Secondary education promotion rates from 2018 to 2020 increased for all the type of education authorities and genders and the overall trend country wide is increasing (see chart - 1.3.20 a).

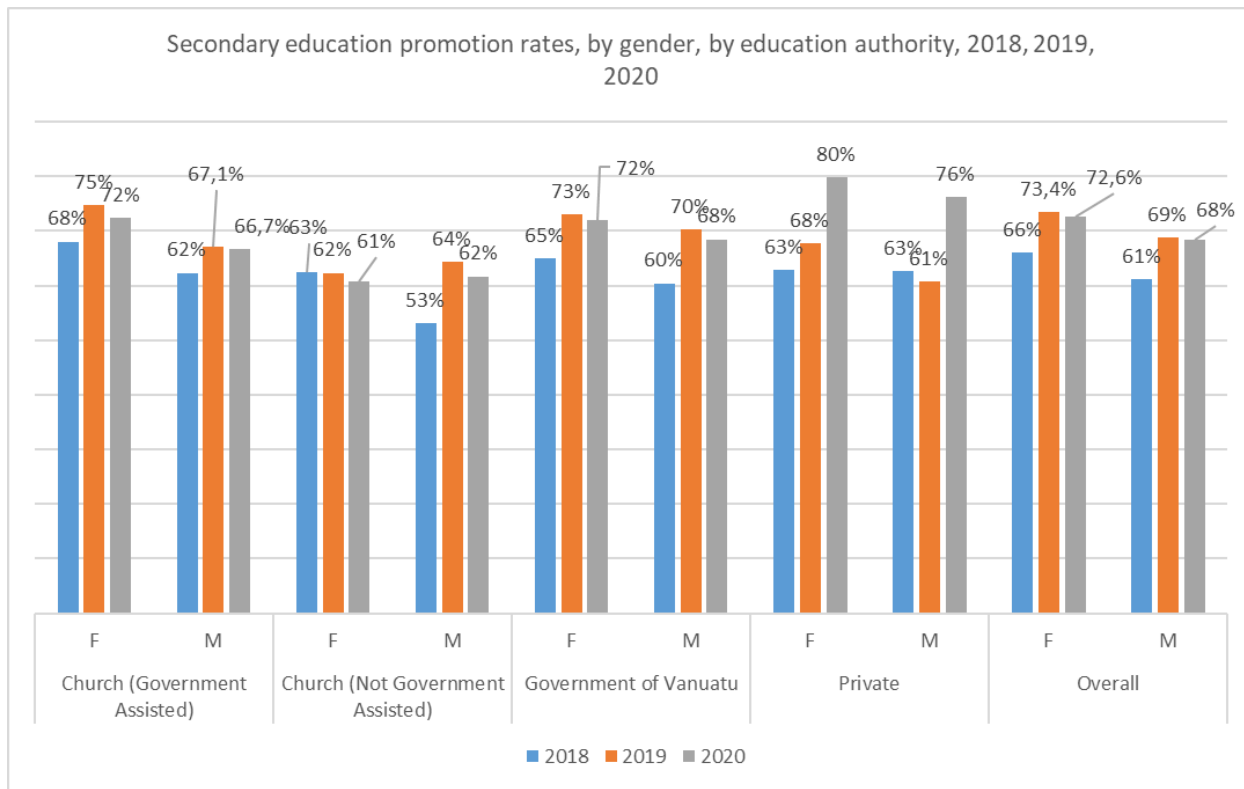

Secondary education promotion rates per year level and gender has a decreasing trend from 2018 to 2020 across the year levels and genders (see chart - 1.3.20 b)

