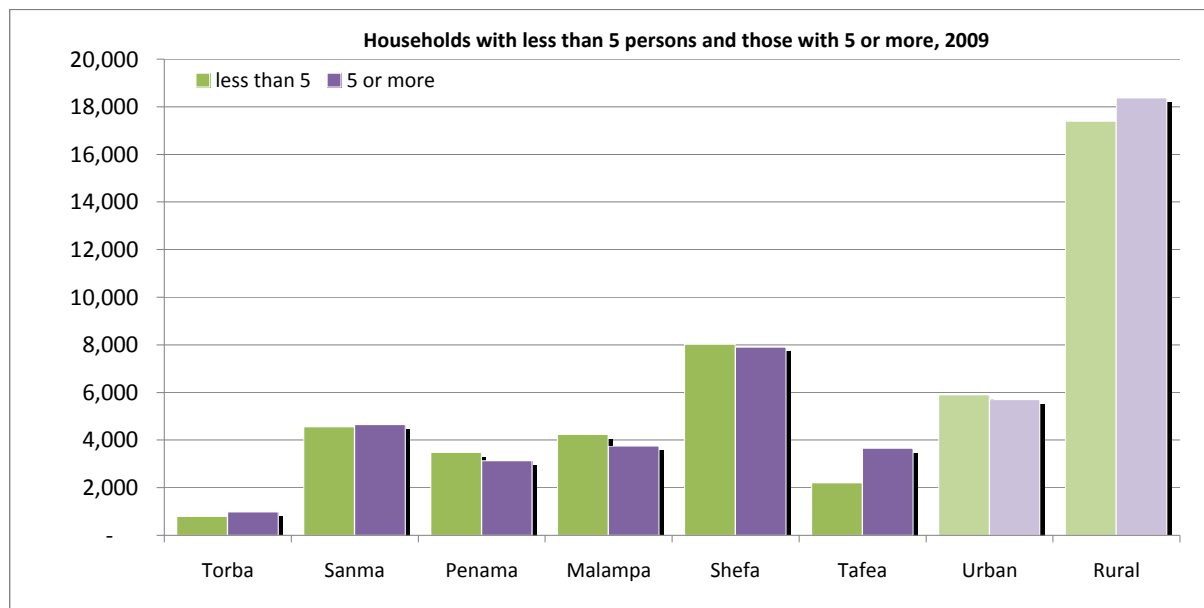

Figure 9.3: Main language spoken in private households by province and urban-rural residence

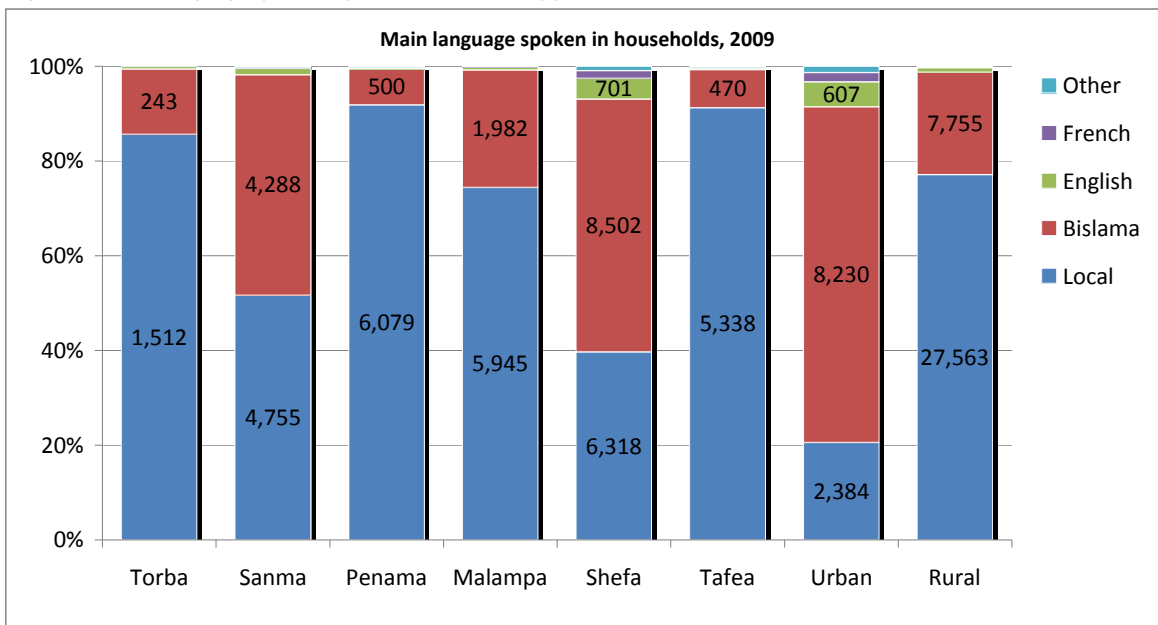

Figure 9.4: Number of private households by number of rooms, urban-rural residence

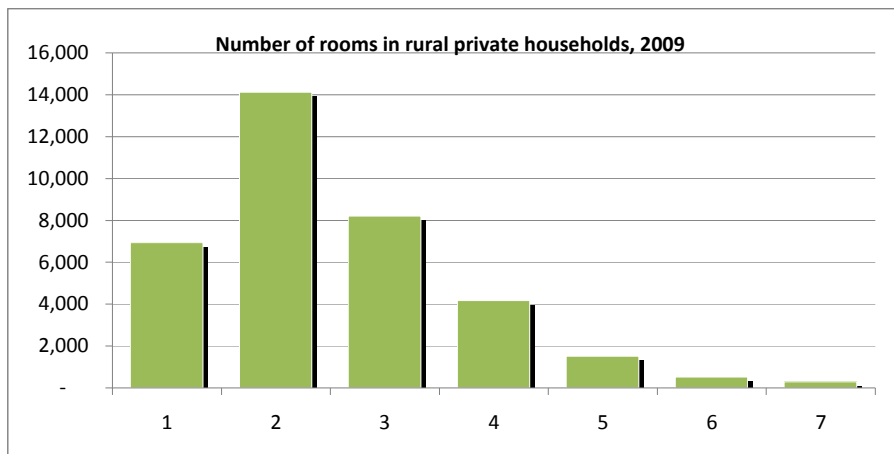
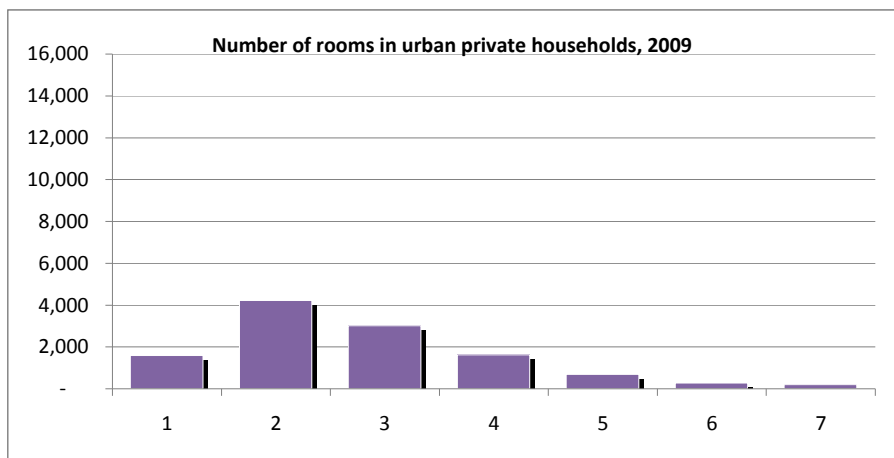

Figure 9.5: Number of private households by main source of drinking water, urban-rural residence

