Situation Overview

The Ministry of Education and Training (MoET) is currently coordinating the Education Cluster to respond to three (3) disaster events: Tropical Cyclone Harold, COVID-19 and Tanna Volcano Ash Fall. The responses are targeting schools (ECCE, Primary, Secondary and PSET).

TC Harold

The MoET is coordinating the impact (or detail) technical assessments in the provinces of SANMA, PENAMA, and MALAMPA. The impact assessments seek to have clear information on the extent of damage caused on schools (ECCE, Primary, Secondary and PSET) and provide a baseline for responses to the schools badly affected.

COVID 19

The MoET is coordinating and facilitating COVID-19 preventive measures at all levels of schooling.

In light of TC Harold, the MoET is being flexible on implementing COVID-19 preventive measures in badly affected schools in the provinces/islands hit-hard by TC Harold.

Tanna (Yasur volcano) Ash fall

The Tanna Yasur Volcano Ash Fall has most impacts on schools (ECCE, Primary, Secondary and PSET) located on the eastern part of Tanna Island.

North West Tanna Drought

A localized drought is affecting the North-west part of Tanna Island. Schools in that area are also affected.

Highlights

TC Harold

- Detailed assessments of TC Harold's impact were conducted in TORBA, SANMA, PENAMA, MALAMPA and small portion of SHEFA (Epi Island) provinces.
 - The assessment teams are collaborating with the provincial education offices to finalize the detailed assessment reports for each province.

COVID-19

- All Government and Non-Government Assisted Schools (ECCE, Primary, and Secondary) are currently observing the Term One School Break (Holiday). The term one break starts on May 04th and ends on 15th May 2020.
- Private schools (ECCE, Primary & Secondary) in Port Vila have commenced their 2nd Term of Schooling. These schools are observing and practicing COVID-19 preventive measures.
- Continuation of Home School Package implementation & monitoring by many schools in TAFEA, SHEFA, and schools that are not affected by TC Harold.

Tanna Yasur Volcano Ash Fall

Detailed assessment of schools (ECCE, Primary, Secondary and PSET) affected by Yasur Volcano
 Ash fall completed/produced on the 04th of May 2020 by the TAFEA Provincial Education Office.

North West Tanna Drought

Tanna Yasur Volcano Ash Fall

- Nine (9) primary schools and 10 ECCE centres were mostly affected by the volcano ash fall
- A total of 1,001 students affected by this Yasur Volcano ash fall

North West Tanna Drought

- 6 schools (5 ECCE; 5 PS & 1 SS) are affected by this drought
- A total of 501 students affected by this drought

Needs

TC Harold

The *immediate needs* for schools in the most affected provinces (Sanma, Penama & Malampa) affected by TC Harold are categorised as follows:

1. Temporary Shelter

- Tents are needed to be set up as temporary learning spaces and temporary shelters for teachers houses and dormitories
- Tarpaulins are needed for classrooms, teachers' houses, dormitories and other school buildings that have minor damages.

2. WASH

- Clean water for drinking and cooking
- Restoration of sanitation and hygiene facilities

3. Food

• Supply of dry food ration for teachers and boarding schools as a whole when schools reopen.

Supply of dry food ration for teachers and students in the affected areas.

North West Tanna Drought

Supply of dry food ration for teachers and students in the affected areas.

Response

TC Harold

- Supply and provision of tents, school in a box and ECD kits for schools in Santo, Pentecost and Malekula
 - o 2 x 72 m² tent, 20 School in a box & 20 ECD kits supplied to Santo
 - \circ 2 x 72 m² tent, 1 x 42 m² tent & 20 School in a box supplied to Pentecost
 - o 1 x 72 m² tent supplied to Malekula
- Impact assessment of schools (ECCE, Primary, Secondary and PSET) completed for all three (3) affected provinces SANMA, PENAMA and MALAMPA
 - o Compilations of impact assessment reports for the three (3) provinces are underway.

- A meeting between SANMA Provincial Education Office and School Principals (Primary & Secondary) agreed that examination classes (Yrs.10, 12 & 13/14) will resume classes on the 18th May 2020 while other classes will resume later or be relocated to other schools in provinces not affected
 - All schools in SANMA, PENAMA & MALAMPA whose classrooms were not totally damaged will also resume classes on Monday 18th May 2020.
- Deployment of MoET central staff to SANMA province to assist in relocation & repatriation of students and teachers from schools that are badly damaged to schools in other provinces not affected by TC Harold

COVID 19

- All schools are preparing for normal resumption (18th May 2020) with strict observation and practice of handwashing plus social/physical distancing as preventive measures of Covid-19.
- Radio program called "home-school givhan" aired through radio Vanuatu on Mondays, Wednesday AND Fridays on a weekly basis. This is to provide support and guidance to parents to help their children with the home school package.
- Awareness on home school package and TC Harold response activities conducted through Short Message Services (SMS) with Digicel and Vodafone

Tanna Yasur Volcano Ash Fall

North West Tanna Drought

 preventive measures
- Need to inform Provincial Education Offices, School Principals and Teachers about curriculum materials/resources that are in Open VEMIS; need to assist teachers to access these resources in Open VEMIS.

Impacts

Many of the schools (ECCE, primary, secondary and PSET) in the badly affected provinces/islands may not resume as expected by the MoET. This is because the schools are used as evacuation centres, while many have been destroyed by TC Harold. In addition, some schools have not yet established the temporary learning centres so will not be able to carry out teaching and learning.

The curriculum content for all levels of education may not be fully implemented by the schools. MoET is yet to confirm the curriculum materials to be reprinted. Therefore it is likely that students may not receive the full teaching and learning required during the 2020 school calendar.

Donor activities

- DFAT continuously supporting MoET's communications through radio and television broadcasts, and short message services through Digicel and Vodafone.
- DFAT through Vanuatu Education Support Program (VESP) provide funding support (Accountable Imprest) for Psycho Social Support for Mental Health program in Santo, Pentecost, Malekula & Ambrym
- MFAT provide funding support (Airfare, charter flights, printing of materials) for Psycho Social Support for Mental Health program in Santo, Pentecost, Malekula & Ambrym
- UNICEF is currently distributing tents, school in a box and ECD kits for badly affected schools in Pentecost, Santo and Malekula.

UNICEF is also collaborating with the MoET to sort out the number of tents and tarpaulins needed by schools badly affected by TC Harold. The updated data will be used by UNICEF to place orders for tents/tarpaulins from their regional warehouse.