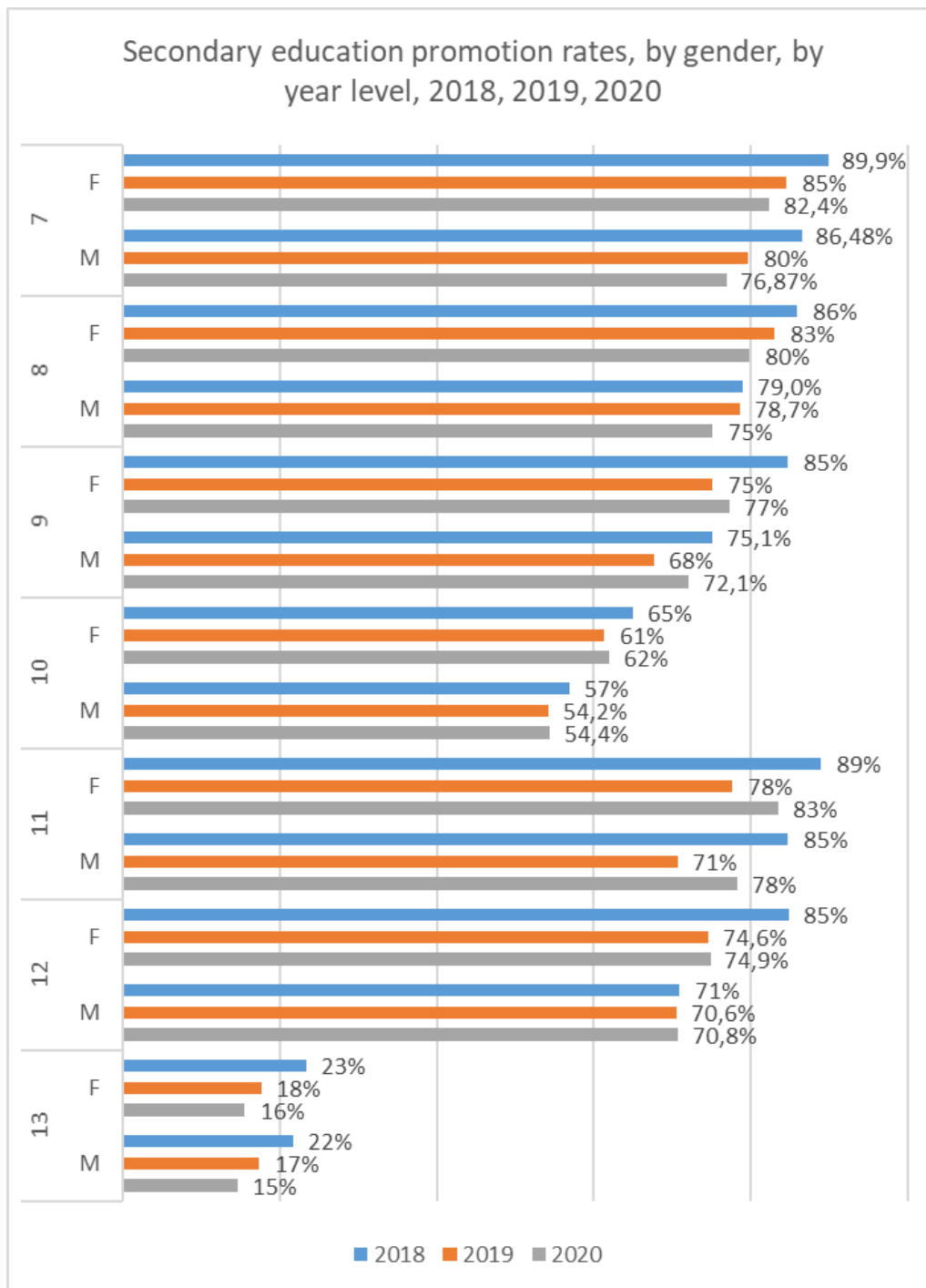

Secondary education promotion rates, by gender, by year level between 7 to 10, by education authority, 2018, 2019, 2020

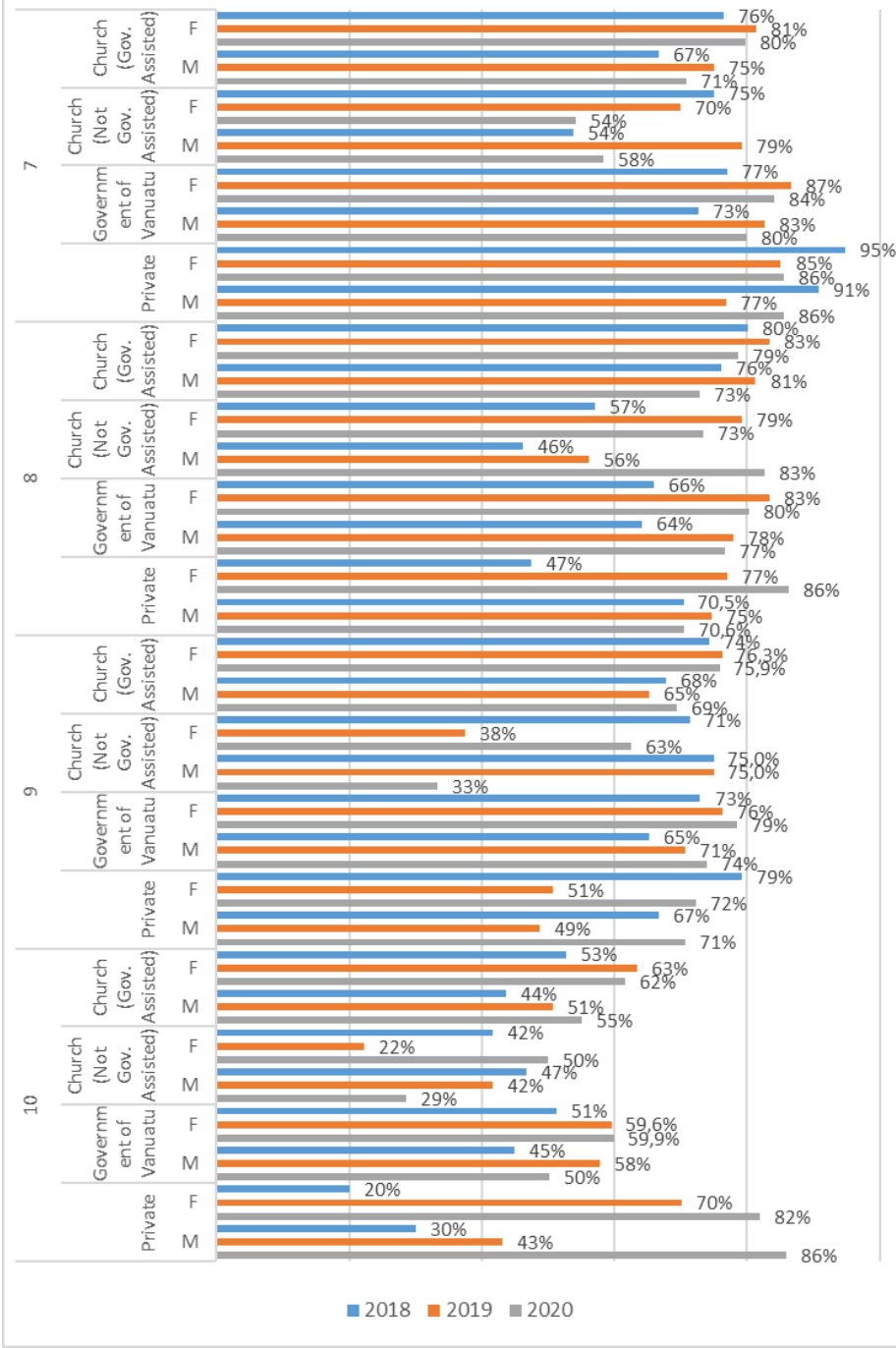

Secondary education promotion rates, by gender, by year level between 11 to 13, by education authority, 2018, 2019, 2020