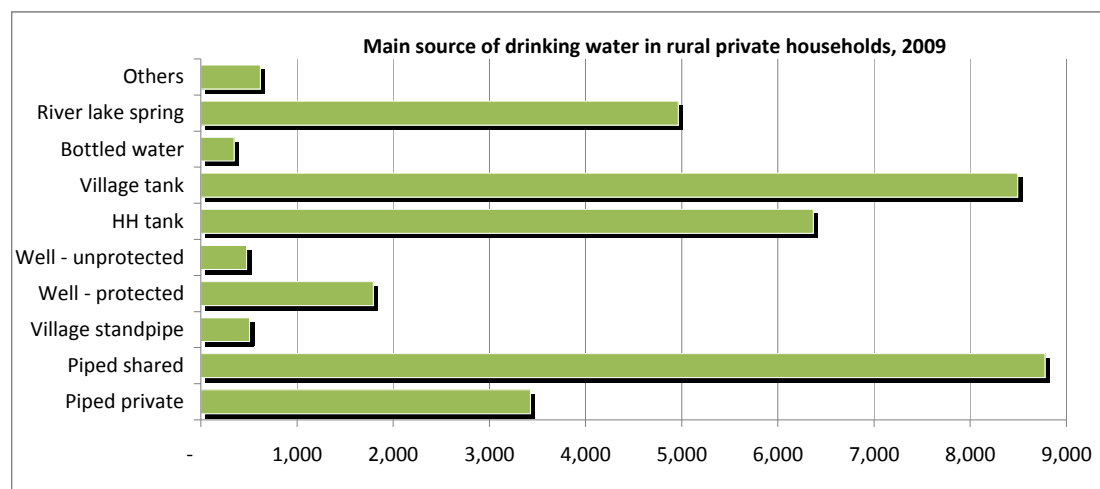
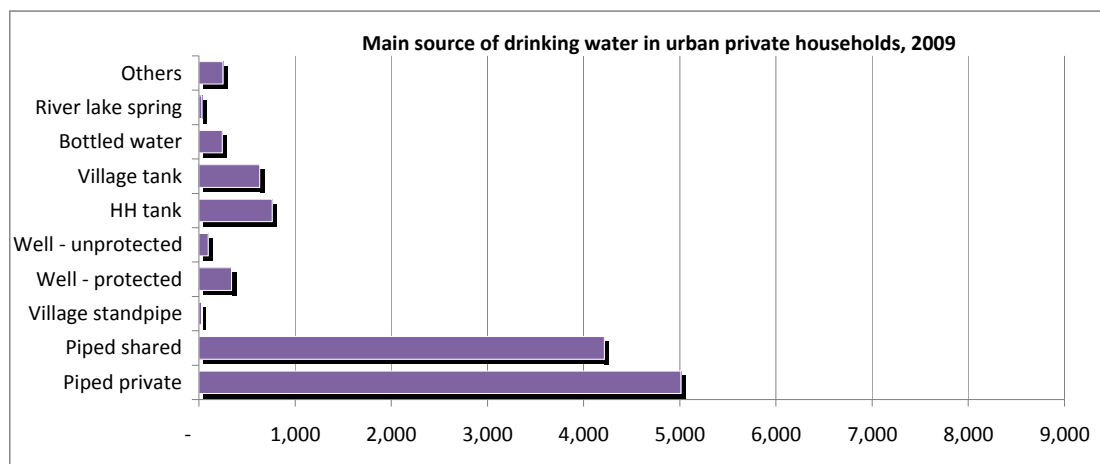

Figure 9.6: Number of private households by main source of washing water, urban-rural residence

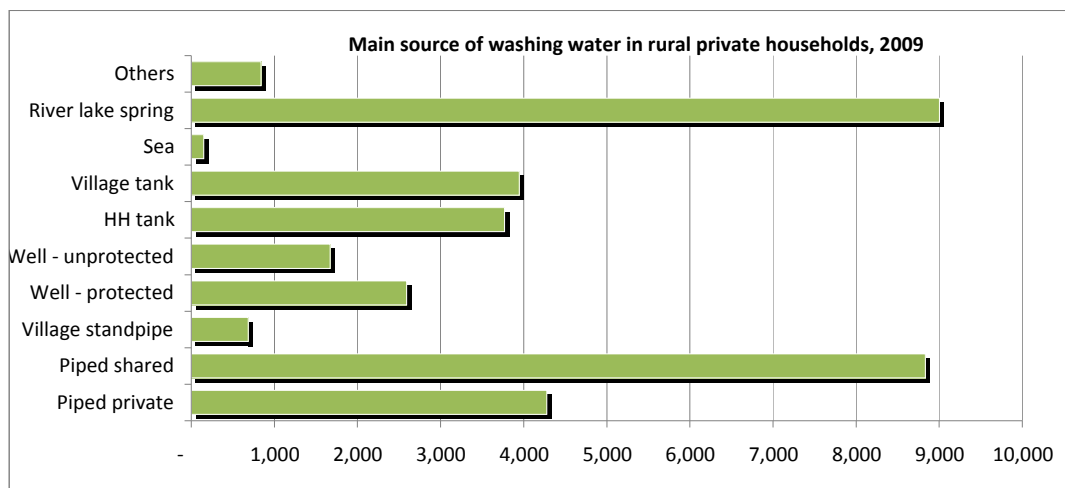
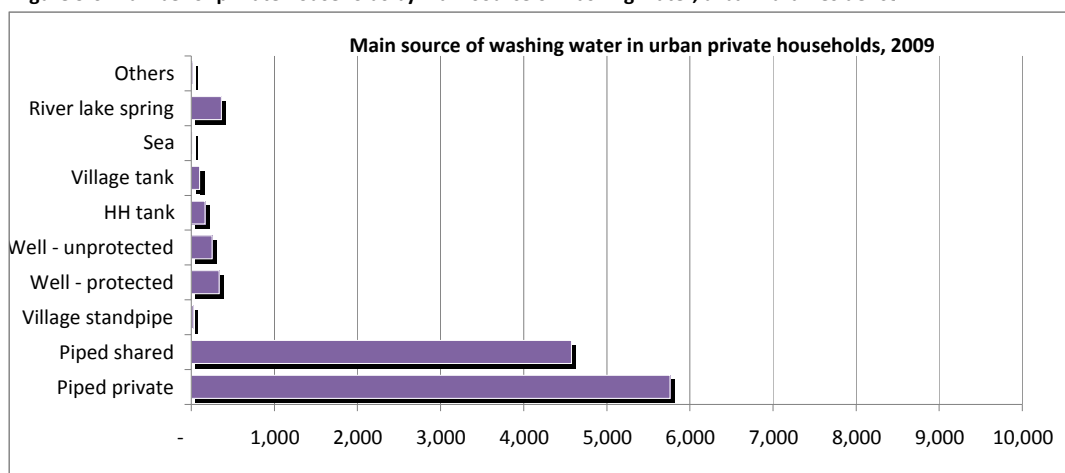

Figure 9.7: Number of private households by main toilet facility, urban-rural residence

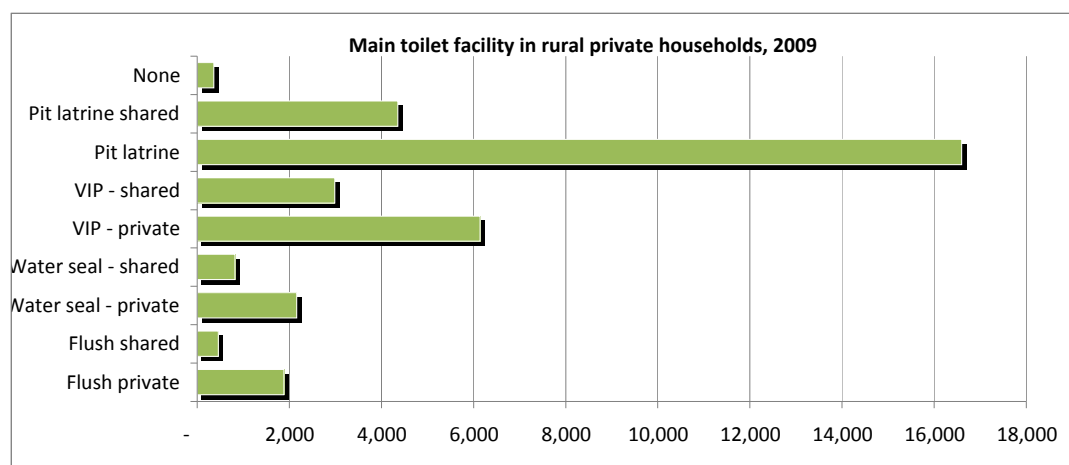
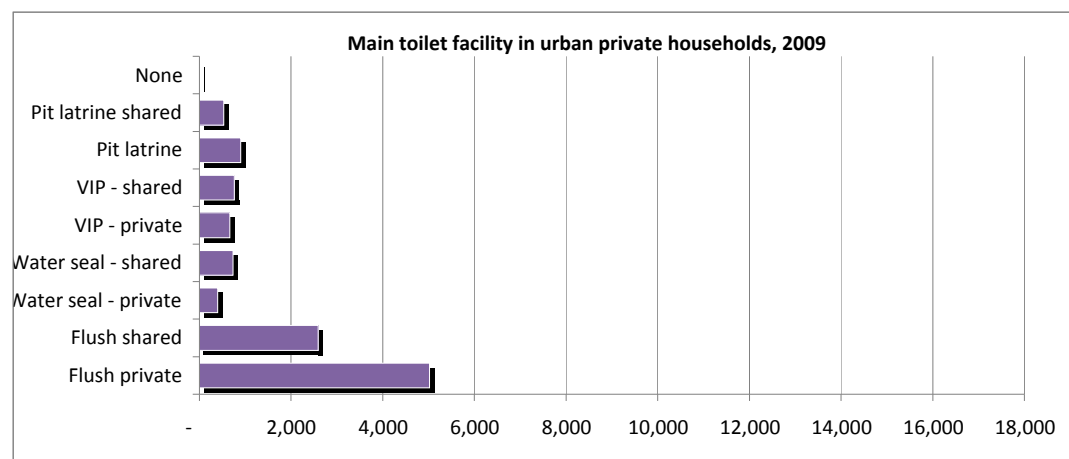

