10 students at Danby Secondary School annexed to registered school, Ipota Secondary School in Erromango. Currently 4 schools which are not registered to any PEBs have set exams this year for students in Year 8 & Year 10. These schools will be closed in 2015.

Resolution 1b

PEOs will need to carefully check the newly established year levels, to verify their establishments. An investigative report will be produced.

Resolution 1c

Heads of Schools which have started the Year 7 & 8 schools will be disciplined, and will no longer be HOS. ZCAs in which current schools are located will be transferred.

Resolution 1d

Registration committee that will be established in 2015, will develop specific policies to cover this particular area. More awareness to all communities will need to be done on establishment and registration of schools.

Resolution 2

MoET will abolish Year 8 examinations in 2015. Automatic academic promotion to Year 9. Benchmarking assessments will be used to assess students' academic progress.