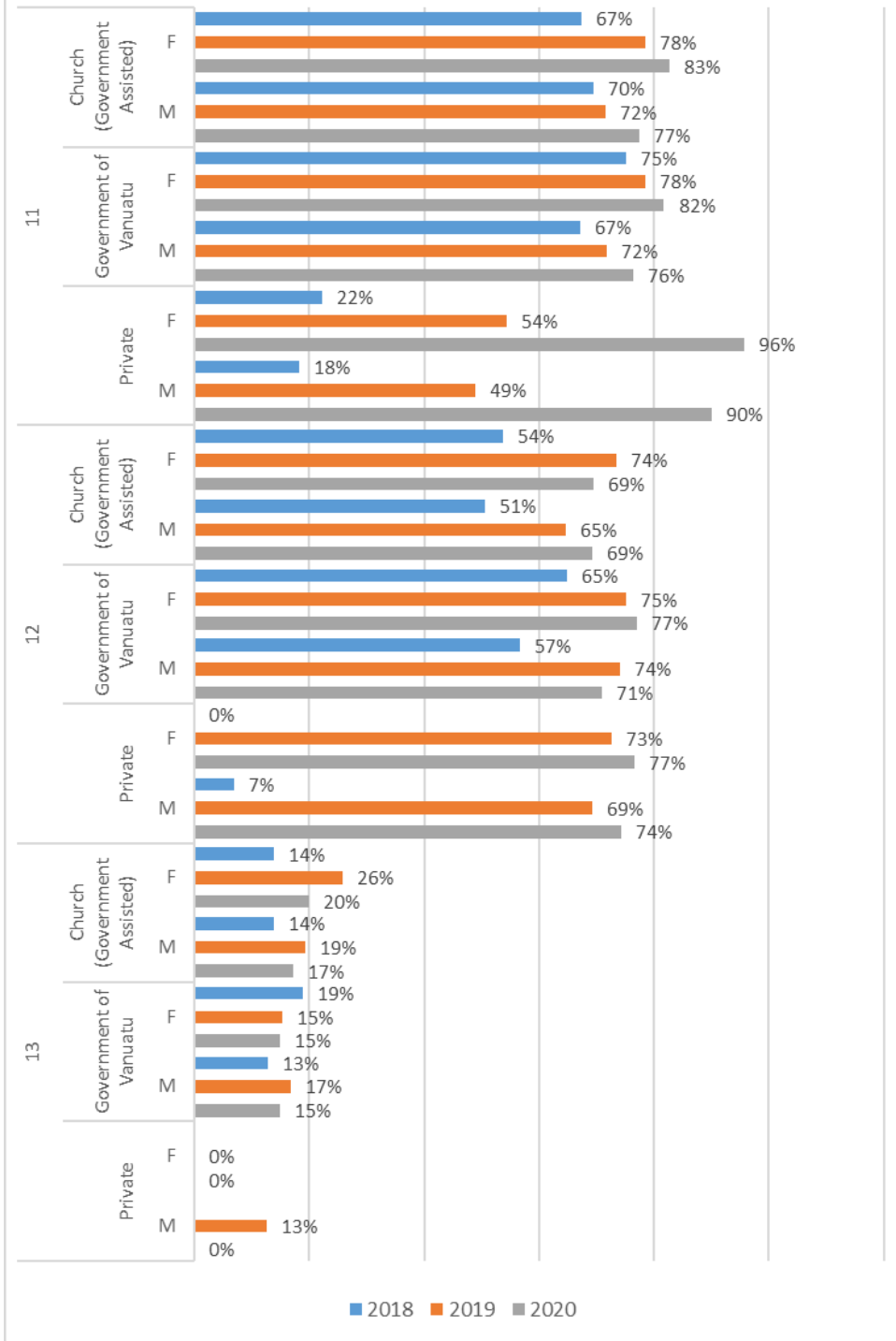

Secondary education promotion rates, by gender, by year level between 7 to 9, by province, 2018, 2019, 2020