Figure 9.8: Number of private households by main form of household rubbish disposal, urban-rural residence

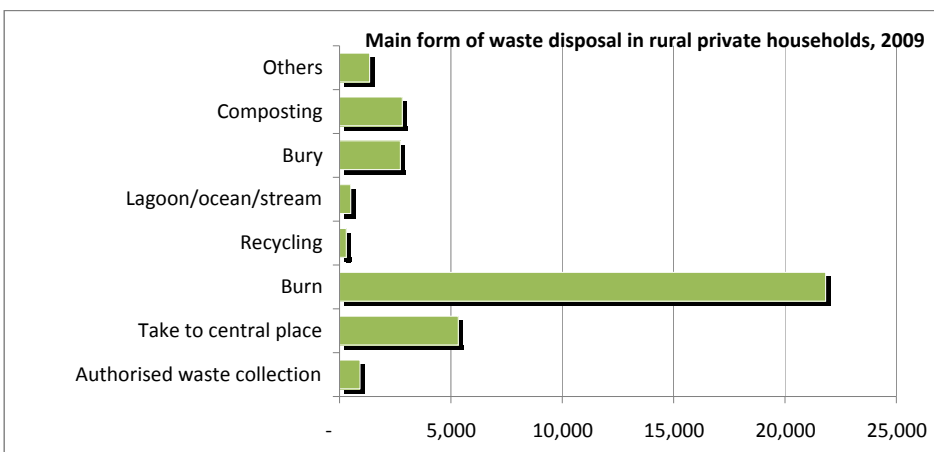
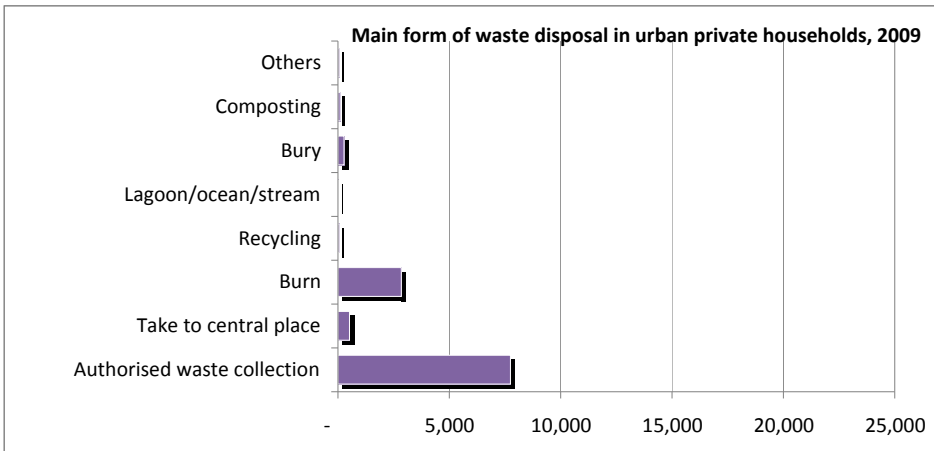

Figure 9.9: Number of private households by main source of lighting, urban-rural residence

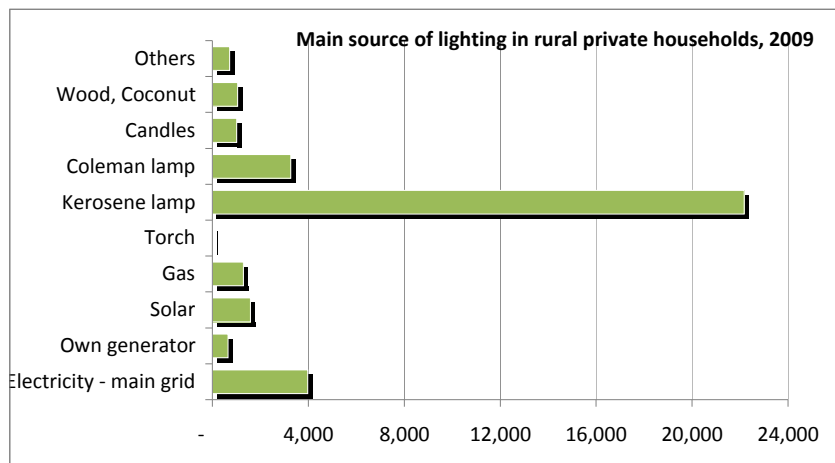
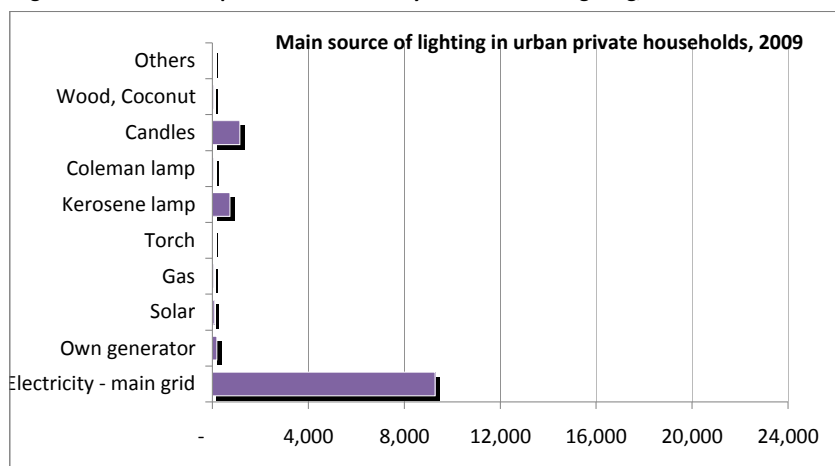

Figure 9.10: Number of private households by main source of cooking energy, urban-rural residence

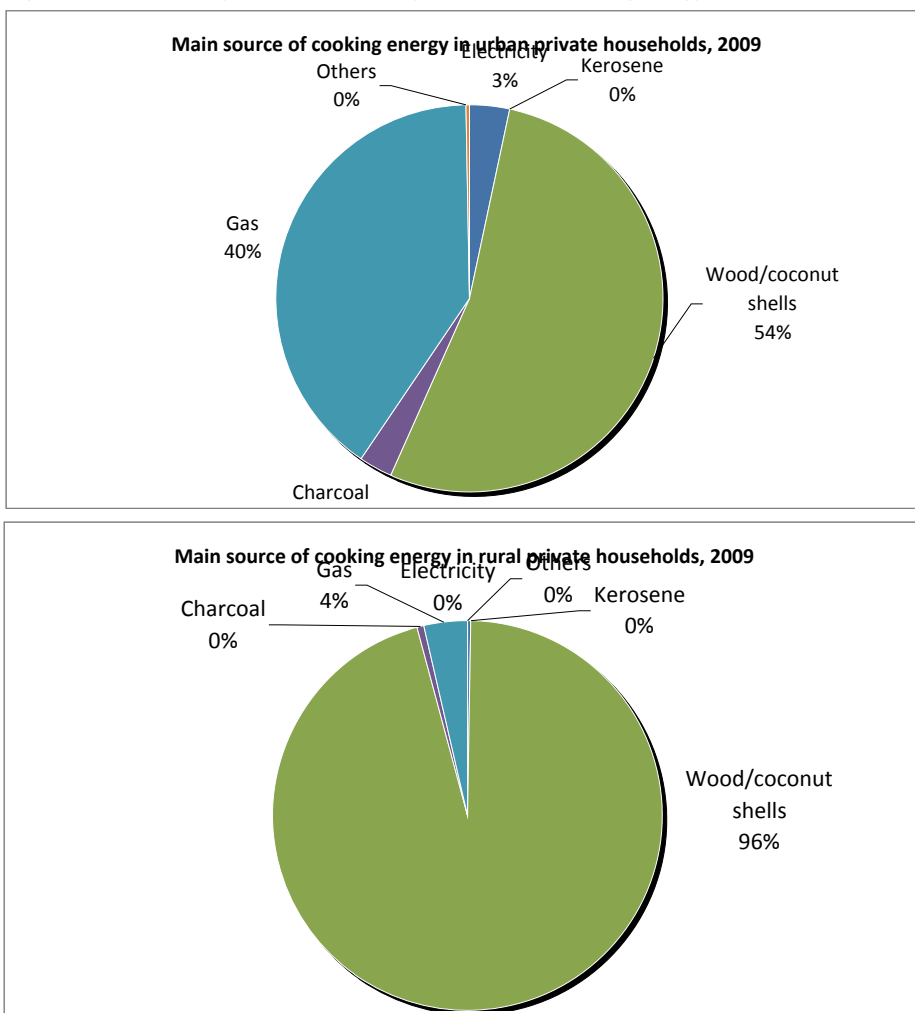

Figure 9.11: Number of private households by housing tenure, urban-rural residence

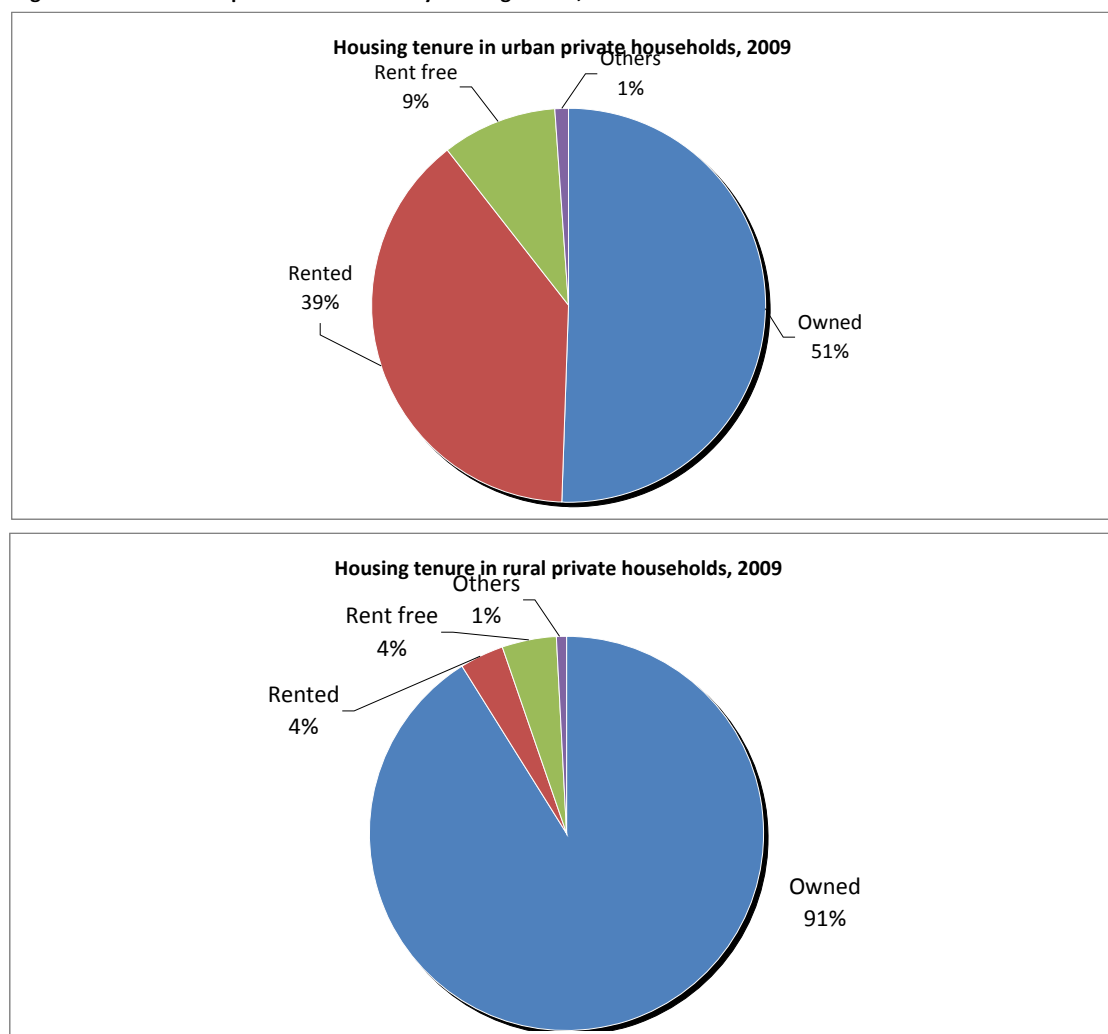

Figure 9.12: Number of privately owned houses by age of building, urban-rural residence

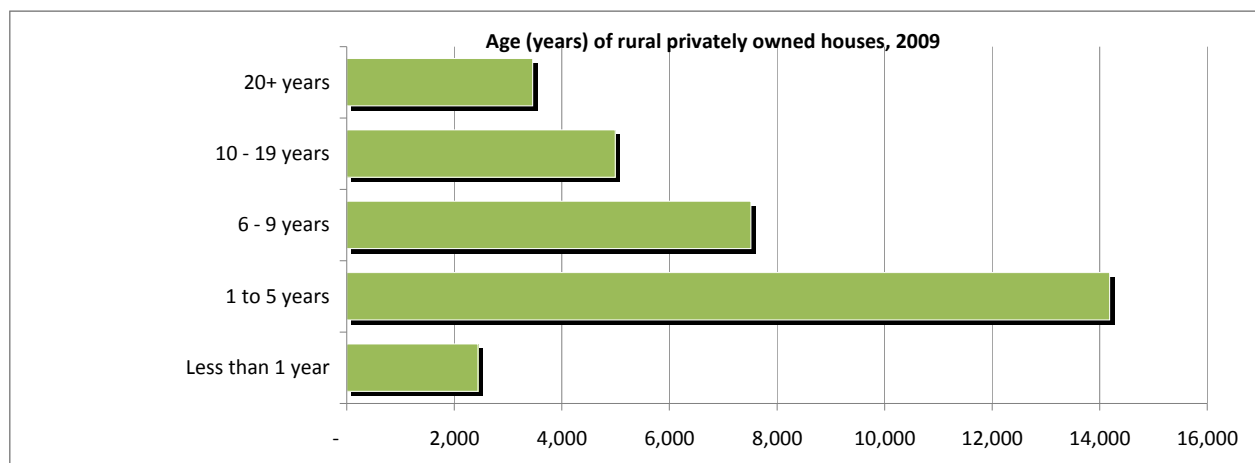
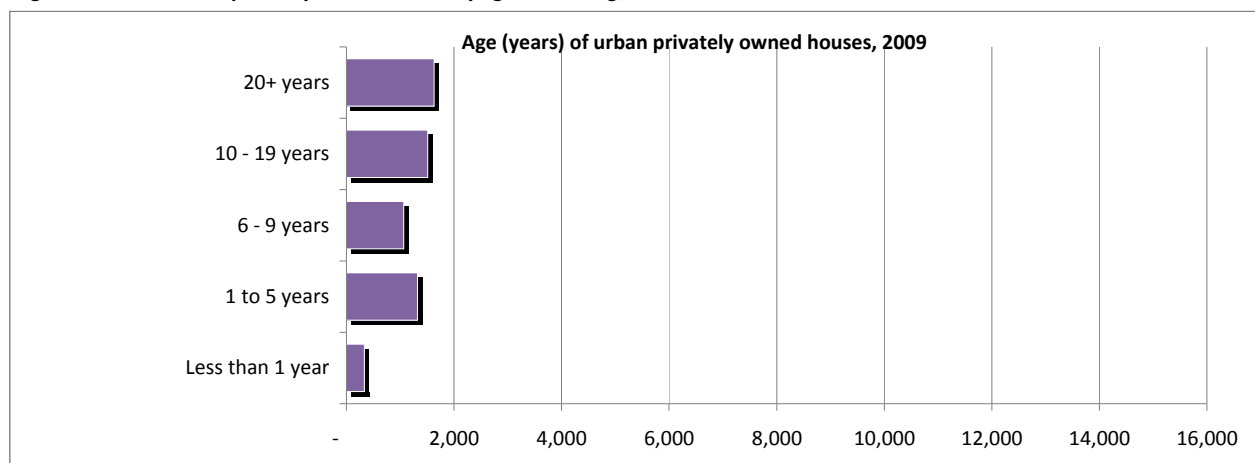

Figure 9.13: Number of privately owned houses by land tenure, urban-rural residence