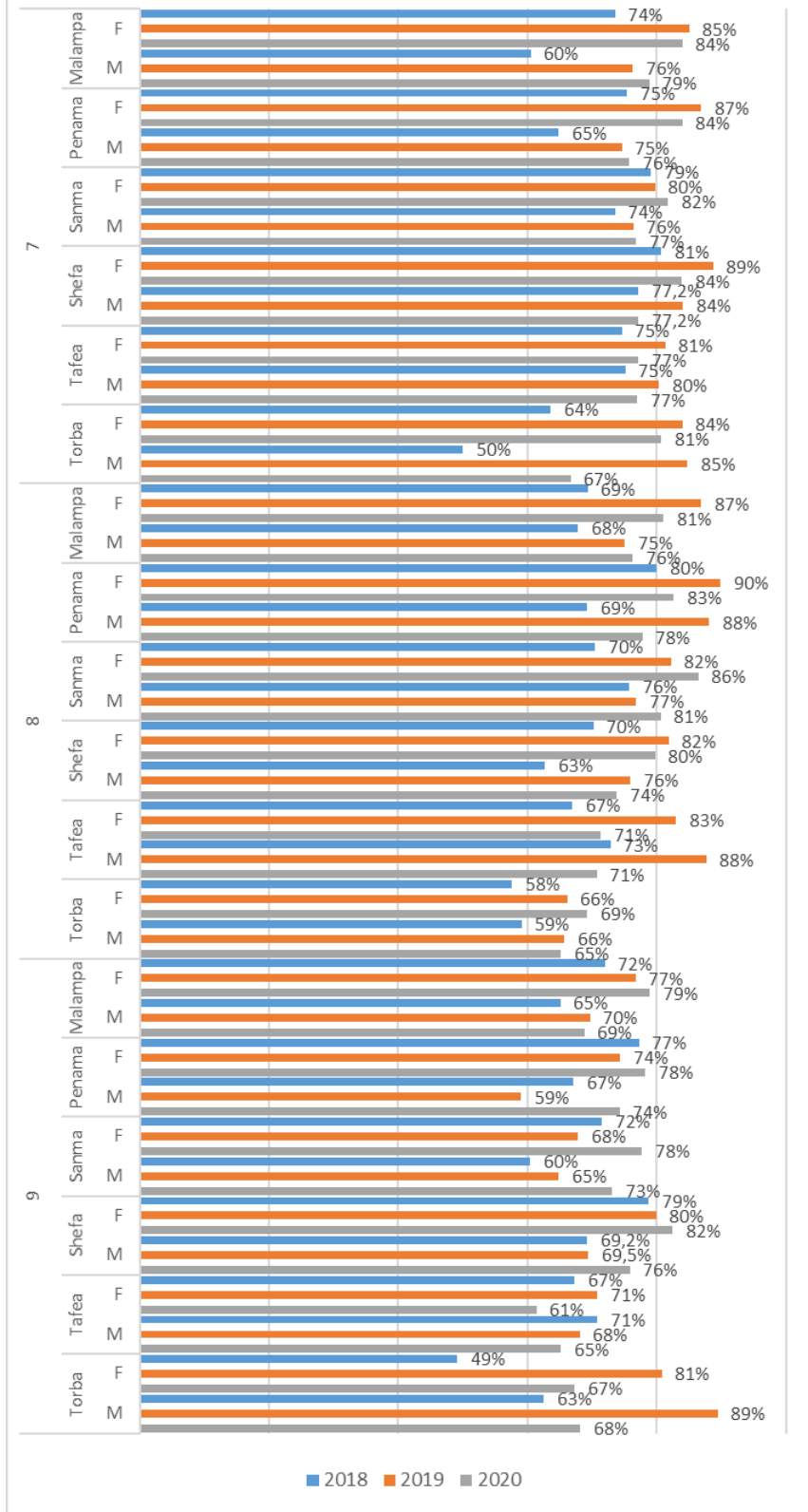

Secondary education promotion rates, by gender, by year level between 10 to 13, by province, 2018, 2019, 2020