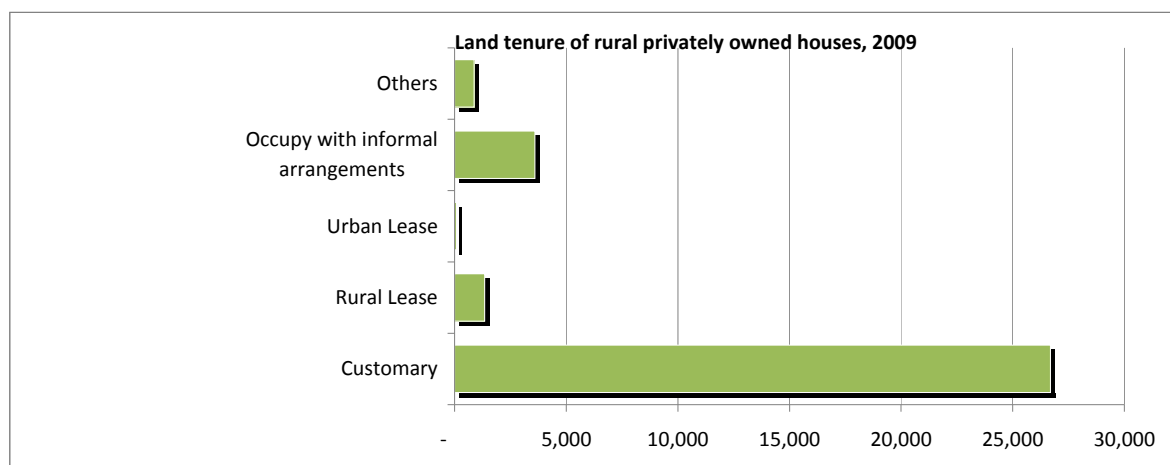
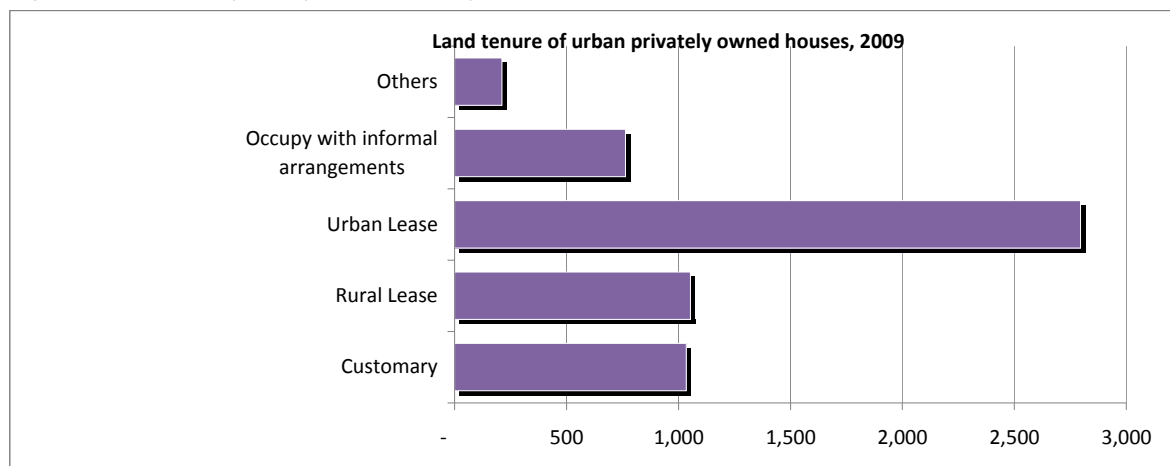

Figure 9.14: Percent of private households with and without insecticide treated bednets, province and urban-rural residence

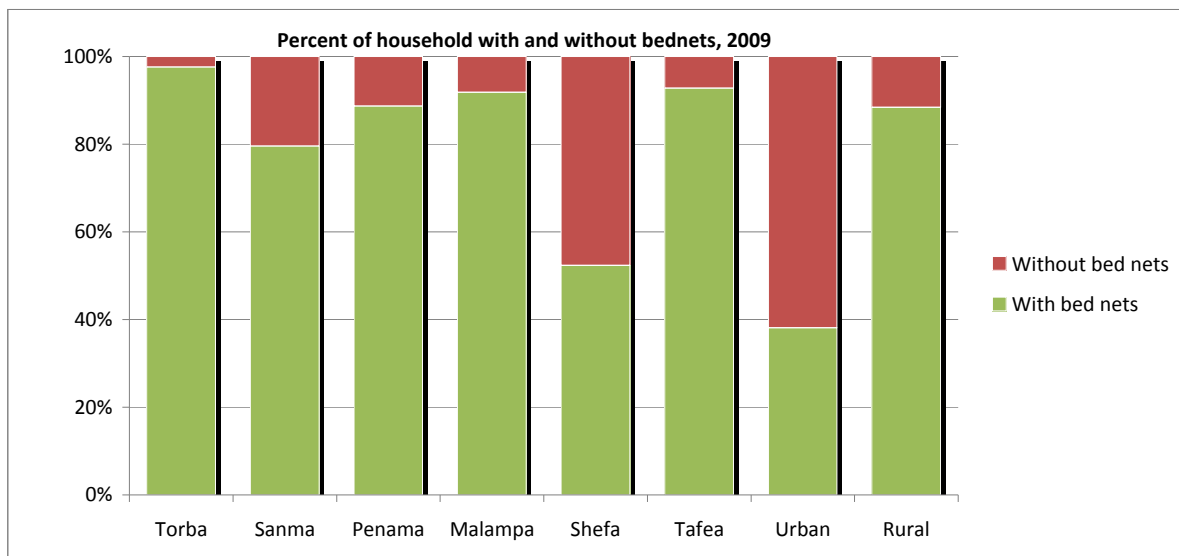

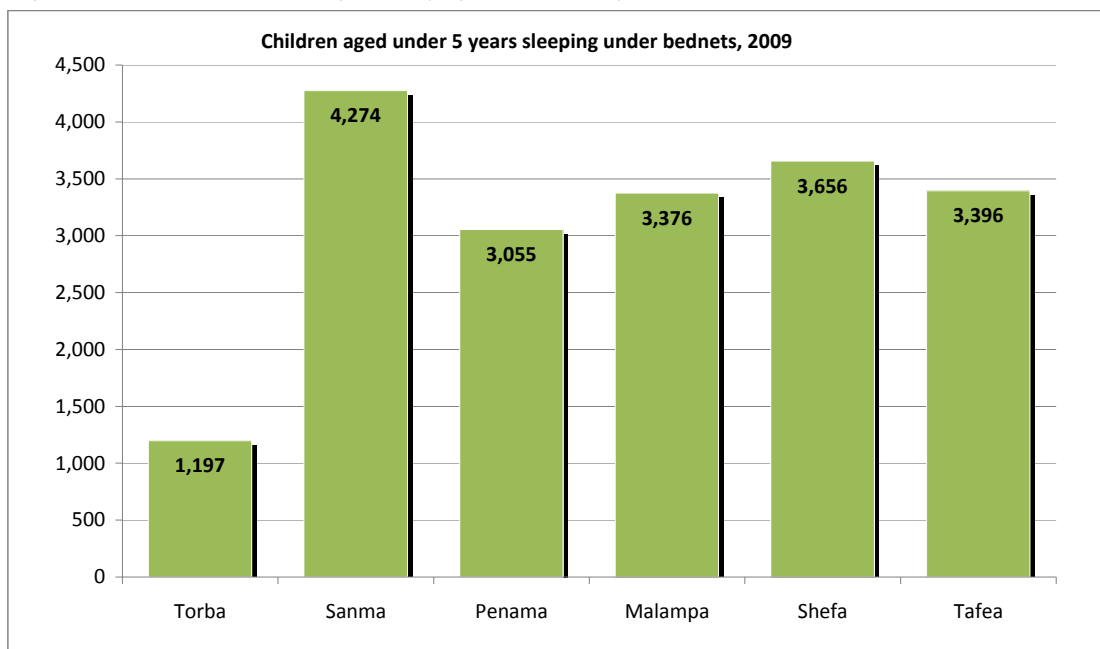
Figure 9.15: Number of children <5 years sleeping under bednets, province

Figure 9.16: Number of private households which had livestock by province

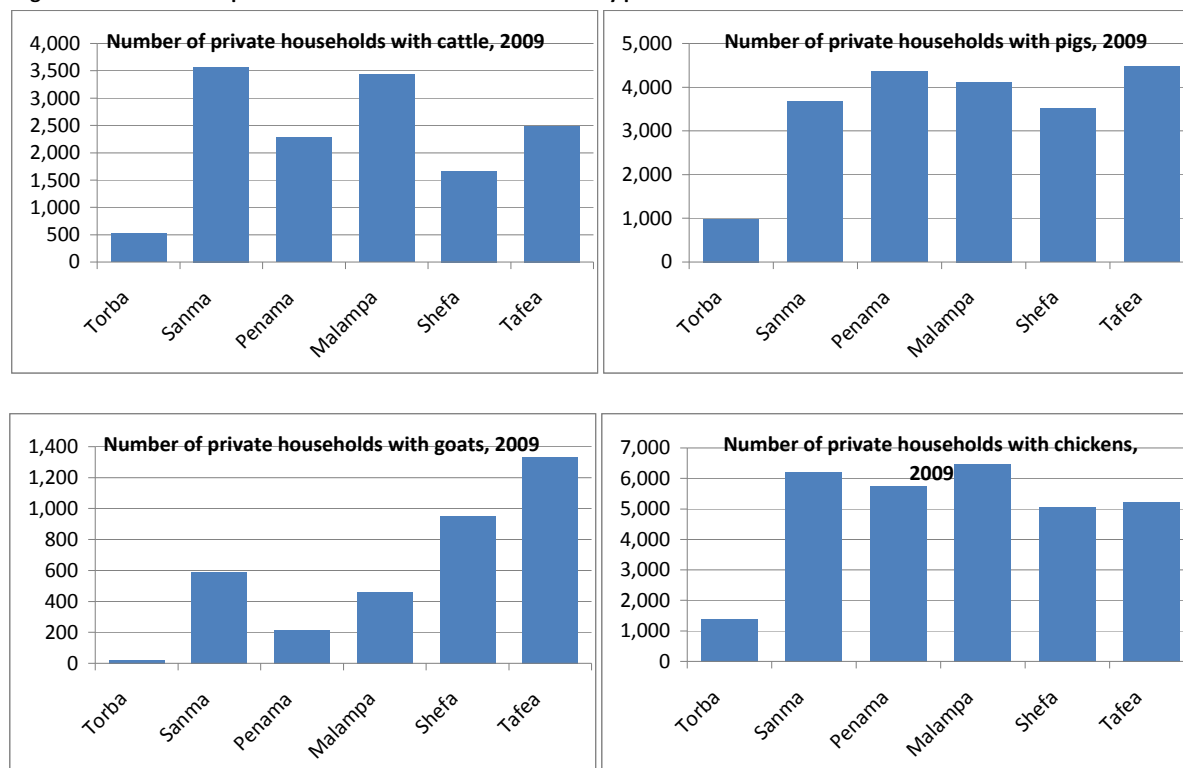

Figure 9.17: Total number of livestock owned by private households by province

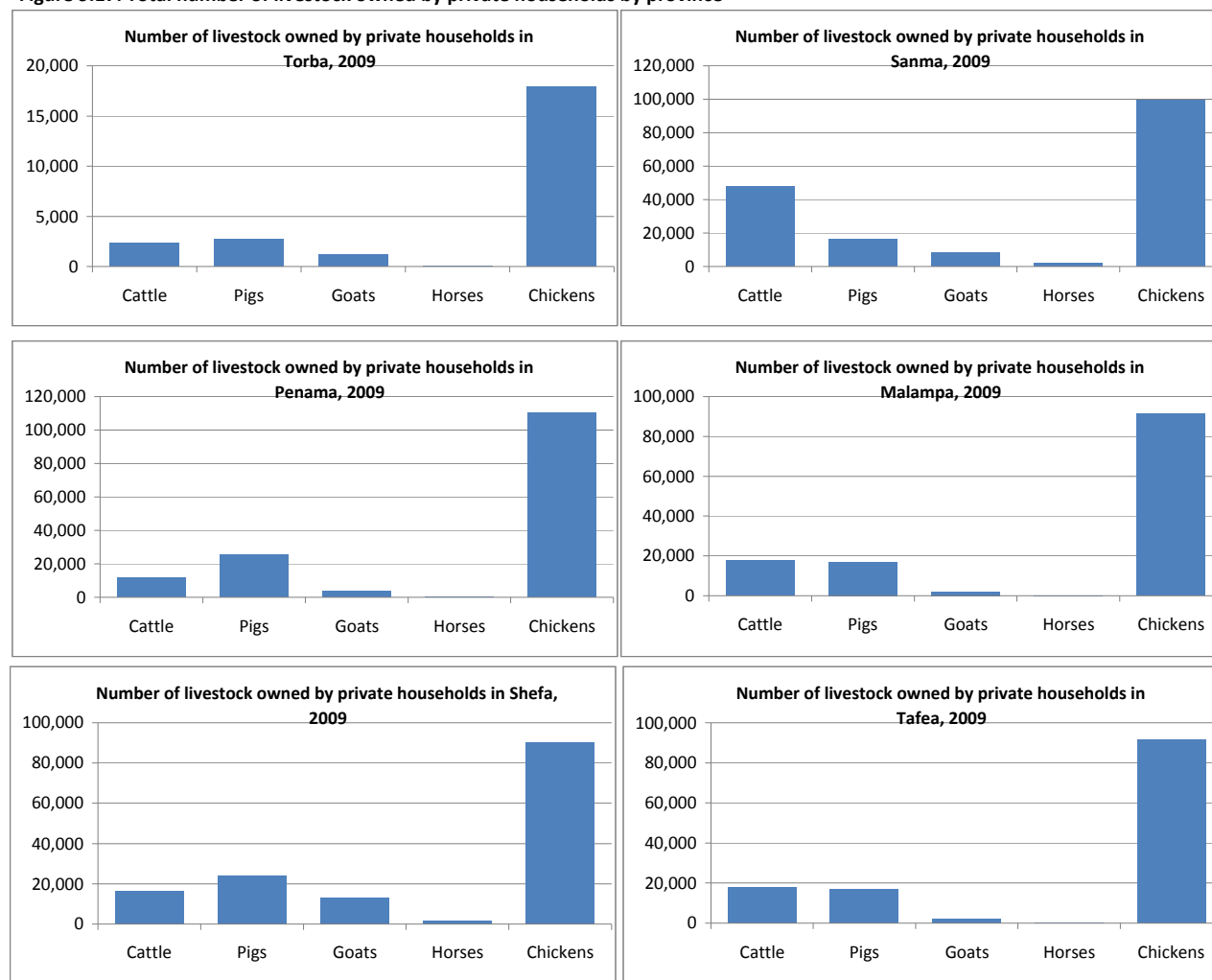

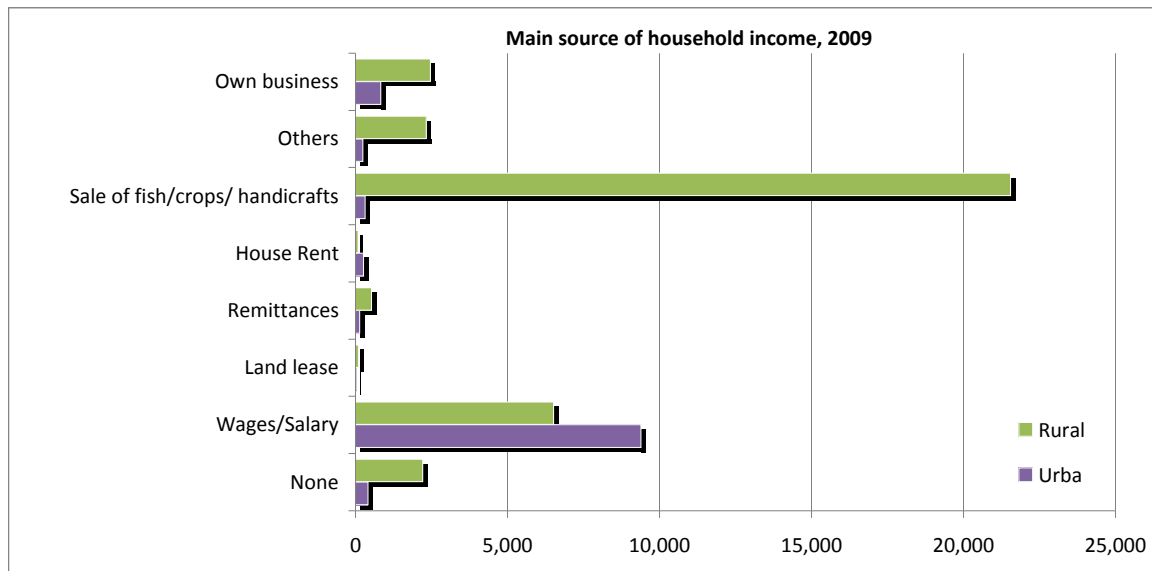

Part 2: Census 2009 Background

1.1. Introduction

The Census is the official count of population, dwellings and households in Vanuatu and it provides a 'snapshot' of the country at one specific point in time: midnight 16th November 2009. The Census in Vanuatu has been taken at the national level every 10 years since 1979.

The Census provides a unique source of detailed demographic, social and economic information about the whole population of Vanuatu. This information is used for policy making and planning, monitoring and evaluation, research and other decision making. There are many users of statistics from the Census including government agencies like the Ministry of Finance and Economic Management for resource allocation, the Ministry of Education and Youth Development and Training for the population in each of the school catchment areas as well as population projections for the school population of the future, the Ministry of Health uses the population, fertility and household amenity information for a number of purposes in its planning and decision making as well as monitoring and evaluation. Students are avid users of Census data for the many research projects they undertake. The Census provides information for local government (Province, Area Council) in its activities as well as numerous private researchers and their subjects of interest. The Census data is also available in Geographic Information System output format which is used for agricultural land use planning when used in conjunction with other map layers such as type of topsoil, and patterns of population distribution used for transport and other infrastructure planning.

1.1.1. A brief history of Census taking in Vanuatu

In Vanuatu the Census has taken place every 10 years since 1979. Unlike many other Pacific countries, Vanuatu does not have a long history of census taking. The first National Population Census took place in 1967, followed by another in 1979. The first official population Census in 1967 enumerated over 70,000 New Hebrideans (today referred to as Ni-Vanuatu) and 5,745 other people of different ethnic groups.