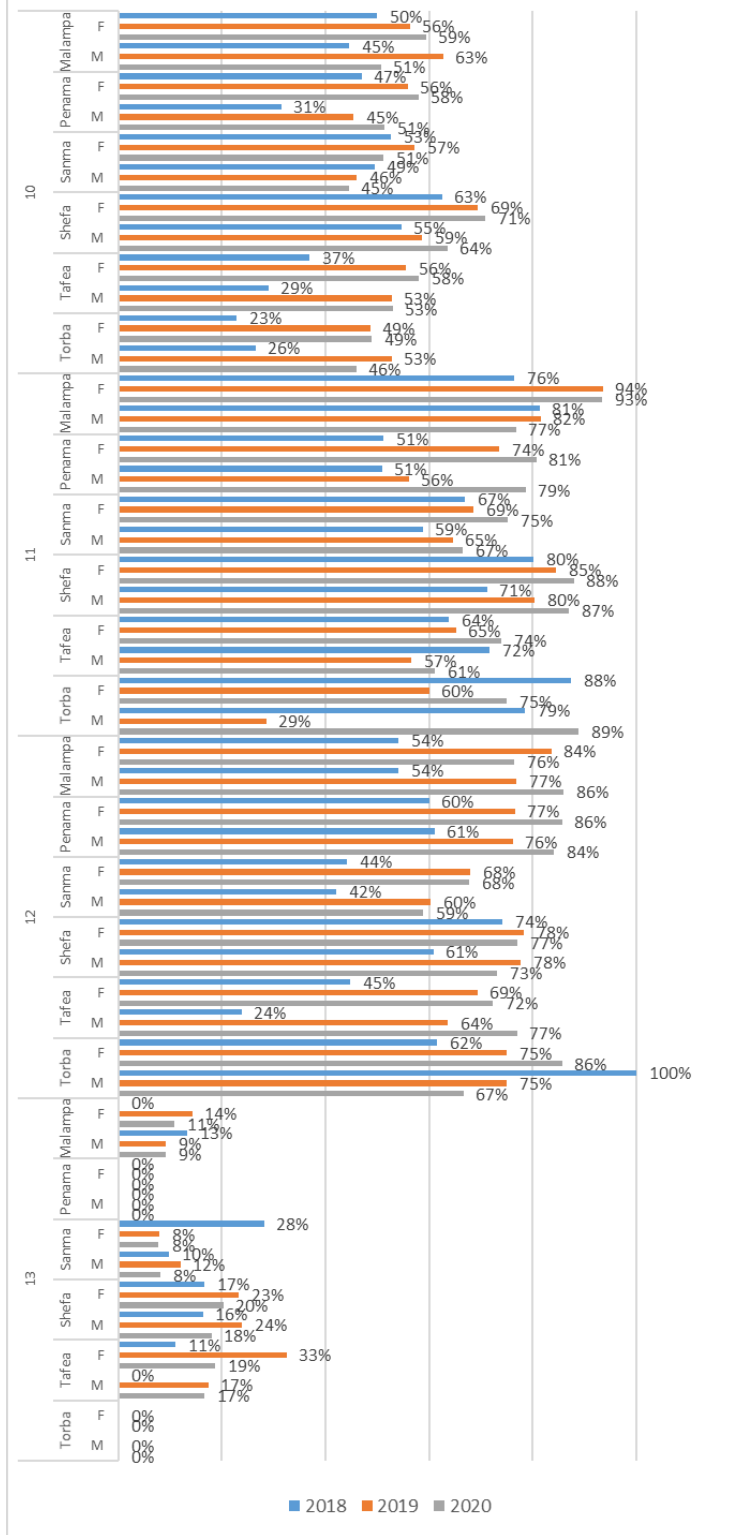

6 charts below illustrate the province level trends of promotion rates across the two main education authorities and both genders.