The second national population census was in 1979, a year before the condominium's independence. Two other national censuses have been conducted since the country's independence in 1980. The first census after independence took place on the 16th of May 1989 with the theme "The First National Population Census of Vanuatu conducted by Ni-Vanuatu". This was followed 10 years later by the 1999 Census. In 1999 the Census design was completed with comparability with previous census statistics a high priority, along with consideration of what was to become the first Standard Pacific Model Census Questionnaire.

In addition to the national Census two urban censuses have been carried out. The first was in 1965 and the most recent in 1986. There have also been three National Agricultural censuses conducted, the first was in 1983, followed by 1993 and the most recent was in 2007.

The skills acquired during the 1989 and 1999 Censuses gave the VNSO the confidence to conduct the 2009 Census using very limited amount of external technical assistance. The 1999 Census was seen as the first Census conducted by solely locals. This self reliance and technical capacity was again used for the 2009 Census.

1.2. Administrative framework

1.2.1. Government Approval

The Census “project document” was submitted to the Development Committee of Officials (DCO) in June, 2008 and approved by the Council of Ministers (CoM) later in the month on the June 23. This is standard procedure for large scale national projects such as the Census.

1.2.2. National Census Steering Committee

The National Census Steering Committee (NCSC) was set-up in 2008 to oversee the overall national census operation under the chairmanship of the Director General of Finance and Economic Management. The Minister of Finance and Economic Management, following recommendations from the Census Project management appointed the following people as members of the steering committee:

The NCSC met as required, usually monthly, during the Census planning, data collection and processing process. The first paper presented to the NCSC emphasised the importance of the national Census and its operational plan and budget. The Census operational plan was approved by the NCSC for the national project to proceed with its activities. The tentative Census work plan and key milestone dates were likewise submitted to, and approved by, the NCSC. The NCSC noted that there were critical paths with more than one activity taking place at the same time and accepted the work plan and approved for the Census operation to begin.

1.2.3. Support

The 2009 Census Project utilised existing government resources as part of the government’s financial contributions for the establishment of project. All government Director Generals and Directors were requested to provide their support for the Census as well as key institutions such as the Malvatumauri National Council of Chiefs including Chiefs, church leaders and other organisations including Non-Government Organisations and development partners. From June 2008 the Census Project was actively promoted through government committees (for example the Development Committee of Officials comprising Director Generals of all ministries). Donor partners were able to provide financial and technical assistance support.

Discussions began early in the project with the Ministry of Education. The Ministry of Education agreed to provide the services of Zone Curriculum Advisors (ZCAs) to act as trainers for the Census training and then to act as Census Managers during the enumeration. This was included in the ZCA work plans for 2009.

The Census Project Manager made consultations with the Presidents, Secretary Generals and their staff at the six provincial council head quarters, as well as other government ministries represented in the provinces. Meetings and discussions were also held with key community leaders and decision makers to inform them about the Census, obtain their feedback on Census information which would be useful to them as well as outlining the operation plan and requesting their support for the 2009 Census. A visit was also made to the two mayors of the municipalities of Luganville and Port Vila. Other important institutions consulted included Vanuatu Christian Council (VCC), the Malvatumauri National Council of Chiefs, the Vanuatu Society for Disabled People, the Vanuatu Women's Centre, Youth Challenge and other community groups to ensure their support for the Census. Weekly announcements were broadcast on national radio and television to gain general public support for the national Census operation through providing information about the Census and activities of interest to the general public.

1.2.4. Census Theme

As was the two previous censuses, the 2009 Census also had a theme which was “*Vanuatu Hemi Kaontem Yu*”. The 2009 Census also had a logo, shown in Figure 1.

1.2.5. Census timing

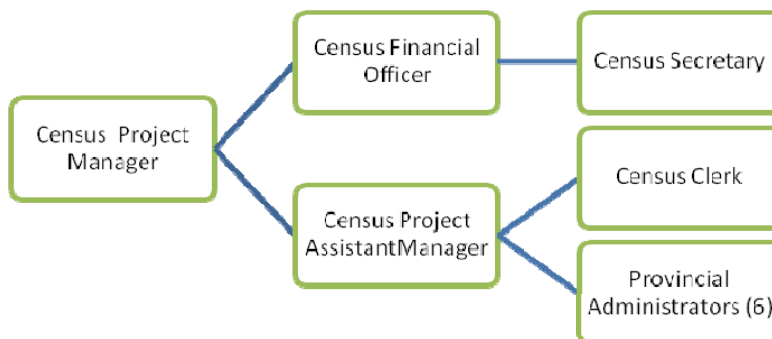
The selection of the time of year when the Census will be taken is of critical importance. The most important factor is to select a period in which the Census is likely to be most successful. This depends on a number of factors, the main one being the selection of a date which represents a relatively ‘normal’ period in that there are no major special events happening such as elections, religious conferences or similar large gathering where almost all people will be able to be interviewed at their place of usual residence.

The first national Census after independence of the country was held on the 16th May 1989. The 1999 Census date was moved to 16th November, six months later, to allow school teachers to act as trainers and enumerators and the same date was used for the 2009 Census to maintain the exact 10 year census interval.

1.2.6. Census Project Organisation

A member of the VNSO staff was appointed to the Census Project Manager position in August 2008 on secondment basis for a period of two years.

The Census Project office was established in August 2008 soon after the appointment of the Census Manager and Census Project staff members were subsequently appointed with a structure as shown below.



1.2.7. Census publicity

Publicity was vital in ensuring the success of the 2009 Census. Awareness booklets and Census posters were printed in Bislama and distributed throughout the country. Advertisements were scripted and aired on Radio Vanuatu and Television in the months leading up to the Census.

T-shirts were also printed and distributed to community leaders. Enumerators and supervisors were also given t-shirts to wear whilst they were undertaking fieldwork which clearly identified them as a Census employee.

The six Provincial Administrators¹ played important roles in the publicity campaign in their respective areas. They delivered public speeches, distributed Census posters and public notices, “Census question and answer brochures” to their local communities and schools.

The chiefs of Vanuatu and church leaders also played an important part in the Census publicity by providing information about the Census and the key dates at both informal and formal meetings throughout the country.

The Census Project team organised and coordinated the Census publicity and awareness campaign through the Vanuatu Broadcasting and Television Co-operation (VBTC) for both radio and television as well as with privately owned and operated FM radio station. The publicity was centred on the theme “*Vanuatu Hemi Kaontem Yu*” (in English “Vanuatu is counting on you”).

The publicity consisted of the following:

- Radio talkback shows, with the Census Project Manager responding to questions from the show host and the general public which are followed by a relatively large audience.
- More formal scripted television and radio interviews with the Government Statistician (Acting) and the Census Project Manager.
- A lottery using the unique household reference number on the household sticker on every household where one household in every province won Vt 20,000
- Special radio and TV clips on the Census
- A Census string band song competition
- Census posters

¹ Three Provincial Administrators were recruited under the Census project; in two provinces VNSO staff posted in the Province were seconded to the Census project and in the capitol province Census Project staff coordinated activities within the province.

- Census calendar
- Census t-shirts
- Census rubber (eraser)
- Census brochures
- Census public notices
- The VNSO letterhead and office contact information contained the Census theme and date
- Email signatures on all outgoing email from VNSO staff contained Census theme and date
- Census street banners with the theme and date

The publicity programmed planning started in 2008 with information disseminated about both the pre-Census household listing and actual field enumeration. Publicity activities continued up to the end of the enumeration period in December 2009. A Census song was composed as part of the string band competition for the annual Independence anniversary celebrations in Port Vila and Luganville.

A countdown toward the Census night was also placed on the VNSO internet website. During the weeks leading to Census night, Census stickers were distributed with a large size for vehicles as well as a smaller one. The A3 size vehicle stickers were placed on VNSO vehicles as well as other government vehicles and some privately owned ones. The banners were hung prominently across the main streets in Port Vila, Santo, Lenakel and Lakatoro. Both the sticker and banner had the message, “16 Novemba 2009..... *Yu stap wea?*” (in English “16 November 2009 ... where will you be?”).

Most of the different forms of publicity were aimed at the public at large with some targeting specific groups such as schools, youth and community leaders with the objective of ensuring that most people in the country would have heard about the Census. The publicity campaign made the work of the interviewers conducting the household listing and Census enumeration easier as many people understood the importance of the Census and were expecting the Census interviewers at their house during the period specified. The Census brochure, posters and public notices were very effective for Census publicity and awareness. The brochure was produced in Bislama and answered most commonly asked questions about the Census.