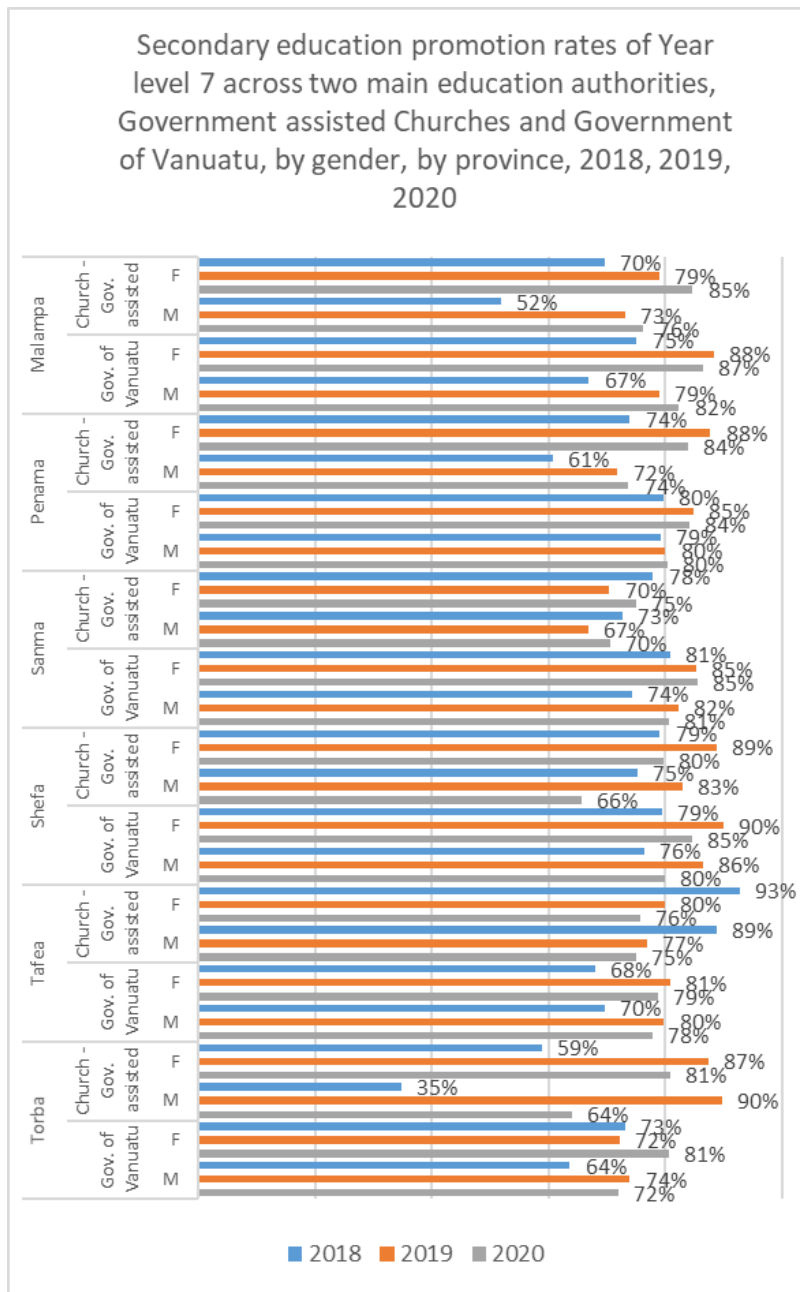

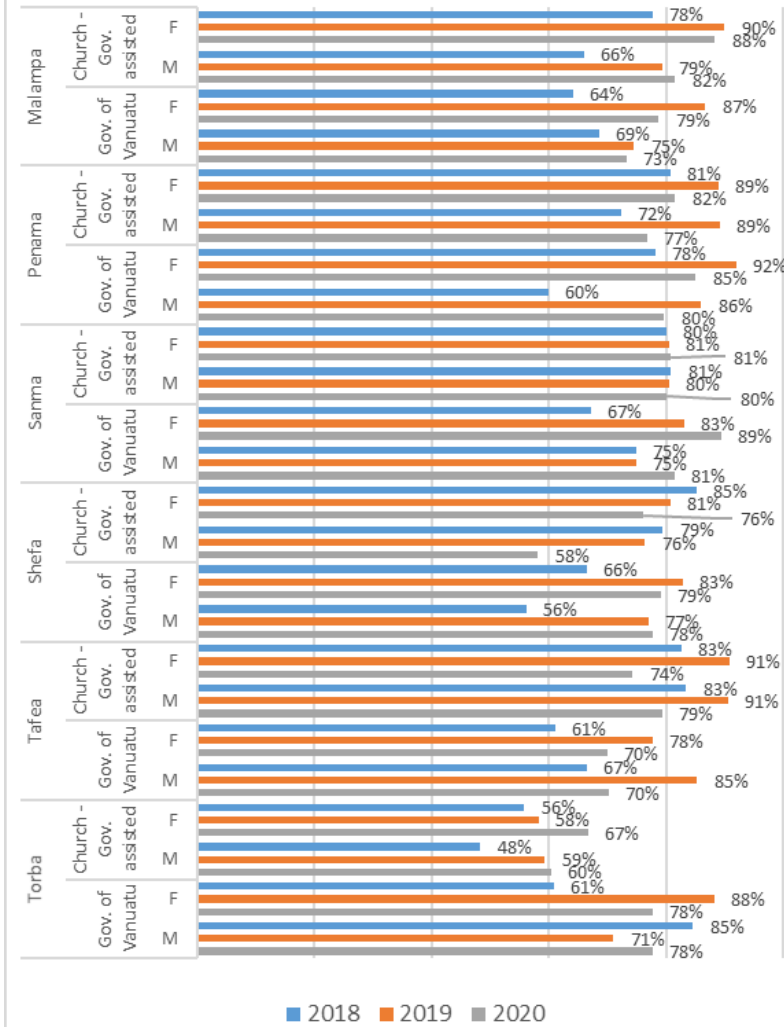

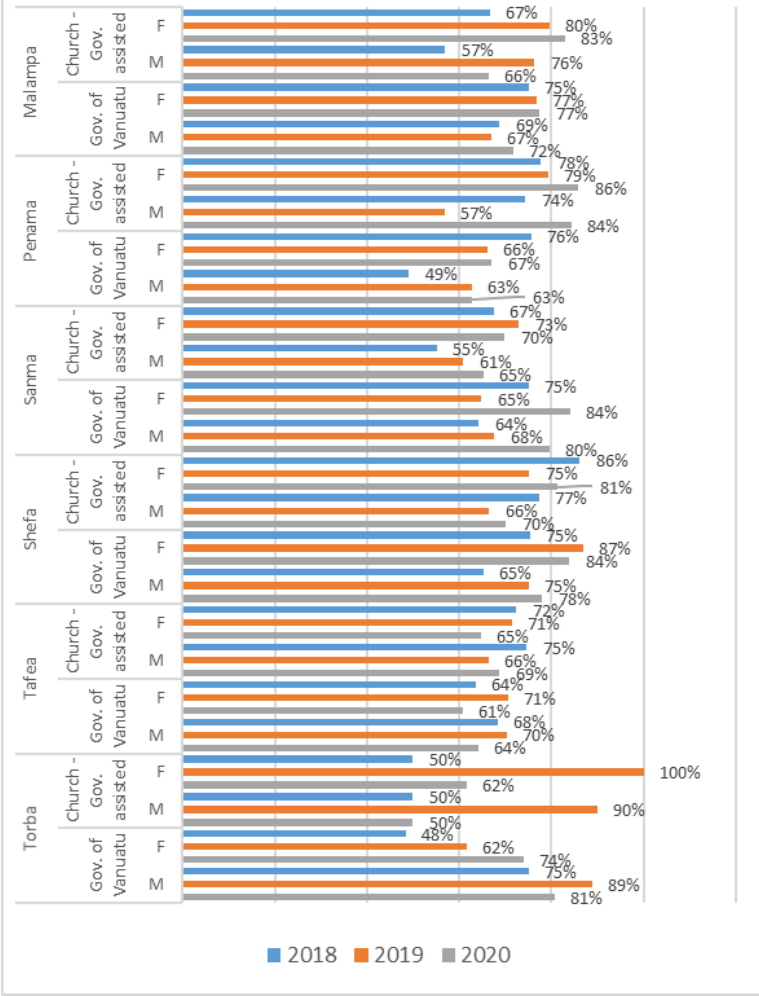

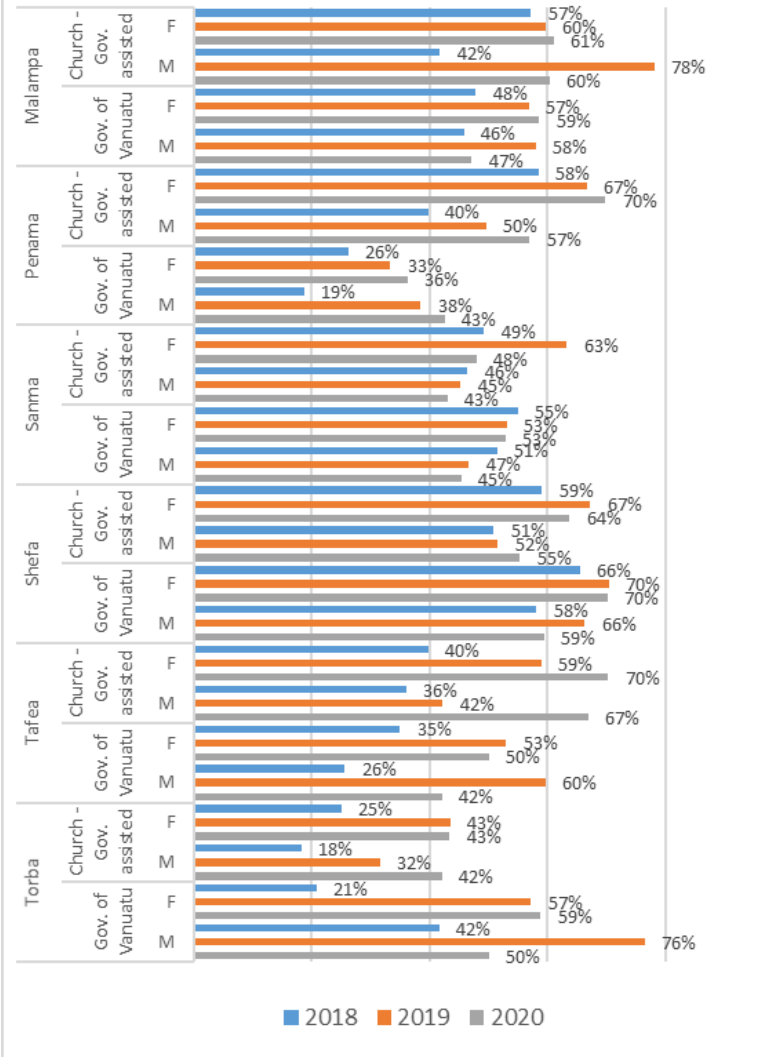

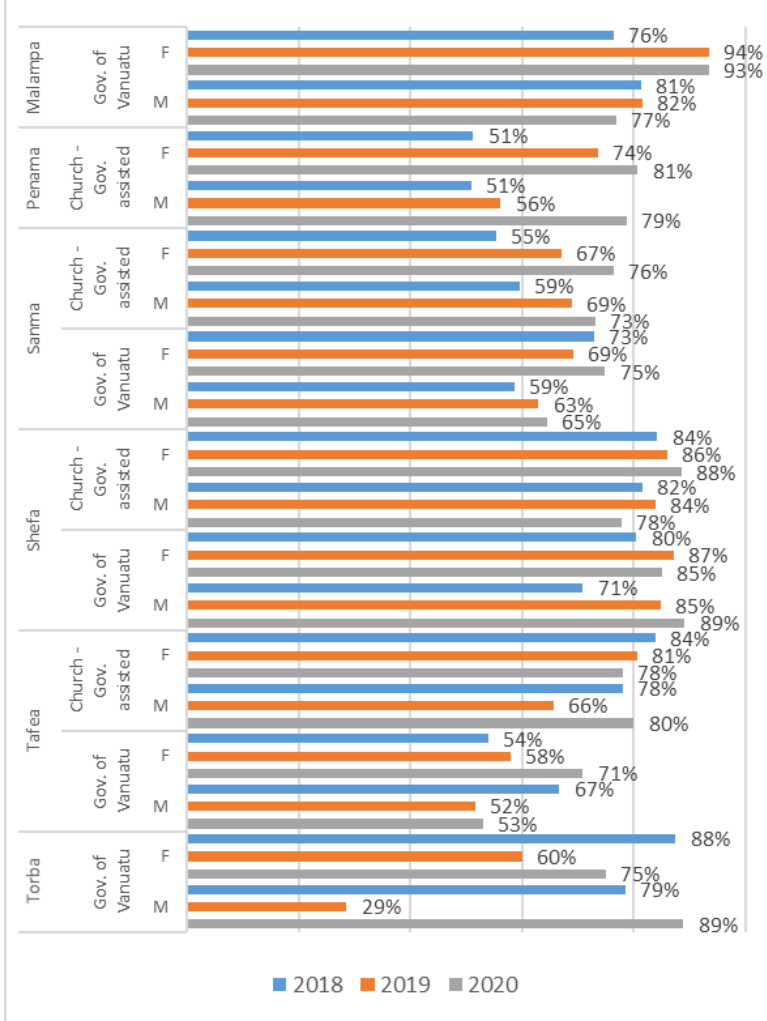

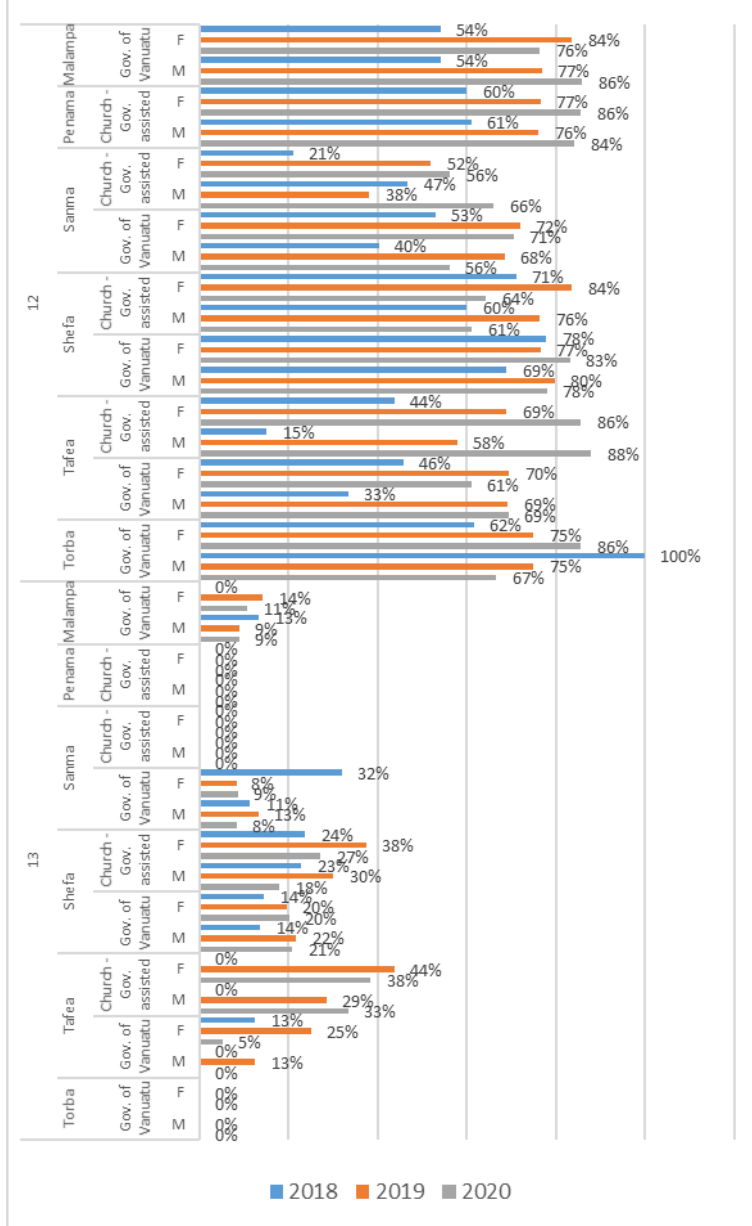

Secondary education promotion rates across the education