1.3. Census preparations

1.3.1. Census information technology

For the 2009 Census the VNSO took part in two regional initiatives: one involving the use of GPS (Global Positioning System) technology to map individual households and the second to improve the efficiency of data entry by using scanning software to create the Census database. The use of scanning meant that the questionnaire had to be designed and formatted to meet scanning requirements with specific ‘tags’ and ‘active areas’ for the scanning software to use to translate the scanned question answers into the correct data fields in the database.

1.3.2. Questionnaire development

The 2009 Census questionnaire was designed to ensure consistency with the 1999 Census statistical information while meeting regional standards for ‘model’ questionnaire and meeting international statistical requirements.

The Census Pre-test survey was conducted in four locations during November 2008, precisely a year before the actual Census date. For the urban areas, two areas in Port Vila were selected as being representative: Independence Park area and Seaside areas. The area known as Blacksands on the

outskirts of Port Vila and Banban in Luganville were selected as the developing areas representing peri-urban areas, and for the rural areas, Motalava island in Torba province was selected for inclusion in the Pre-test. The Pre-test provided the opportunity to test both the questionnaires in terms of question content and order of questions and the Census data processing hardware and software.

The Pre-test included a number of 'new' questions compared to that used in 1999. Based on submissions by users and follow-up discussions about their information needs, questions on disability, mortality, literacy, the main source of household income, if a person had worked overseas in the last 12 months, the use of mobile phones, and small businesses operated by households were tested and refined.

Based on lessons learnt from the Pre-test, other household surveys and the 1999 Census forms, in 2009 one Census form was used for most households. One A3 sized sheet included the household questions and the questions for all persons living in the household (printed double sided). Extra A3 sized sheets were available for households with more than six persons present on Census night. This was to avoid a common problem of the past where if separate forms or sheets of paper were used some would invariably go missing or get incorrectly placed with those of another household.

The final questionnaires were produced in English, with 'overlay' sheets for the two other official languages (French and Bislama). There were two main sections in the form, the household section and the personal section. The questionnaire was designed to be completed by an interviewer (also known as an enumerator), and was printed using off-set printing to maintain print quality for scanning purposes.

1.3.3. Household listing

The household listing stage of the Census is in general terms provides the basis of the estimates for workload, materials required and logistical arrangements for the actual Census field enumeration. During the household listing every household, institutions or non private household, was counted as well as the usual number of people who live there and its location using handheld GPS units. The main dwelling occupied by the household was marked with a sticker containing the unique household reference number. This reference number along with the GPS location of the household was used during the Census enumeration to locate all of the households in Vanuatu. The household listing is also used to identify the geographic survey units, called Enumeration Areas, which required dividing into smaller units because they were too large for one enumerator to manage during the actual Census enumeration.

The household listing commenced in May 2009, six months prior to the Census proper. The listing captured the GPS coordinates of each household, at the same time collecting basic information such as the name of household head and the number of males and females present in the household. Non-private households (or institutions) like hotels, motels, boarding houses, hostels, hospitals, prisons etc, were also included in the listing with the name of the institution and the number of inhabitants was used to estimate the number of Census forms required. The household listing form was designed to meet the technical scanning requirements and was completed in the field by the household lister.

The household listing made use of 60 GPS units with 150 interviewers and 15 supervisors. The listing exercise took four months to complete working from one province to another due to the number of GPS units available. Because of the limited number of GPS units available it was not possible to get

full geographic coverage of Vanuatu. However the areas not covered did not contain a significant proportion of the population, with an estimated 1% of population in these remote locations; with reliable estimates of the number of households and population provided made by leaders for these areas. Subsequently during the Census interviews GPS locations were captured for these remote communities.

During the listing the interviewers placed a sticker on each dwelling and non private dwelling. The sticker was used to identify and number each and every household and institution. The sticker had four main components: the Census logo, the Census date, a message regarding the Census lottery and the unique number of each household or non private dwelling. The stickers had two sections – the larger part with the logo etc which was affixed over the main door or point of entry to the household (or institution) and a peel-off portion with a duplicate of the unique household number which was attached to the listing form.

Approximately 55,000 stickers were printed and distributed. The stickers placed above the main door or point of entry were expected to stay until December when the lottery draw was made. The idea of the lottery was to encourage household members not to remove the sticker which contained the household identification information needed by the Census interviewer. The Census enumeration was made based on the sticker identification numbers and the name of the household head collected during the household listing.

1.3.4. Train the trainer training

The final preparations for the Census enumeration included training the people who would be training the Census interviewers and who would then be Census Managers in the provinces. The approval was given by the Ministry of Education for the Census Project to utilise the ZCAs as trainers and Area Managers. ZCAs basically perform administration roles for the schools in their areas and the Ministry of Education released them to assist the Census provincial officers and VNSO staff to conduct train the interviewers. The ZCAs, Provincial Census Officers and other VNSO staff went through a two week 'train the trainer' course in Port Vila, and then travelled to the pre-selected seven different training sites for Census interviewer training. In all there were 60 trainers, 40 of whom were ZCAs and the rest were VNSO staff from Port Vila and the Provincial Census Officers. Part of the train the trainers programme involved two days conducting 'test' interviews in Mangaliliu village, in the north of Efate. The training focused on the:

- Purpose of Census
- Trainer's responsibilities
- Training procedures
- How to complete each Census question (including the codes and classifications used)
- How each question should be answered to avoid errors during scanning
- Questionnaire checks to be completed in the field
- Administrative procedures for issuing and receipting questionnaires and the completion of the Interviewers Field Book.

1.4. Census enumeration

Census enumerator training was conducted during the two week period immediately prior to the 16th of November. At the conclusion of training enumerators and supervisors travelled from the training site directly to their enumeration areas. At the conclusion of the formal training one day was spent allocating the Enumeration Areas to each supervisor and the enumerators in his or her team

and distributing Census questionnaires, the fieldbooks, other administrative forms and stationery etc.



The Census enumeration involved the recruitment of 575 enumerators and 115 supervisors, recruited by the national VNSO office, who worked under the direction of Area Managers. At the end of the enumerator training, the ZCAs assumed their roles as Area Managers in their respective working zones. The basic channel of reporting is shown above with each level having different responsibilities and checks to be completed for data quality assurance and monitoring.

The period of field enumeration began on 16th November 2009 and was completed in most areas of the country within two weeks. In areas that were particularly difficult to reach, or where transport was difficult to arrange and in some cases not available at all, the enumeration took longer.

A Post Enumeration Survey (PES) planned for two weeks after the completion enumeration did not eventuate as some areas were still conducting interviews and the timing was inconvenient because of the festive season (Christmas and New Year), and there is a lot people moving between communities so the objective of the PES to re-count household members to verify Census counts would be difficult to achieve.

1.5. Census data processing

Census data processing involved three main steps: questionnaire scanning, checking the scanned data and coding the written responses to 'open ended' questions.

Before the forms were scanned, the process of coding of responses for open ended questions such as that for education, occupation, and main activity of employer or business (often called 'industry'). These responses are coded with classifications according to international standards such as the International Standard Classification of Occupation (ISCO) and the International Standard Classification of Industry (ISIC).

In order to obtain accurate statistics from household based surveys such as the Census, the data must be as free as possible from errors and inconsistencies. Statistics derived from 'dirty data' (that is, data which contains errors) may produce an inaccurate profile of the country or geographic area. Therefore, before any final Census databases were created and tabulation programs run, the data was checked for errors and edited so that important data items (that is, the answers to key Census questions) were valid and consistent.

Checking large quantities of data and correcting errors is a time-consuming task and requires attention to detail. Computer editing reduces both time and the possibility of further human error. In a computerised edit, the validity of an entry is checked by examining it to see if it has an acceptable value. The value of the entry can also be checked against answers to related questions for consistency. The use of computers does not solve all editing problems. Decisions about actual editing and acceptable values still must be made.

Three main types of editing were completed for the 2009 Census. The first involved ensuring that the number of questionnaires completed by the Census enumerator agreed with the number of questionnaires scanned into the Census database and matched the household listing counts. The

second involved running range and consistency checks against questions to make sure valid codes were in the database. A range check ensures that a valid response for a question has been entered, for example a date of birth of 32/13/1978 would fail two range checks. A consistency check compares the results to two or more different questions or questionnaires for consistency. For example if a person's place of birth was a location in Vanuatu and their ethnicity was ni-Vanuatu only then their response to the citizenship question had to be that they were a Vanuatu citizen by birth. These consistency checks also generated (or imputed) responses to questions if the respondent had not answered a question. For example if a person said that they were the spouse of the household head in the 'relationship to the household head' question but did not give an answer to the marital status question, a response of 'legally married' would have been imputed as their marital status. Other imputation assumed that if a 'yes/no' question had been left blank then the answer was no.

Data entry (scanning), coding and editing began in January 2010, with scanning of all forms taking about 10 working days and final editing completed on August 2010; with some further final checking done as outliers were identified during the preparation of outputs. This was because integrity checks continued as outliers were found when producing statistical tabulations and data was checked until this report was released.