authorities, not Government assisted Churches and Private, by gender, by year level, by province, 2018, 2019, 2020

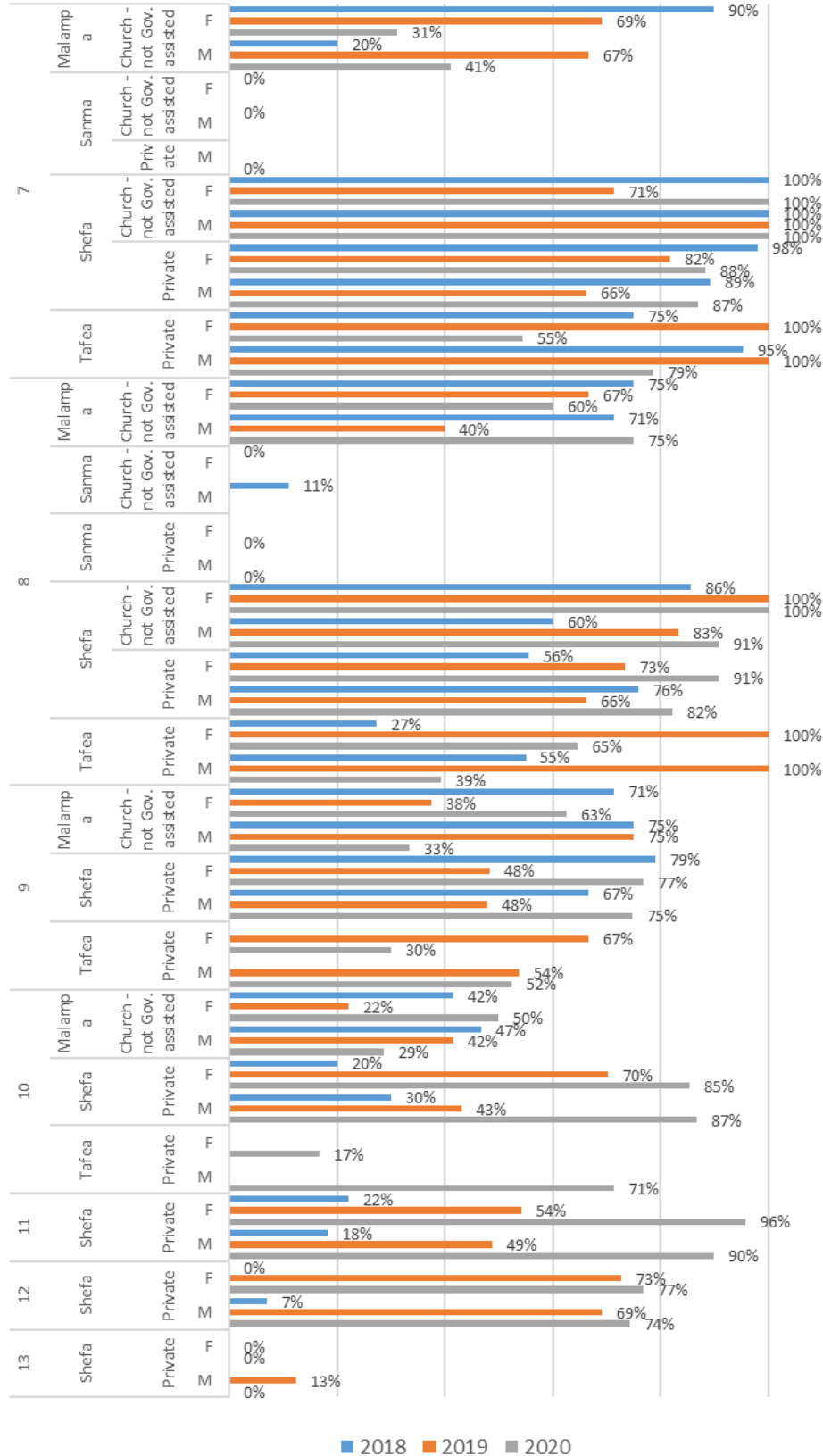
